Re: City of North Chicago Brownfield Funding Request for 1 year Funding Extension Vacant Lot/Pettibone Creek Area (\$100,000 Brownfield Grant)

Dear Mr. Hunt:

The City of North Chicago has continued progress on the tasks related to cleanup of the Vacant Lot/Pettibone Creek site near Commonwealth Ave. and MLK Dr. This site is designated for new storm water detention and bicycle path development as part of the larger, adjoining Sheridan Crossing Town Center Development.

#### Completed Work

Attachment A presents a chronological summary of the work completed through the date of this letter. Field investigative testing work and remediation work have been steadily completed. We have experienced some delay in the continued cleanup due to the unanticipated need to have a wetland jurisdictional determination and Base Flood Elevation (BFE) of Pettibone Creek made with input from the US Army Corps of Engineers.

### Next Steps

The City requests a one-year extension of the Intergovernmental Agreement to continue our progress toward cleanup and redevelopment of the site. We have the following anticipated tasks to complete following approval of the BFE and wetland delineation:

- 1. Excavation and disposal of contaminated soil, concurrently with the storm water detention pond excavation.
- 2. Excavation of contaminated soil in the vicinity of the proposed bike path relocation.

We anticipate this work to continue in Fall 2010 and/or Spring 2011, thus substantiating the one-year request for extending the IGA with Lake County.
