2 application review for a new Massage Business License
3 in unincorporated Libertyville.

4 And we have some folks here, and they
02:03PM 5 can take a seat at the table. Anybody who is going to
6 be speaking or if there is an interpreter here for
7 anybody are welcome to sit up here and that way --

8 MR. BROWN: This is the Massage Business
9 License for Asian Queen Spa.

02:04PM 10 And Madam Interpreter, before we begin,
11 could you identify yourself for the court reporter?

12 THE INTERPRETER: Yes, Mingshu Zhang,
13 Mandarin interpreter.

14 MR. BROWN: And you are interpreting English
02:04PM 15 to Mandarin, Mandarin to English; is that correct?

16 THE INTERPRETER: That is correct.

17 MR. BROWN: And the Applicant in this
18 hearing is Hongchun Liu, L-I-U; is that correct?

19 THE INTERPRETER: Correct.

02:05PM 20 MR. BROWN: And Mr. Liu, you are a Mandarin
21 speaker; is that correct?

22 THE INTERPRETER: Correct.

23 MR. BROWN: And do you understand the
24 interpretation that is being given to you in Mandarin?

1 THE INTERPRETER: Yes.

2 MR. BROWN: Okay. And for the record, you
3 will be testifying today; is that correct?

4 THE INTERPRETER: Correct.

14 HONGCHUN LIU,

15 called as a witness herein, having been first duly
16 sworn through an interpreter, was examined and
17 testified through an interpreter as follows,
18 to-wit:

19 MR. BROWN: And before with begin our case,
02:06PM 20 I do have one question of Mr. Liu. Will you be giving
21 testimony or will your -- you will be giving testimony?
22 Will your wife be providing testimony?

23 THE INTERPRETER: I will give the testimony.

24 MR. BROWN: So you are not calling your wife

1 in your case; is that correct?

2 THE INTERPRETER: Correct.

3 MR. BROWN: Okay. As the first witness the
4 County will call Mr. Eric Tooke of the Planning,
02:06PM 5 Building & Development.

6 (Witness sworn.)

7 ERIC TOOKE,
8 called as a witness herein, having been first duly
9 sworn, was examined and testified as follows,
10 to-wit:

11 E X A M I N A T I O N

12 by Mr. Brown:

13 Q. Mr. Tooke, you are -- work with Planning,
14 Building & Development; is that correct?

02:07PM 15 A. Yes.

16 Q. And you are familiar with the location of
17 14048 West -- I'm sorry -- Petronella in Libertyville;
18 is that correct?

19 A. Yes.

02:07PM 20 Q. And Mr. Tooke, are you aware if Mr. Liu is a
21 present tenant at that location?

22 A. Yes.

23 Q. Now, with respect to that property, did --
24 in October of this year, did any member of Planning,

1 Building & Development go out to that property and
2 inspect it?

3 A. Yes.

4 Q. And who was that?

02:08PM

5 A. That would be Kelly Loftus, our inspector,
6 L-O-F-T-U-S.

7 Q. And as part of this inspection, did
8 Mr. Loftus note any violations of Lake County Code?

9 A. Yes.

02:08PM

10 Q. And what was the nature of those violations?

11 A. The nature of the violations --

12 MR. BROWN: If you could just slow down for
13 the interpreter.

14 THE INTERPRETER: Interpreter speaking:

02:08PM

15 Since you are not asking the people directly, I will go
16 to simultaneous mode, so I will do my interpretation
17 simultaneously where you ask and answer questions, so
18 no need to stop for me. I appreciate it.

19 MR. BROWN: Okay. Let us know if we're
20 going too fast.

02:08PM

21 BY THE WITNESS:

22 A. The violation was in relation to operating a
23 business without a change of use permit.

24

1 BY MR. BROWN:

2 Q. And you are the Enforcement Director for
3 Lake County; is that correct?

4 A. Yes.

02:09PM 5 Q. And what is a change of use permit?

6 A. A change of use permit inventories the uses
7 that are on a property. The change of use permit is
8 required whenever there is a change in the actual use
9 of the property. In this case it was from a barber
02:09PM 10 shop to a massage use.

11 Q. Okay. And that inspection, that occurred in
12 October; is that correct?

13 A. Yes.

14 Q. And what were any violations written as a
02:09PM 15 part of that inspection or stemming from that
16 inspection?

17 A. So a ticket was issued in regard to the
18 property.

19 Q. Okay. And what were the tickets?

02:09PM 20 A. The ticket that was issued was for no change
21 of use. It was written on October 11.

22 Q. Was there another ticket with respect to a
23 sign?

24 A. There was one particularly related to a

1 sign. There was no sign permit for that sign, and it
2 was -- I will leave it at that, yeah.

3 Q. So there is no permit for a sign, and a
4 ticket was written for that; is that correct?

02:10PM

5 A. Yes.

6 Q. Okay. Now, you have in front you County
7 Exhibit B; is that correct?

8 A. Yes.

02:10PM

9 Q. Okay. Now, County Exhibit B, Group
10 Exhibit B, that contains -- that is a group exhibit; is
11 that correct?

12 A. Yes.

13 Q. Okay. And that contains a number of
14 documents; is that correct?

02:11PM

15 A. Yes.

16 Q. And with respect to those documents, one of
17 them is a Code Case Detailed Report; is that correct,
18 the first page?

19 A. Yes.

02:11PM

20 Q. Okay. And that contains at the bottom of
21 that, that contains the violations of the CUP and
22 prohibited sign; is that correct?

23 A. Yes.

24 Q. Okay. Now, you said that tickets were

1 written for those violations; is that correct?

2 A. Yes.

3 Q. And those tickets that are written for those
4 violations, those are heard at administrative
02:11PM 5 adjudication; is that correct?

6 A. Yes.

7 Q. And that's Libertyville?

8 A. Yes.

9 Q. And in January of this year, was an
02:11PM 10 admission made by Mr. Liu regarding the violation of
11 the CUP?

12 A. Yes.

13 Q. And was the sign case or the sign ticket,
14 was that dismissed?

02:12PM 15 A. It was dismissed because the sign was
16 removed.

17 Q. Now I want to turn your attention to Pages 2
18 and 3 of Group Exhibit B. Those are -- that is the
19 report of the administrative adjudication officer with
02:12PM 20 respect to those violations; is that correct?

21 A. Yes.

22 Q. And with respect to the next couple of
23 pages, those were tickets that were written; is that
24 correct?

1 A. Yes.

2 Q. And the next pages in Group Exhibit B, these
3 are the photos that were taken in the field observation
4 report in October of 2024; is that correct?

02:12PM 5 A. Yes.

6 Q. And in October of 2024, an inspector James
7 Christy went to that location and found that the
8 business was running; is that correct?

9 A. Yes.

02:13PM 10 Q. Okay. And so that was running as a massage
11 parlor; is that correct?

12 A. Yes.

13 Q. And the photographs on the next couple
14 pages, those are of that business and that sign; is
15 that correct?

02:13PM

16 A. Yes.

17 Q. Now, you indicated during the course of your
18 testimony that the location was formerly a barber shop,
19 and what was sought to be put there was a massage
20 parlor; is that correct?

02:13PM

21 A. Yes.

22 Q. And as part of that, there was the
23 installation of a shower that was requested; is that
24 correct?

1 A. No.

2 Q. Okay. Can you explain?

3 A. The shower had been there previously, and a
4 shower permit was issued years ago for the use even
02:14PM 5 prior to the barber shop.

6 Q. Now, I want to turn your attention to the
7 last three pages of Group Exhibit B that are on Lake
8 County stationary and that begin at the top
9 staple/fasten in this box; do you see that?

02:14PM 10 A. Yes.

11 Q. Okay. And one of those that document, the
12 first document says pretty large type "permit"; is that
13 correct?

14 A. Yes.

02:14PM 15 Q. And could you please explain to the
16 Commissioner what this document is and what that permit
17 is for?

18 A. Sure. This permit is the permit card that's
19 issued when we have completed our review and it's been
02:14PM 20 approved. They get issued this permit card. This
21 permit card note says it's for a change of use for the
22 massage use on the property. There is also a note in
23 here stating that the showers were there previously.

24 Q. Now, with respect to that change of use,

1 that's a change of use from a barber shop to something
2 else; is that correct?

3 A. Yes.

02:15PM 4 Q. And this permit, do you know if it was
5 communicated to Mr. Liu that before a business needed
6 to go in there that a -- one second -- that a
7 certificate of occupancy would be necessary for that
8 business to actually start functioning?

02:15PM 9 A. It should have been. I was not a part of
10 that conversation, so I can't answer yes or no, but the
11 answer should be yes. The reason I say that is that
12 the permit was finalized the next day because there was
13 no changes in the makeup of the interior of the unit
14 itself.

02:16PM 15 Q. But for -- you are familiar with, you know,
16 how businesses run in Lake County and how they are --
17 when they are in a building that there needs to be a
18 certificate of occupancy; is that correct?

19 A. Yes.

02:16PM 20 Q. And that's for businesses not exclusive of
21 massage parlors; is that correct?

22 A. Yes.

23 Q. And when your inspectors went there in
24 October of 2024, that business was up and running; is

1 that right?

2 A. Yes.

3 Q. And there was no certificate of occupancy
4 for that business; is that correct?

02:16PM 5 A. On October 10, that's correct.

6 Q. Okay.

7 A. Or October 11, that's correct.

8 Q. And to your knowledge, today does that
9 business have a certificate of occupancy?

02:17PM 10 A. Yes.

11 Q. When was that certificate of occupancy?

12 A. December 20.

13 Q. So before December 20, there was no
14 certificate of occupancy?

02:17PM 15 A. That's correct.

16 MR. BROWN: Okay. I have no further
17 questions of Mr. Tooke. Does the Chair or any
18 Commissioner present?

19 CHAIR HART: I do not have any questions.

02:17PM 20 Commissioner?

21 MEMBER HUNTER: No.

22 MR. BROWN: Now procedurally, Mr. Liu would
23 have the opportunity not to make a statement but to ask
24 questions of Mr. Tooke, if he has any. Do you have

1 questions of Mr. Tooke?

2 THE INTERPRETER: Yes.

3 MR. BROWN: If I can interrupt, and I know
4 you haven't spoken in English yet, but Mr. Liu, you
02:19PM 5 will be given an opportunity to make a statement.

6 What you were asked was, do you have
7 any questions for Mr. Tooke?

8 THE INTERPRETER: No questions.

9 MR. BROWN: The County would ask that
02:19PM 10 Exhibit B be moved into evidence.

4 DETECTIVE ROBERT ROSSETTI,
5 called as a witness herein, having been first duly
6 sworn, was examined and testified as follows,
7 to-wit:

8 E X A M I N A T I O N

9 by Mr. Brown:

02:20PM 10 Q. Deputy Rossetti, could you please state your
11 name and star number?

12 A. Deputy or Detective Robert Rossetti,
13 R-O-S-S-E-T-T-I, Body or Badge No. 21702. I'm a
14 Detective with the Criminal Investigations Division for
02:20PM 15 the Lake County Sheriff's Office.

16 Q. And Deputy Rossetti, on January 14 of this
17 year, 2025, did you receive information that the Asian
18 Queen Spa located at 14048 West Petronella in
19 Libertyville was operating without a license?

02:20PM 20 A. I did.

21 Q. And after you received that information,
22 what steps did you take to investigate?

23 A. My first investigative step was to check the
24 internet for the business.

1 Q. Okay. And when you checked the internet,
2 what did that show?

3 A. A Google search of the business indicated
4 that the business was open, and it provided a phone
02:21PM 5 number as well as photographs of the interior of the
6 business and reviews for the business going back
7 approximately six months.

8 Q. And once again, this was in January of 2025;
9 is that correct?

02:21PM 10 A. January 14, 2025.

11 Q. So with respect to that internet search,
12 there is a phone number, right?

13 A. Correct.

14 Q. And did you call that number?

02:21PM 15 A. I did.

16 Q. Okay. And when you called that number, were
17 you able to make an appointment for massage?

18 A. Yes, I made a massage appointment for the
19 next day, January 15 at noon.

02:21PM 20 Q. Okay. And I put in front of you a document
21 that was labeled as Group Exhibit C. If you could look
22 that over just for a second. Does that document
23 contain your police report, the tickets that were
24 eventually written, and the internet information that

1 you found?

2 A. Yes, it does.

3 Q. Okay. Now I want to turn your attention to
4 the basically Page 4 of that document, the internet
02:22PM 5 document, and you got that from Google; is that
6 correct?

7 A. Correct, I believe Google Business.

8 Q. And that contains photographs; is that
9 right?

02:22PM 10 A. Yes.

11 Q. And the first page contains or there is an
12 entire page that contains a series of nine photographs.
13 And those were basically on the site of the Google site
14 for the Asian Queen Spa; is that correct?

02:23PM 15 A. Correct.

16 Q. And you eventually went to the location on
17 Petronella; is that correct?

18 A. Yes, I did.

19 Q. And did the -- what was on the photographs
02:23PM 20 both in terms of location and how it looked in the
21 photographs conform to what you saw both inside and
22 outside?

23 A. Yes, it did.

24 Q. Okay. Now, you talk about there being

1 reviews. The next pages of People's Group Exhibit C,
2 those are additional photographs and reviews; is
3 that correct?

4 So there is the page with the
02:23PM 5 six photographs, correct? So the next page, what is
6 that?

7 A. Those appear to be postings by the business.

8 Q. Okay. And one says five months ago?

9 A. Correct.

02:24PM 10 Q. Okay. And then there is another that says
11 five months ago, and then another that says four months
12 ago; is that correct?

13 A. Correct.

14 Q. Now, turning to the next page, that is also
02:24PM 15 that you received -- those documents are the documents
16 you got from the internet; is that correct?

17 A. Correct.

18 Q. And that is the phone number; is that
19 correct?

02:24PM 20 A. Correct.

21 Q. And it gives the address?

22 A. Correct.

23 Q. Now, on the 14th, you went out to the
24 location on Petronella the day before your appointment,

1 correct?

2 A. Right.

3 Q. And you went out there just to kind of see
4 the situation; is that correct?

02:24PM 5 A. Correct.

6 Q. See the location, know where you are going
7 to go, right?

8 A. Yes.

9 Q. Now, when you were out there on the 14th,
02:25PM 10 did it look like they were doing business?

11 A. It appeared so.

12 Q. And why was that?

13 A. There were signs for the business, and there
14 were vehicles parked in the parking lot near the
02:25PM 15 business.

16 Q. Now, in just if you can for the Chair and
17 for Members of the Board that are present, could you
18 just describe the general area on Petronella, what that
19 is, whether it's on a busy street, not on a busy
02:25PM 20 street, whether there is foot traffic there, just your
21 general knowledge of the area.

22 A. So Petronella Road here is a side street off
23 of a relatively major road of Bradley, south of
24 Route 176 and just north of I-94. On the left side of

1 the street, you will find Petronella Drive. It is
2 industrial office complex. There is multiple
3 buildings. They are usually subdivided into different
4 businesses.

02:26PM

5 Q. And so basically on the just generally
6 speaking to the west is the expressway, right?

7 A. South and west.

8 Q. South and west. And then to the north of --
9 approximately how far to the north is Route 176?

02:26PM

10 A. I would say approximately a mile and a half.

11 Q. Okay. And then as far as the major road, a
12 major east/west road to the south, there really is
13 none; is that correct?

14 A. Correct.

02:26PM

15 Q. And then the major road to the west would be
16 Bradley; is that correct?

17 A. So Bradley Road -- Petronella Drive comes
18 off of Bradley Road, and Bradley Road would be east of
19 the business or east of Petronella Drive.

02:27PM

20 Q. But are there a lot of businesses on
21 Bradley Road, if you know?

22 A. On Bradley Road itself, no. There are
23 several side streets containing industrial or office
24 complexes.

1 Q. Okay. So this is an area of industrial and
2 office complexes and not necessarily an area where
3 people are walking; is that correct?

4 A. Correct.

02:27PM

5 Q. And with no access road from the south, with
6 the expressway to the east, and the main east/west road
7 Route 176 pretty far to the north, this is probably --
8 with respect to that 176 being that far to the north,
9 unless you have business in this business park, there
10 is probably not a lot of folks just driving through
11 that area; would that be fair to say?

02:27PM

12 A. Yeah, typically not.

13 Q. Okay. So this is in a certain way, while
14 there are other businesses in that office park, there
15 is a certain isolation at that location; would that be
16 fair to say?

02:28PM

17 A. Yes.

18 Q. Now, on the 15th, you go out there, and you
19 don't go out there alone; is that correct?

02:28PM

20 A. Correct.

21 Q. And you are with Deputy Girmscheid?

22 A. So Detective Tyler Girmscheid,
23 G-I-R-M-S-C-H-E-I-D.

24 Q. And when you went out to that location on

1 Petronella, you came into contact with a Zhenzhi Liu;
2 is that correct?

3 A. Correct.

4 Q. And is that person Zhenzhi Liu at the
02:29PM 5 hearing today?

6 A. Yes.

7 Q. Okay. And you know her subsequently to be
8 the manager of that location whose name actually
9 appears on the application for the massage license?

02:29PM 10 A. Yes.

11 Q. And you went out there because you had an
12 appointment, right?

13 A. Correct.

14 Q. And when you got out there, you spoke to
02:29PM 15 her; is that correct?

16 A. Correct.

17 Q. Was there anybody else in the business?

18 A. No.

19 Q. Okay. And when you spoke to her, did you
02:29PM 20 talk to her about how long they had been operating?

21 A. Yes, I did.

22 Q. And what did she indicate?

23 A. Approximately three months.

24 Q. Okay. And did she also indicate that her

1 husband Hongchun Liu is the owner of that location?

2 A. Yes, she did.

3 Q. And she -- you subsequently learned that
4 Ms. Liu has a massage license; is that correct?

02:30PM

5 Actually, strike that.

6 Now, with respect to your conversation
7 with Ms. Liu, did she indicate that this was the only
8 business that her and her husband had?

9 A. No.

02:30PM

10 Q. What did she indicate?

11 A. She said --

12 If I can reference my report?

13 Q. Please do.

14 A. I believe it's Crown Point, Indiana that
15 they had other businesses.

02:30PM

16 Q. Okay. Did she indicate to you what type of
17 businesses they had in Crown Point, Indiana?

18 A. I believe we were talking in reference to
19 massage establishments, but I do not recall.

02:31PM

20 Q. Based on your report which states
21 businesses, you took from your conversation with
22 Ms. Liu that in Crown Point, Indiana there were
23 multiple such business; is that correct?

24 A. Yes.

1 Q. And was it also your impression based on
2 your conversation with Ms. Liu that she and her husband
3 are in the massage business -- or that those businesses
4 in Crown Point, Indiana were massage businesses?

02:31PM

5 A. Yes, per my conversation with her that those
6 businesses were massage businesses.

7 Q. When you went out there, how were you
8 dressed?

9 A. Very similar to how I am dressed right now.

02:32PM

10 Q. So it wasn't under cover, you weren't in
11 civilian casual, you looked like a police officer
12 substantially the way you are dressed now?

13 A. Right.

02:32PM

14 Q. So it was probably going to be well known
15 that you weren't there for a massage at that time?

16 A. Correct.

17 Q. Now, did you speak to her about operating
18 without a massage license in Lake County?

19 A. Yes, I did.

02:32PM

20 Q. And did she indicate anything to you
21 regarding her belief that she was able to operate
22 without a massage license in Lake County?

23 A. Yes, from her understanding, it was not
24 needed, and she had a State of Illinois License.

1 Q. Okay. And did she indicate anything to you
2 regarding what perhaps she believed that they were told
3 regarding the need for a license?

4 A. So she believed that they contacted some
02:33PM 5 kind of governmental agency or department who said that
6 it was not needed.

7 Q. Okay. And so just so the Chair and
8 Member Hunter aren't under the impression that you are
9 being evasive, that's what you were told by her; is
02:33PM 10 that right?

11 A. Yes. And just for understanding as well,
12 from my understanding, her primary language is
13 Mandarin, and a lot of these conversations were done
14 over Google Translate.

02:33PM 15 Q. But with respect to this other government
16 body that supposedly told her that she could operate,
17 you never learned what government body that was?

18 A. No.

19 Q. And she never told you who told her?

02:33PM 20 A. No.

21 Q. And did she ever give you a letter or
22 anything saying, hey, you guys are good to operate?

23 A. No.

24 Q. Now, once again, you went there on the 14th

1 and there were cars parked out there, the sign was
2 still out there, and so you indicated that on the 14th
3 that you believe that they were open for business,
4 right?

02:34PM

5 A. Correct.

6 Q. And when you showed up there on the 15th and
7 you had an appointment, Ms. Liu was at the location,
8 correct?

9 A. Correct.

02:34PM

10 Q. And, you know, based on your experience,
11 presumably if you didn't show up in uniform, she would
12 have been there to give you a massage; is that correct?

13 A. Correct.

02:34PM

14 Q. So on the 15th of January of this year, it
15 was your distinct impression that they were operating
16 without a license; is that correct?

17 A. Correct.

18 Q. And what steps did you take after that to
19 cite them regarding that?

02:34PM

20 A. I completed a Lake County Ordinance for a
21 massage establishment being unlicensed.

22 Q. And there are certain strictures with
23 respect to when we can have this hearing and when this
24 needs to be reported to the County Board that those

1 tickets that were issued. Those are still pending in
2 Round Lake; is that correct?

3 A. Correct. I believe the hearing is on the
4 10th at the Round Lake Beach Branch Court.

02:35PM 5 Q. So they have not been adjudicated at this
6 point?

7 A. As far as I am aware.

8 Q. So officer, you had the -- I'm sorry --
9 Detective, you had the opportunity to review the items
02:35PM 10 which are contained in front of you in County Group
11 Exhibit C. You have reviewed those; is that correct?

12 A. Yes.

13 MR. BROWN: I would ask that County Group
14 Exhibit C be moved into evidence.

02:36PM 15 CHAIR HART: Yes, that's fine.

16 MR. BROWN: I have nothing further of this
17 witness. Does a member the Board or Chair have any
18 questions?

19 CHAIR HART: I do not.

02:36PM 20 MR. BROWN: With that, no further questions.

21 The County would now call --

22 Oh, I'm sorry.

23 Mr. Liu, once again limiting it
24 strictly to questions for the deputy, do you have any

1 questions for him? Once again, a reminder that you
2 will be given the opportunity to present your case and
3 to make statements.

4 THE INTERPRETER: No questions.

02:36PM 5 MR. BROWN: Okay. I have nothing further of
6 these witnesses. I would just, if the Chair and the
7 Member of the Board don't wish that we can -- perhaps
8 they can go, unless you think there will be more
9 questions for them later.

02:37PM 10 CHAIR HART: Well, I just had a question
11 about, I have five names here. Sounds like there is
12 one person who operated this.

13 Do you know what I'm talking about?

14 MR. BROWN: No, no, just for the Deputy and
02:37PM 15 Mr. Tooke to go. They can stay or they can go.

16 CHAIR HART: No, they can go. Thank you.

17 I think that's okay with you too,
18 right, Kevin?

19 MEMBER HUNTER: Yes.

02:37PM 20 (Witnesses excused.)

16 A. Correct.

17 Q. And that's located at 14048 Petronella in
18 Libertyville; is that correct?

19 A. Correct.

02:39PM 20 Q. And you are the owner of that business; is
21 that correct?

22 A. Correct.

23 Q. And that business is incorporated by the
24 Secretary of State; is that correct?

1 A. Correct.

2 MR. BROWN: And I'm sorry. For the court
3 reporter, Mr. Liu is testifying, is the only person
4 indicated that he will testify.

02:40PM

5 BY MR. BROWN:

6 Q. So you are incorporated by the Secretary of
7 State, right?

8 A. Yes.

02:40PM

9 Q. Okay. Now, you live in Chicago; is that
10 correct?

11 A. Correct.

12 Q. And you live with your wife who is present,
13 Zhenzhi Liu; is that correct?

14 A. Correct.

02:40PM

15 Q. Okay. And she would be the manager of the
16 location, but you are the 100 percent owner; is that
17 correct?

18 A. Correct.

02:40PM

19 Q. Now, your wife is a massage therapist; is
20 that correct?

21 A. Correct.

22 Q. Okay. And the businesses that you own in
23 Crown Point, are those massage businesses?

24 A. Yes.

1 Q. Okay. And what are the names of the massage
2 businesses you own in Crown Point, Indiana?

3 A. They are not under my name but my wife.

4 Q. So do you have any part in the ownership of
02:41PM 5 the businesses in Crown Point?

6 A. No.

7 Q. Okay. And what are the names of those
8 businesses, if you know?

9 A. I can't really say due to my limited
02:42PM 10 English.

11 Q. Well, what are their names in Chinese?

12 A. Let me think.

13 CHAIR HART: But we do have an interpreter
14 here, so if you know the name in Mandarin, right? Is
02:42PM 15 it only a Mandarin named business, or is it an English
16 named business?

17 THE INTERPRETER: English names, but I just
18 so sorry, my memory just doesn't serve me at this
19 moment.

02:43PM 20 BY MR. BROWN:

21 Q. Okay. Let's start simply. How many
22 businesses does she own?

23 A. One.

24 Q. Okay. And you guys live together?

1 A. Yes.

2 Q. And you presumably talk to one another?

3 A. Yes. We also have a child, four years old.

4 Q. Okay. And so you have a kid, you talk to

02:44PM 5 one another, and are you telling the Chair and the

6 County Board that you don't know the name of your

7 wife's business in Crown Point, Indiana?

8 A. It's not that I don't know. Even like for

9 the business that in question for this hearing, I can't

02:44PM 10 really even say it or talk about it, the name, because

11 I didn't even finish my elementary school.

12 Q. So once again, I kind of want to explore

13 that. So what's the name of the business that you are

14 seeking to own in Lake County? What's the name of it?

02:45PM 15 CHAIR HART: If I may, just one person is

16 being interviewed, and I know that's difficult, but if

17 -- I just, unless Mr. Liu's wife wants to be sworn in

18 and respond, we just need to hear from Mr. Liu.

19 THE INTERPRETER: We'll ask my wife to be

02:46PM 20 sworn in and testify.

21 MR. BROWN: Okay, but not now. We'll move

22 on.

23 BY MR. BROWN:

24 Q. So do you know what -- have you ever been to

1 her business in Crown Point?

2 A. Yes.

3 Q. Okay. What streets are it located at, what
4 cross streets?

02:46PM 5 A. So here's how you get to that place. You
6 took 294 to Indiana, you took the exit, you turn right,
7 and then after two stops turn left and going for
8 another two stops, then you turn left again. That
9 would be where the spot is.

02:47PM 10 Q. So you don't know the names of any of the
11 streets that the location is at?

12 A. I can see it on my phone, but I don't know
13 how to pronounce it. 109113.

14 Q. Okay. We'll move on.

02:48PM 15 A. The numbers should be 109 --

16 Are you asking about Indiana business
17 or here?

18 Q. We're going to move on.

19 What street do you live on in Chicago?

02:48PM 20 A. 2956 South Wallace.

21 Q. No problem remembering that?

22 A. Correct.

23 Q. So now we -- so once again with respect to
24 your -- so you are not -- you say you are not involved

1 in your wife's business; is that right?

2 A. Correct.

3 Q. And you answered on this application, you
4 were asked the question, list any experience in the
02:49PM 5 massage therapy business including states where the
6 applicants hold a license to operate a massage therapy
7 business, and you put not applicable; is that correct?

8 A. Correct.

9 Q. Okay. So this is your first massage therapy
02:49PM 10 business; is that correct?

11 A. Correct.

12 Q. What do you do for a living now?

13 A. Delivery, food delivery.

14 Q. Okay. And how long have you been doing
02:50PM 15 that?

16 A. I was Uber/Lyft driver during the pandemic.

17 Q. Do you have any -- as an Uber/Lyft driver
18 and as a food delivery person, do you have any trouble
19 with finding addresses during that doing that job?

02:51PM 20 A. No, I just use my phone. It's all in the
21 app.

22 Q. Now, in your application, you indicate that
23 your wife is the manager of the Asian Queen Spa in
24 Libertyville, right?

1 A. Correct.

2 Q. Okay. And you were asked to list on your
3 application all of the employees of the Asian Queen Spa
4 in Libertyville; is that correct?

02:52PM 5 A. Correct.

6 Q. And you listed your wife and your address on
7 Wallace Street, right?

8 A. Correct.

9 Q. Okay. And Mr. Liu, how long have you been
02:52PM 10 operating?

11 A. Since August 10.

12 Q. Of 2024?

13 A. That's right.

14 Q. Okay. And as the owner of the business, you
02:53PM 15 are aware that you have a presence on the internet; is
16 that correct?

17 A. Correct.

18 Q. Okay. And people give reviews; is that
19 correct?

02:53PM 20 A. Correct.

21 Q. And those reviews, and I am not a business
22 person, but those reviews probably help you get more
23 customers, right?

24 A. Correct.

1 Q. Okay. So I want to ask you, and this can be
2 found in County Group Exhibit C which has previously
3 been put into evidence, there is a review which states
4 -- actually, we'll start with the first one that was
02:54PM 5 given by a Hu Ping, and it states, quote, Wendy gave me
6 one of the best massages. I asked her to focus on my
7 neck, shoulders, and lower back, and her technique was
8 incredible. Highly recommended.

9 Who is Wendy?

02:55PM 10 A. My wife.

11 Q. Okay. I want to go to the next entry in
12 County Exhibit C. It's also a review that appears on
13 your website as a part of your business. It's from a
14 person who gives a review which states, quote, nice
02:55PM 15 sports recovery massage from CiCi. I like to go here
16 after gym workouts and use their refreshing shower spa
17 facilities before my massage. Luxury body soaps and
18 shampoos, then towel off with thick oversize terrycloth
19 bath sheets. These facilities are first class and
02:55PM 20 resort style. Amazing hidden gem in Green Oaks.

21 My question for you is, who is CiCi?

22 A. We don't have a CiCi.

23 Q. Okay. I'd like -- there is another review
24 in County Exhibit C that says, thanks Sofia. My

1 shoulder feels so much better. See you soon.

2 Same question; who is Sofia?

3 A. We don't have Sofia.

4 Q. Okay. So it's your testimony that your wife
02:57PM 5 is still the only employee at that location; is that
6 correct?

7 A. Correct.

8 CHAIR HART: Thank you. So there is a
9 response from the owner to the message from CiCi
02:57PM 10 saying, thank you for the glowing review.

11 So are you responding that CiCi -- you
12 are responding that CiCi gave a great massage, but you
13 don't know who CiCi is?

14 THE INTERPRETER: I don't know.

02:57PM 15 CHAIR HART: Okay.

16 BY MR. BROWN:

17 Q. Now, also as part of the reviews that are
18 for your business, there was a review which said, this
19 new massage office is very nice. My husband and I
02:58PM 20 tried a couple's massage for 90 minutes. The masseur
21 was very professional, felt very relaxed, and will
22 definitely come back.

23 So if there is a couple's massage where
24 two couples are in a room, each of them receiving a

1 message, is it your testimony today that you still only
2 have one employee?

3 A. I can also do it, so for a couple massage, I
4 usually work with my wife.

02:59PM 5 Q. And you are not a massage therapist; is that
6 correct?

7 A. I am still in the process of training and
8 application.

9 Q. So you haven't been licensed by the State to
02:59PM 10 perform that massage; is that correct?

11 A. Correct.

12 Q. And in the photographs that are on your
13 website, there are also rooms with two massage beds in
14 one room. Presumably those are for couple's massage;
03:00PM 15 is that correct?

16 A. Correct.

17 Q. Okay. And you actually advertise for
18 couple's massage; is that correct?

19 A. Correct.

03:00PM 20 Q. Yet you only have one employee who is a
21 licensed massage therapist; is that right?

22 A. Correct.

23 Q. Okay. Just with respect to the businesses
24 in Crown Point, are you in any way associated with the

1 Relax Massage in Crown Point?

2 A. Where?

3 Q. In Crown Point, Indiana.

4 A. I don't know.

03:01PM

5 Q. Okay. How about Jade Massage in Crown
6 Point, Indiana?

7 A. I don't know.

8 Q. Just a couple of other questions. On the
9 Illinois Secretary of State Registration, your
03:02PM 10 registered agent is Dong Xiang, D-O-N-G, X-I-A-N-G.
11 Who is that?

12 If I may approach, this might just make
13 things easier. Do you know who that is?

14 A. Yes, yes, there is a person.

03:03PM

15 Q. Who is it?

16 A. Someone from my home town.

17 Q. Home town on Wallace Street or home town
18 someplace else?

19 A. From China.

03:03PM

20 Q. Okay. And so your registered agent lives in
21 China?

22 A. No, here in the States.

23 Q. Okay. So the address that you have on there
24 for him is your place of business. Does he live there?

1 A. No. In the beginning he was planning to
2 purchase the property in this building, this address,
3 and to start a company, but later he didn't do that,
4 but the company was already registered, so it moved
03:04PM 5 under my name.

6 Q. But is he still your registered agent?

7 A. No.

8 Q. Have you changed that with the Illinois
9 Secretary of State?

03:05PM 10 A. I did. I did apply for the change.

11 Q. Okay. And just a couple other questions
12 about Crown Point, Indiana. Are you familiar with the
13 Asian King Massage in Crown Point?

14 A. Yes.

03:05PM 15 Q. What do you know about that place?

16 THE INTERPRETER: Interpreter speaking:
17 They are speaking in their own dialect that I cannot
18 recognize.

19 CHAIR HART: Will you repeat that, please?

03:06PM 20 THE INTERPRETER: Interpreter speaking:
21 They are speaking in their own dialect that I cannot
22 recognize.

23 CHAIR HART: Okay, so you are unable to
24 interpret what Mr. Liu is saying?

1 THE INTERPRETER: What they are exchanging.

2 BY MR. BROWN:

3 Q. And just one other question. Are you
4 familiar with another massage business owner in Crown
03:06PM 5 Point, Indiana called would Wujiau Liu, W-U-J-I-A-O,
6 L-I-U?

7 THE INTERPRETER: Interpreter speaking:
8 Could you respell?

9 BY MR. BROWN:

03:06PM 10 Q. Yes, W-U-J-I-A-O, Liu, L-I-U. Are you
11 familiar with that massage business owner in Crown
12 Point, Indiana?

13 A. No.

14 Q. So just to clear up, Mr. Liu, you haven't
03:07PM 15 completed a massage therapy program; is that correct?

16 A. Correct.

17 Q. And you have not passed a test to be an
18 accredited massage therapy person for a certificate
19 from the National Certification Examination for
03:08PM 20 Therapeutic Massage and Body Work; is that correct?

21 A. Correct.

22 Q. Okay. Now, you submitted to a background
23 check based on fingerprints; is that correct?

24 A. Correct.

1 Q. And that had no negative information; is
2 that correct, to the best of your knowledge?

3 A. Correct.

4 Q. Okay. Now, I don't mean to ask too complex
03:08PM 5 a question about a business model, but the location
6 that you have on Petronella, there is not a lot of
7 people walking around there; would that be fair to say?

8 A. That's correct.

9 Q. Okay.

03:09PM 10 A. Basically, the customer will call to make
11 appointment.

12 Q. Okay. And similarly, Petronella is not a
13 particularly busy street, right?

14 A. Correct.

03:09PM 15 Q. Okay. So you're relying on word of mouth
16 and perhaps internet reviews for your business; would
17 that be fair to say?

18 A. Correct.

19 Q. Okay.

03:10PM 20 CHAIR HART: I have a question.

21 MR. BROWN: I have no further questions of
22 Mr. Liu. But Chair.

23 CHAIR HART: Thank you. So I understand,
24 your first day of business was when?

1 THE INTERPRETER: August.

2 CHAIR HART: Okay. And then some of these
3 reviews are from six months ago, I thought I saw, so
4 that would make me think you were in business before
03:10PM 5 then.

6 THE INTERPRETER: No, I took over this
7 business on August 10.

8 CHAIR HART: May I ask, took it over from
9 whom, and what was it called before?

03:11PM 10 THE INTERPRETER: I don't know, but when I
11 was taking over, I was told that that person was also
12 in the massage business.

13 CHAIR HART: So these are just reviews for
14 the Asian Queen Spa from six months ago, and so if you
03:11PM 15 took over a business, you don't know who you took it
16 over from, and you don't know the name of the previous
17 business; is that what I am understanding?

18 THE INTERPRETER: Correct. Yes, I took this
19 business over on August 10. I have document that I
03:12PM 20 signed to prove that.

21 MEMBER HUNTER: If I might.

22 CHAIR HART: Go ahead.

23 MEMBER HUNTER: Didn't Eric Tooke say that
24 the business used to be a barber shop?

1 CHAIR HART: Uh-huh.

2 MEMBER HUNTER: Why would a barber shop be
3 in the back of nowhere?

03:12PM 4 CHAIR HART: It just was. My concern is
5 that there is a review here from six months ago.

6 MEMBER HUNTER: I saw that.

7 CHAIR HART: When was the paperwork
8 submitted to change the agent?

03:13PM 9 THE INTERPRETER: Also in August. I signed
10 the agreement on August 10 and founded my company at
11 the end of August.

12 CHAIR HART: Okay. And, sir, you said you
13 were in the middle of your education to be a massage
14 therapist. Where is the school, and when will you
03:13PM 15 graduate?

16 THE INTERPRETER: In Chinatown.

17 CHAIR HART: What is the name of the school?

18 THE INTERPRETER: Peide, P-E-I-D-E.

19 CHAIR HART: Okay. And you have some --
03:14PM 20 well, and when would you graduate?

21 THE INTERPRETER: I been learning every day,
22 but I don't know when I can graduate. I am too dumb.

23 CHAIR HART: I don't think you are dumb.

24 THE INTERPRETER: My English, I just can't.

1 CHAIR HART: Okay. And it looks like it
2 should only take about ten days, is that what I just
3 saw, to make a change?

4 Thank you.

03:15PM 5 Changing a registered agent in Illinois
6 with the Illinois Secretary of State can take one to
7 ten business days, but expedited filings can be
8 processed in 24 hours.

9 So you made this request in August, and
03:15PM 10 it still is not complete; is that correct?

11 THE INTERPRETER: The name change
12 application, I still haven't received that.

13 CHAIR HART: Thank you. Any other
14 questions?

03:16PM 15 MR. BROWN: I have no other questions. I
16 would just ask that the Illinois Secretary of State
17 incorporation item be County Exhibit E.

18 CHAIR HART: Okay, thank you.

19 MR. BROWN: I have no further questions of
03:16PM 20 Mr. Liu.

21 (Witness excused.)

1 MR. BROWN: I will be very brief if the
2 County can call Ms. Liu.

3 CHAIR HART: Okay, call Mrs. Liu.

4 (Witness sworn.)

03:17PM 5 THE INTERPRETER: Yes.

6 ZHENZHI LIU,
7 called as a witness herein, having been first duly
8 sworn through an interpreter, was examined and
9 testified through an interpreter as follows,
10 to-wit:

11 E X A M I N A T I O N

12 by Mr. Brown:

13 Q. Ms. Liu, you are -- it's noted that you will
14 be the manager of the Asian Queen Spa in Libertyville;
03:17PM 15 is that correct?

16 A. Yes.

17 Q. And how long has that Asian Queen Spa been
18 operating?

19 A. Was started from around August 10 or days
03:18PM 20 after.

21 Q. Okay. And in the application, it says that
22 you are the only employee; is that correct?

23 A. Correct.

24 Q. Okay. And so your husband has testified

1 that he has given massages at that location; you heard
2 that, right?

3 A. Correct.

4 Q. And you are licensed by the State of
03:18PM 5 Illinois; is that correct?

6 A. Correct.

7 Q. But he is not?

8 A. Correct.

9 Q. Okay. Now, and you also heard the testimony
03:18PM 10 based on the reviews that were given of the location,
11 and you heard me ask your husband, who is Wendy, and he
12 said that's you; is that correct?

13 A. Correct.

14 Q. And you also read the reviews about CiCi; is
03:19PM 15 that correct?

16 A. Correct.

17 Q. Is that you as well?

18 A. No.

19 Q. So someone on a review says, CiCi gave me a
03:19PM 20 massage. You say that you are the only employee. Did
21 someone named CiCi ever give massages at that location?

22 A. No. I also saw that review. That review
23 was actually made for the business before we took it
24 over.

1 Q. How about Sofia, have you ever employed
2 anybody named Sofia?

3 A. No.

4 Q. Same answer as before; that's from somebody
03:20PM 5 else?

6 A. Correct.

7 Q. Now, your husband indicated that there was a
8 previous business there before. What was the name of
9 that business?

03:20PM 10 A. So on the Google Business page, there was
11 like a promoting ad or something, and on that you go to
12 see a website, and that website actually was the name
13 of the previous business. I just do not recall at this
14 point.

03:21PM 15 Q. But as far as you know and what are telling
16 us under oath today is that had a different name than
17 Asian Queen Spa; is that what you are saying?

18 A. That's correct. It was operating as a
19 massage business before we took it over. I think it
03:22PM 20 was operating for about three to four months, then
21 probably the business wasn't very successful,
22 therefore, they decided to end it.

23 Q. Just couple of other questions. What's the
24 name of your business in Crown Point?

1 A. Asian King Spa.

2 Q. Okay. And then as long as I have you under
3 oath, what were you saying to your husband in the
4 dialect that the interpreter couldn't understand?

03:23PM 5 A. I do not -- I'm not sure which part of our
6 conversation you are referring to.

7 MR. BROWN: I have no other questions of
8 Ms. Liu. Does any Board Member?

9 CHAIR HART: I just have one other question.

03:23PM 10 So is the person saying that there was
11 a massage therapy spa operating at that same spot
12 before they took it over and created it as Asian Queen
13 Spa?

14 THE INTERPRETER: That's right.

03:24PM 15 CHAIR HART: Was it named Asian Queen Spa?

16 THE INTERPRETER: No.

17 CHAIR HART: So my only point is the reviews
18 in Google are reviews not for the address but for Asian
19 Queen Spa, so the reviews six months ago to which the
03:24PM 20 owner responded to the review from six months ago would
21 lead me to believe that the business had been operated
22 for at least six months.

23 THE INTERPRETER: We hire some professionals
24 to help us promote our business, and they just went in

1 the Google page and then just changed the business
2 name.

3 CHAIR HART: I am just going to say, this
4 isn't under the name of the business. They would have
03:25PM 5 to have somebody they hired to work at Google to make
6 those changes to connect it to their business, is what
7 I am saying.

8 THE INTERPRETER: I just know that we hired
9 professionals. How they operated, how they did it, I
03:26PM 10 don't know.

11 MR. BROWN: I'm sorry, sir. She's
12 testifying.

13 MEMBER HUNTER: They indicated that the one
14 in Crown Point, Asian King Spa, so the spa reviews for
03:26PM 15 Asian King are almost -- are by the same people that
16 made the reviews in Asian Queen Spa. Good marketing.
17 Same names. I don't believe it, though.

18 MR. BROWN: I have no further questions.
19 And pending the moving of the County Exhibits into
03:27PM 20 evidence, the County would rest.

21 Mr. Liu, you have the opportunity to
22 call witnesses or you have the opportunity, you could
23 call witnesses if you wish. You can also make any
24 statements you wish under oath to the Board.

1 So are you going to call any witnesses?

2 THE INTERPRETER: No.

3 MR. BROWN: Do you wish to make any
4 statements to the Board regarding -- or any statement
03:28PM 5 or introduce any physical evidence to the Board?

6 THE INTERPRETER: No.

7 MR. BROWN: And so this will be your
8 opportunity, though, to make a statement, and once
9 again, what you say is being written down, and just
03:28PM 10 want to give you the opportunity to, you know, you've
11 applied for the license. I just wanted to give you the
12 opportunity to state, you know, your cause for your
13 license application.

14 THE INTERPRETER: Okay. Because when I
03:29PM 15 first took over this business I called the City Hall
16 asking about license, and I was told that no license
17 was needed, therefore, I finished this taking over.
18 Later I also went to the Village and also was told it
19 is not needed. Much later when I realized that I
03:30PM 20 really needed this license, I came to this place. I
21 also went to the Hall multiple times. I have no other
22 request for anything. I am just asking for opportunity
23 from all of you, and thank you.

24 CHAIR HART: Thank you.

1 MR. BROWN: And you have no further evidence
2 or no further statements; is that correct, sir?

3 THE INTERPRETER: Correct.

4 MR. BROWN: That would close proofs.

03:31PM 5 CHAIR HART: Okay, that's fine. And then I
6 think I'd like to go into executive session to discuss,
7 and we'll give my ruling when I come out of executive
8 session, so that means the three of you would wait
9 outside, and someone will come and get you when we're
03:31PM 10 done talking.

11 (Executive session had.)

12 CHAIR HART: Thank you very much. We are
13 out of executive session.

14 So my next steps are to issue written
03:37PM 15 findings and make a recommendation to the County Board
16 for whether or not I recommend to approve this massage
17 license. That next meeting will be next Tuesday.
18 According to Section 114.09 of our Ordinance --

19 MR. BROWN: If you can just hold on.

03:38PM 20 CHAIR HART: Sure. Thank you.

21 THE INTERPRETER: Thank you.

22 CHAIR HART: According to Section 114.09 of
23 the Ordinance, there will be a transcript which is a
24 record of the proceeding of today's hearing. And that

1 transcript is created at the expense of the Applicant.
2 There is also the expense of the translating, so I
3 wanted to make sure that the Applicant understands
4 that.

03:39PM

5 THE INTERPRETER: Okay, no problem.

6 CHAIR HART: Okay. Thank you very much. So
7 that recommendation will come before the Board on that
8 Tuesday morning.

9 THE INTERPRETER: Do I need to be present?

03:39PM

10 CHAIR HART: You do not, sir.

11 THE INTERPRETER: Thank you.

12 CHAIR HART: And to be clear, you cannot be
13 open for business unless and until you receive a
14 license.

15 THE INTERPRETER: Yeah, we stopped our
16 business ever since the police officer visited.

17 CHAIR HART: Okay, thank you. And that
18 concludes this hearing, Massage Business License
19 Hearing. Thank you.


