- Lake County owns and operates three wastewater reclamation facilities (Des Plaines River, New Century Town, and Mill Creek).
- Atlas Copco is the company that manufactures the High-Speed Efficiency Blowers in use at the Des Plaines River treatment facility which provide the much-needed air for the aeration basins (secondary treatment) and allows for proper mixing and sustained oxygen that is critical to the support of the biological population within each basin.
- Atlas Copco is the sole source provider for service and repairs to the high-speed efficiency blowers in use at our treatment facilities and no other reasonable service provider is available to the department.
