

Opioid Curriculum Update

October 29, 2024





- Starting in the 2024-2025 school year, public and non-public schools in the state of Illinois are required to include comprehensive instruction on the dangers of opioids and fentanyl.
- For students in grades K-8, this includes education on drug avoidance and recognizing the risks of substance abuse.
- In grades 9-12, curricula must cover fentanyl specifically, detailing its types, effects, and methods to detect and prevent overdoses.
- Instruction on fentanyl will be informed by federal health agencies and must be ageappropriate. Schools must assess students' understanding of this content.



SB2223 Louie's Law

• Mandates updates to Illinois' drug education and youth overdose prevention efforts. By July 1, 2024, the State Board of Education and the Department of Human Services must develop and distribute a Substance Use Prevention and Recovery Instruction Resource Guide for public elementary and secondary schools. This guide will offer age-appropriate, evidence-based materials on substance use prevention, including heroin and opioid abuse. It will also include interactive teaching resources, information on involving various stakeholders, and strategies for addressing substance use in a culturally sensitive manner. Schools may voluntarily participate in this program, which aims to use effective, research-based methods to educate students, parents, and staff about drug risks and prevention. The Department of Human Services may reimburse schools for costs related to program participation.
