- CMAP was created by the Illinois Legislature in 2005 in order to better coordinate transportation and land use planning.
- CMAP's governing structure has two distinct layers: the CMAP Board, created as a political subdivision and body politic under state law, and the Metropolitan Policy Organization (MPO), which is designated under federal law.
- Pursuant to Public Act 95-0677, the CMAP Board consists of 15 voting members responsible for: hiring the CMAP Executive Director, approving a policy framework

under which all regional plans are developed, coordinating regional transportation and land use planning, and identifying, promoting regional priorities and other duties as provided by state statute.

- Public Act 95-0677 dictates that Lake County shall appoint one member of the CMAP Board and that the appointment shall be made “cooperatively by the mayors of Lake County and the chief elected county official of Lake County.”
- This appointment is for a term beginning on July 1, 2025, and ending on June 30, 2029.

Joint resolution authorizing a supplemental appropriation of \$172,511 of ¼% Sales Tax for Transportation funds for improvements to the intersection of Illinois Route 131 and Kenosha Road.

- The Illinois Department of Transportation (IDOT) realigned the intersection of Illinois Route 131 at Kenosha Road with turn lanes and a new traffic signal.

- The County Board, at its meeting on February 14, 2017, approved an agreement with IDOT and appropriated \$1,295,000 of ¼% Sales Tax for Transportation funds for the County's share of this improvement.
- The total project cost is \$3,787,098 and the County's share is \$1,467,511.
- The increase in the County's share is due to the initial bid prices being higher than estimated and additional removal of unsuitable soils along Kenosha Road.
- This improvement is included in the Transportation Improvement Program and is designated as Section 17-00125-06-CH.

Joint resolution authorizing a three-year maintenance agreement with Midwestern Software Solutions, LLC (MS2), of Ann Arbor, Michigan, for the Traffic Crash Location System (TCLS) used by the Lake County Division of Transportation (LCDOT) at a cost of \$41,427 and appropriating \$50,000 of ¼% Sales Tax for Transportation funds.

- LCDOT is a licensed user of the TCLS software for its traffic crash analysis.
- The TCLS software is utilized by LCDOT, design consultants, and Lake County municipalities for traffic crash analysis.

- This resolution authorizes a three-year maintenance agreement with MS2 of Ann Arbor, Michigan, beginning September 1, 2025, and ending August 31, 2028.

Joint resolution authorizing execution of a contract with D'Land Construction LLC of Algonquin, Illinois, in the amount of \$2,744,239.30 for the Gages Lake Road Water Main Replacement Project.

- The Lake County Department of Public Works operates the Wildwood water system, which serves a population of 14,000, as well as several learning institutions.
- The water main pipes are approximately 50 years old within the project area, are reaching the end of their service life, and need to be replaced. Certain segments of the water main need to be upsized to increase the capacity of the distribution system.
- The County received bids from five contractors for this water main work, ranging from \$2,744,239.30 to \$4,082,960.
- This project is in the Department's Fiscal Year 2025 capital budget with \$2,900,000 allocated for construction.

- The award of this contract is recommended to the lowest responsive and responsible bidder, D'Land Construction LLC of Algonquin, Illinois, in the amount of \$2,744,239.30.

Joint resolution authorizing execution of a contract with Archon Construction Company, Inc., of Addison, Illinois, in the amount of \$269,493 for the North Chicago Water Interconnect Meter Vault Rehabilitation Project.

- Lake County Department of Public Works (LCPW) owns and operates the Vernon Hills Water System that serves approximately 30,000 residents in the Village of Vernon Hills and surrounding areas, including unincorporated Knollwood and Rondout, as well as parts of Mettawa.
- This water system has an interconnect vault located in the Knollwood area that connects LCPW's system with the City of North Chicago's water system. The interconnect vault is approximately 40 years old and requires rehabilitation.
- The County received bids from one contractor for the work to rehabilitate the meter vault in the amount of \$269,493.
- \$550,000 was budgeted for this project in the Department's Fiscal Year 2024 capital budget for construction.
- The award of this contract is recommended to the lowest responsive and responsible bidder, Archon Construction Company, Inc., of Addison, Illinois, in the amount of \$269,493.

Joint resolution authorizing a contract with M.E. Simpson Co. Inc. of Valparaiso, Indiana, for the Lake County Department of Public Works (LCPW) water main leak detection and locating services.

- A Request for Proposals (RFP) was issued for the purpose of selecting a short list of qualified firms to provide a presentation on their ability to perform water main leak detection and locating services for LCPW. The County received proposals for this work from three vendors.
- Based on the RFP review and interview presentations, LCPW selected M.E. Simpson Co. Inc. of Valparaiso, Indiana, as the most qualified vendor for Lake County.

- The award of this contract is recommended to M.E. Simpson Co. Inc. of Valparaiso, Indiana, to provide water main leak detection and locating services, renewable annually for up to four years. Pricing is pursuant to Exhibit A of the agreement.
- \$120,000 was budgeted in Fiscal Year 2025 for these services.

Ordinance adopting the ICC International Building Code 2024 (as amended), the ICC International Residential Code 2024 (as amended), the ICC International Mechanical Code 2024 (as amended), the ICC International Fuel Gas Code 2024 (as amended), the ICC International Swimming Pool and Spa Code 2024 (as amended), the ICC International Fire Code 2024 (as amended) and the NFPA 70 National Electrical Code 2023 (as amended).

- The Planning, Building and Development Department periodically updates its building codes and the last update occurred in 2023 with adoption of the 2018 ICC Building Codes and the 2017 National Electrical Code with amendments.
- To ensure the County's continued eligibility for its current Community Rating System (CRS) rating of "Class 6" to retain comparable flood insurance discount rates for Lake County residents, the County is now required to update its codes to the most recent ICC publications.
- The adoption of the 2024 Building Code series is proposed with minor non-substantive amendments that reflect pagination edits, section changes, removal of previously adopted amendments, and language changes for clarification purposes.
- If adopted, the new codes and amendments will become effective July 12, 2025.
- Projects in process prior to the effective date will be reviewed under the codes in effect at the time of application submittal.

Resolution authorizing the emergency appropriation of Medicaid Match dollars for Fiscal Year (FY) 2025 for the Lake County Health Department & Community Health Center.

- The Lake County Health Department and Community Health Center receives Medicaid Match Managed Care Organization (MCO) funding annually from the Illinois Department of Healthcare and Family Services for Federally Qualified Health Centers (FQHC).
- The approved Budget Policies allow for these funds to be used as the primary source of funding for Health Department capital and facility projects, in accordance with the Health Department's approved capital improvement program.
- The Medicaid Match revenue and expenses will be recorded in a sub-fund of the Health Department, to ease accounting and fiscal management, given the multi-year nature of the projects.
- This action will emergency appropriate dollars for projects that were previously approved but not completed within FY 2024 as well as unallocated dollars for projects to be determined in FY 2025.

Joint resolution authorizing an emergency appropriation and approving a Title IV-D Intergovernmental Agreement (IGA) between the Illinois Department of Healthcare and Family Services (IDHFS) and the Lake County State's Attorney for the continuation of the State's Attorney's Child Support Enforcement Program for the period of July 1, 2025, through June 30, 2027, for a maximum reimbursement amount of \$1,629,842 for staff wages and benefits.

- Since 1985, the State's Attorney's Office has entered into an annual Intergovernmental Agreement with the Illinois Department of Healthcare and Family Services to provide child support enforcement services.
- Pursuant to these annual agreements, the State's Attorney's Office is to be reimbursed for reasonable costs for providing these services, as determined by IDHFS.
- Currently, the CSE staff includes two full-time assistant state's attorneys, a .15 full-time equivalent (FTE) assistant state's attorney/supervisor, three full-time legal assistants and 2.60 FTE paralegals.
- The Child Support Enforcement division handles approximately 12,000 active

cases, including those to establish paternity, to set support upon voluntary acknowledgment, to establish medical support orders and to enforce orders for payment of support.

- IDHFS has tendered a proposed two-year Contract for 2026-2027 to reimburse personnel costs not to exceed \$1,629,842 - 66 percent of which is federal funds. Funding for 2026 will be \$798,942 and 2027 will be \$830,900. Approximately 80 percent of staff salary and fringe will be covered by IDHFS and the remainder will be covered by the State's Attorney's operating budget.

Joint resolution accepting a grant from Congressionally Directed Spending through the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency (US EPA) Community Grants Projects to support the Lake County New Century Town Water Reclamation Facility (NCT WRF) Centrifuge Project, including an emergency appropriation of \$959,752 in grant funds and an emergency appropriation from Fund 610 Public Works Fund reserves.

- Lake County Department of Public Works (LCPW) owns and operates the NCT WRF in Vernon Hills. The NCT WRF is the second largest of the three LCPW treatment plants.
- All WRFs require a dewatering process to separate the solid waste from clear effluent. The current dewatering equipment at NCT WRF is in need of replacement.
- The NCT WRF Project will replace the existing belt filter presses and associated equipment in the sludge dewatering building with new centrifuge technology.
- The grant amount totaling \$959,752 will be provided to the LCPW through the US EPA and only 80 percent of the requested cost (\$1,199,752) will be funded. LCPW is also seeking an emergency appropriation for the remaining 20 percent (\$240,000) from fund reserves. There is sufficient fund balance to handle this project that was on the Public Works capital plan.
- The grant term is from September 2, 2024, to October 30, 2027, and was secured through the office of Congressman Brad Schneider.

Ordinance amending Section 150.17 (2018 ICC International Residential Code Amendments) of the Lake County, Illinois Code of Ordinances to require provisions for bird-friendly building design in unincorporated Lake County.

- In June 2024, the Lake County Board adopted a Non-Residential Bird-Friendly Building Design (BFBD) Ordinance as a local amendment to Lake County's adopted 2018 International Building Code, Chapter 24, Section 2410.

- Prior to the Board's passage of the Ordinance, the Planning, Building, Zoning and Environment (PBZ&E) Committee directed staff to develop comparable residential regulations for the Committee's consideration and action in 2025.
- The recommended amendments have been formatted into a document ready for codification as reflected in "Exhibit A". If adopted, the Ordinance will become effective sixty days following County Board approval.

- On November 11, 2014, the Lake County Board adopted the Lake County Standards of Conduct, with subsequent amendments on July 9, 2019 and July 13, 2021.
