Tree and Native Plant Program Research

Background

- E&E directed the sustainability team to explore options for a Lake County administered tree program aimed increasing biodiversity and providing increased stormwater mitigation for the unincorporated areas.
- Since that time, the sustainability team has researched existing tree and native plant programs operating within Lake County.

Findings

- 11 municipalities in Lake County offer residential tree and native plant programs and incentives.
- 6 of the 11 municipalities have programs focused on residential properties:
 - 1 program provides residents with a one-time grant through the Chicago Region Trees Initiative to purchase a tree
 - 2 programs partner with Openlands through their Conservation@home program
 - 3 programs have a 50/50 cost share structure
 - 1 municipality offers residents an array of co-pay programs (native seeding program, invasive shrub removal, natives planting, etc.)
- The remaining programs focus on plantings within rights-of-way

Findings Cont.

Budget:

- Budgets for individual programs range from \$500 to \$15,000
- Annual program budgets are often set based on the level of participation in recent years.

Residential interest level:

- Varies municipality to municipality.
- Participants appear to prefer when programs offer flexibility in where the trees or native plants can be planted (ex. front vs. back yard)

Findings Cont.

Partnerships, management, and staff time:

- Existing programs are housed within various departments.
- Limited staff time involved; work can be accomplished by minimal staff:
 - Bulk of staff time is program development, preparing list of acceptable trees and plants, determining program requirements/structure, marketing of program, etc.
 - Ongoing management is more administrative duties than technical expertise
- Grants may be available through various nonprofit and governmental organizations.
- Partnering with an existing organization or program may be beneficial.
