Coronavirus (COVID-19) Updates

May 11, 2023, marked the end of the federal COVID-19 Public Health Emergency (PHE) declaration.

The end of the PHE results in changes in the data that will be tracked and available at both the national and local level.

As of May 26, 2023, the Lake County Health Department has made the COVID-19 Data Hub webpage inactive and will no longer publish Lake County COVID-19 data. The Health Department is grateful to all the residents who used the Data Hub to make data informed decisions throughout the pandemic.

Certain COVID-19 data including COVID-19 hospital admissions, deaths, emergency visits, and more will continue to be available on the CDC's COVID Data Tracker page; however, in some instances the sources for the data may have changed. Preliminary national data at the end of May 2023, from the CDC, indicated that 8,256 COVID-19 hospitalizations occurred for the past week, marking a record low for this key remaining indicator to track the threat posed by the COVID-19 virus.

June is Pride Month

Lesbian, Gay, Bisexual, Transgender and Queer (LGBTQ) Pride Month is currently celebrated each year in June to honor the 1969 Stonewall Uprising in Manhatan. Today, Pride celebrtions include parades, picnics, parties, workshops, and more, and atract millions of participants around the world. Memorials are held during this month for those members of the community who have been lost to hate crimes or HIV/AIDS. The purpose of Pride Month is to recognize the impact that LGBTQ individuals have had on history.

The Health Department is one of many organizations participating in the Lake County PrideFest on June 10 and the Waukegan Pride Drive on June 17 to celebrate Pride month and promote health and wellness for the LGBTQ+ community.

The Health Department offers comprehensive HIV care and prevetion, including pre-exposure prophylaxis (PrEP), transgender health services, and affirming services for

Celebrate Summer Festivals Safely

Every summer, people gather at festivals and celebrations across Lake County and in the Chicagoland area.

The Health Department reminds residents to celebrate safely by making sure they are healthy before, during, and after these events.

Lake County residents can get their mpox vaccine, STI and HIV screening, or PrEP before the summer festivities begin.

Swim Safely This Summer

Memorial Day marks the unofficial start of the summer. The Health Department urges residents to protect themselves from illness, prevent the spread of gems, and pracce safe swimming.

Recreational water illnesses can spread if a person comes in contact with, swallows or inhales water contaminated with germs or chemicals. Diarrhea is the most common recretional water illness.

The Health Department samples and tests water from over 100 Lake Michigan and inland lake beaches for bacteria. Beach closure information can be found on the Health Department's Beach Monitoring and Advisories web page, www.lakecountyil.gov/2385, which is updated daily by 10:00 a.m.

Before heading out to your favorite lake or beach, check and see if it is open for swimming. If a swim ban is in place, do not swim in the lake.

Avoid swimming in lakes after a large rain event, since rainfall can wash pollutants into lakes resulting in elevated bacteria levels.

Don't swim in Lake Michigan during times of heavy surf (i.e., high waves), which can overpower even the strongest swimmer.

On inland lakes, occasional harmful algae blooms may occur. Avoid areas where the water has a green or blue-green appearance. Report any algae blooms to the Health Department by calling (847) 377-8020.
