Joint resolution authorizing approval of Amendment #1 to an Inter-Governmental Agreement (IGA) between the County of Lake and the Lake County Stormwater Management Commission (SMC) for the construction of a partial green roof at the Lake County Central Permit Facility in Libertyville, Illinois. The County will be

reimbursed up to \$183,721 by SMC utilizing a State and Tribal Assistance Grant.

- Lake County entered into an IGA with SMC in June of 2008 to receive up to \$150,100 in grant funding for reimbursement concerning the construction of a green roof at the Central Permit Facility.
- Additional funding has become available through the existing grant and SMC has recommended re-allocation of these funds to the green roof project.
- Amendment #1 will increase the grant amount by \$33,621 for a total funding of \$183,721, which reduces the County's cost-share for this project.

Tax Abatement Ordinance for Special Service Area #10 tax levy.

- Special service areas are created to allow improvements to be made and debt to be issued to pay for these improvements. The debt service is then paid for by a special tax levy.
- Each year a separate tax is levied on the properties within the designated area to pay the debt service issued to pay for the improvements.
- In the case of the SSA #10 there were monies received from the sale of the bonds that were not used. These funds then can be used to help pay for that debt. Each year part of those funds is used to lower the tax levy.
- This resolution authorizes the taxes to be abated.

- Any additional costs incurred by the Villages for CAD related services, interfaces, licensing, mapping, geocoding, cabling, maintenance etc. will be paid by the Villages.

- 2011 Crack Sealing: Appropriation
- Each year crack sealing is done to county highways that have recently been resurfaced.
- Before a project letting can be held, an appropriation of \$160,000 of Matching Tax Funds is necessary.

Joint resolution appropriating \$110,000 of Motor Fuel Tax funds for the 2011 traffic signal equipment project to install Uninterrupted Power Supply *(UPS)* at 11 intersections and designated as Section 11-00000-10-GM.

- Traffic Signal Equipment Upgrade 2011: Appropriation
- The county maintains 157 traffic signals and various pieces of equipment which annually need to be replaced and upgraded.
- The 2011 work concentrates on installing Uninterrupted Power Supply (UPS) at 11 intersections that have LED signal indications installed, but no UPS's.
- UPS units only work at signals with low energy using LED signal indications.
- Before a project letting can be held, an appropriation of \$110,000 of Motor Fuel Tax funds is necessary.

Joint resolution appropriating \$70,000 of Matching Tax funds for the 2011 resurfacing of various segments of the county bike path system and designated as Section 11-0000-11-RS.

- 2011 Bike Path Repaving: Appropriation
- Each year surface maintenance work is done on segments of the county bike path system.
- The work to be done is asphalt patching and seal coat.
- Before a project letting can be held, an appropriation of \$70,000 of Matching Tax funds is necessary.

23 11-0080

Joint resolution appropriating \$200,000 of Motor Fuel Tax funds for concrete pavement patching, where necessary, on various county highways and designated as Section 11-00000-09-GM.

- 2011 Concrete Pavement Patching: Appropriation
- Each year the county undertakes patching of its concrete pavements to preserve surface quality including repairing damaged manholes, catch basins, curb and gutters.
- This patching and repair is done on isolated sections of pavements that are not on the list of resurfacings/rehabilitation/reconstruction projects as programmed in the 5-Yr Program from the results of the Pavement Management System.
- Before a letting can be held, an appropriation of \$200,000 of Motor Fuel Tax funds is necessary.

- Wadsworth Road Improvements, Right-of-way Acquisition: Appropriation with Condemnation Authority
- Wadsworth Road, in the downtown area, will be reconstructed to a 3-lane cross section, with the other portions of the road being resurfaced.
- Preliminary plans and specifications for this improvement have been prepared.
- Before right-of-way acquisitions can proceed, an appropriation and condemnation authority is necessary.
- The appropriation is \$50,000 of Matching Tax funds.

25 11-0077

Joint resolution authorizing the execution of Amendment 2 to the agreement for the use of Federal Highway Funds between the State of Illinois and Lake County for Phase II design engineering services for the proposed roundabout improvements to Hunt Club Road at Millburn Road and at Wadsworth Road and designated as Section 02-00076-13-CH.

- Hunt Club Road @ Millburn Road & @ Wadsworth Road, Roundabout Improvements,
 Amendment 2 to Phase II Engineering Services: IDOT Agreement
- The County has been allocated CMAQ funds to improve these intersections as roundabouts and IDOT administers all federal funds.
- Phase II design engineering is underway, and there needs for a second Amendment to the IDOT Phase II design engineering services agreement to provide for revisions to plan sheets and conveyance documents.
- This Amendment 2 provides for the county to receive 80% reimbursement for these supplemental costs of Phase II design engineering.
