
- Determination of Cause and Manner of Death
 - Covers entire county
 - Scene investigations, forensic examination and toxicology
 - Identify, communicate, and educate about preventable death trends
- Administrative Functions
 - Certification of death on Coroner Cases
 - Cremation permits for any death that occurs in Lake County
 - Case file management and record keeping
- Family Support
 - Assist family member throughout process



- Staffing

 - Coroner
 - Chief Deputy
 - 8 Deputy Coroners/Investigators
 - 2 Administrative Staff
- Examination
 - Forensic Pathologist, Forensic Technician
 - Toxicologist










- Departmental Statistics 2024
 - 5,634 Total Deaths Reported
 - 631 required further investigation
 - 556 required further examination
- Average Coroner Case 79/yr./Deputy
- Average Medical Case 704/yr./Deputy
- 2023 Comparison
 - 5735 Total Deaths Reported
 - 701 required further investigation
 - 629 required further examination

Previous 12 Months




- Continued collaboration with partner organizations

- Case Closure Rates
 - Continued procedures and effective supervision practices to reduce delay in closing of cases
 - Less delay for families
 - 2024 **–** 92.72%
 - 54.68% <30 days
 - 38.04% 30-60 days
 - Dashboards
 - Monthly reports



Next 12 Months



- Community Involvement
 - Identify and collaborate additional partner organizations to provide increased services and resources for grieving families
 - Provide additional timely data to drive resources where needed
- Evaluate expenditures/contracts
 - Continue to work with purchasing and finance to ensure Coroner contract services are fiscally responsible
 - Continue to explore potential revenue generating lab services

Next 12 Months



- Continue staff development and accountability
 - Maintain staff accreditation through American Board of Medicolegal Death Investigators
 - Review and Revise Office policies and procedures
- Maintain 60-day case closure rate to minimum 80%

Complete final phase of the IACME re-accreditation.
