RE: CORONER'S INVESTIGATION REPORT FOR NOVEMBER 2020

Coroner's Monthly Report of Investigations conducted for the month of November 2020 (1):

Non-Coroner's Cases (2) 461 <u>Coroner's Case: (3) 53</u> **Total Death Investigations:** 514

Total death investigations for November 2019: 442

- Of the total Coroner's Cases for November 2020 (53), the Manner of Death (or suspected Manner of Death) is outlined in the following pages. Due to pending finalization of Autopsy reports, Toxicology reports, and Investigative Agency reports, a total of 4 cases are still pending final disposition.
- Of the 53 Coroner's Cases a total of 42 had further forensic examination (Autopsy) conducted by the Lake County Coroner's Forensic Pathologist, Eimad Zakariya, M.D. in conjunction with the Lake County Coroner's Autopsy Technician and Deputy Coroner Investigators.
- Of the 514 deaths reported to the Coroner's Office, 105 were related to the Novel Coronavirus (COVID-19) where COVID-19 was a direct cause or contributory factor in the death. Of these 105 deaths 6 were Coroner Cases.
- The Lake County Coroner's Office Toxicology Laboratory conducted 31 toxicology test and as a result, 29 samples were sent to an outside laboratory for further quantitative/qualitative testing.
- The Lake County Coroner's Office Issued 401 Permits for Cremation to area funeral homes in November 2020.

⁽¹⁾ As forensic reports such as Autopsy Reports, Toxicology Reports and other investigative agency reports may take 4 – 8 weeks for completion, Coroner Banek is presenting statistical data that is more complete than more recent months data.

Cases reported to the Office of Coroner where Minimal Investigation is needed; primarily consisting of review of medical history, medical records, and discussion with health care providers involved in the case.


Thorough investigation as to the cause of death, with subsequent Case Conference to determine the manner of death (i.e., homicide, suicide, accidental, or undetermined). Where required and mandated by Illinois Statute by type of death, select cases may be sent to an Inquest by Jury.



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
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NOVEMBER 2020 OVERALL CASES

This data includes <u>Suspected</u> Manner of Death in Cases still pending finalization.




There are no reported Homicides in November 2020




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Autopsies November 2020



Autopsy Types:

Full – A complete external and internal examination is completed by the Forensic Pathologist with a written report.

Limited – A Complete external, and in some cases limited internal examination, is completed by the Forensic Pathologist with a written report.

External – No Physical examination is completed however medical records from an external agency (hospital, nursing facility or physician) are reviewed by the Forensic Pathologist with a written report.

None – No physical examination or medical record review is necessary. Most of these cases are signed by the deceased's physician however family or physician information is not available at the time of death warranting a response from the Coroner's Office.
