Conflict of Interest Policy For SMC Staff Regulatory and Professional Services

May 21, 2009

Policy Purpose - This document establishes the internal policy concerning potential conflicts of interest for regulatory and professional services at the Lake County Stormwater Management Commission (SMC). The purpose of the policy is to avoid any real or perceived conflict of interest by SMC employees while conducting SMC business, both internally and with external entities. This policy is intended to be in addition to the conflict of interest provisions and code of ethics requirements SMC professionals are required to follow either by rules related to their professional organization, or by statute¹. If there is determined to be a conflict then the statutory requirements shall govern.

Policy Statement - To avoid a conflict of interest, a SMC staff member, in their capacity as providing professional services to other agencies and entities, or on a SMC-sponsored project, is prohibited from acting in the role of regulatory administration for the specific development in which they provided professional services.

Methods to avoid conflicts of interest

1. Disclosure - SMC staff members providing professional services shall forthrightly disclose their role to SMC regulatory staff in all communication regarding that specific development. Disclosure communications shall, at a minimum, contain the description of the specific development, dates of service and the scope and extent of professional service(s) rendered.
2. Recusal – For a specific development, in the event that a SMC staff member that provided professional services is also requested to provide regulatory administrative services, the staff member shall recuse themselves (i.e., abstain) from that role.
3. Policy Enforcement – Administration and any interpretation necessary of this policy shall be under the authority of the SMC Chief Engineer and as needed, the Executive Director.
