7.1 10-0120

Joint resolution authorizing the execution of an agreement with the Village of Lincolnshire for the Village's portion of the construction of a roundabout at the intersection of Riverwoods Road and Everett Road and designated as Section 04-00136-06-CH.

- Riverwoods Rd and Everett Rd; Roundabout: Village of Lincolnshire Agreement
- A roundabout will be constructed at the intersection of Riverwoods Rd and Everett Rd.
- The Village of Lincolnshire desires additional landscape plantings, lighting, irrigation system and signage as part of this improvement.
- This resolution authorizes the execution of an intergovernmental agreement with the Village of Lincolnshire.

7.2 <u>10-0121</u>

Joint resolution authorizing the execution of an agreement between Lake County and Central Lake County Joint Action Water Agency (*JAWA*) providing the terms and conditions for their relocation of potable water facilities in conjunction with the Midlothian Road extension and bike path construction designated as Section 09-00244-03-FP.

- Midlothian Rd Extension; Roadway Improvements and Bike Path Construction: Central Lake County Joint Action Water Agency Agreement
- Midlothian Rd will be extended from the existing county fair entrance northerly to Casey Rd.
- The Central Lake County Joint Action Water Agency has potable water facilities situated within and along the right-of-way of Midlothian Rd extension.
- In order to accommodate the construction of the Midlothian Rd extension and the associated bike path these facilities need to be relocated.
- This resolution authorizes the execution of an agreement with Central Lake County Joint Action Water Agency.

7.3 <u>10-0122</u>

Joint resolution appropriating \$575,000 of ½% Sales Tax for Transportation and Public Safety funds for an advance construction improvement for the upcoming relocation of Peterson Road at IL Rte. 60 involving the accommodations of the large natural gas mains in this project and designated as Section 10-00098-11-MS.

- Peterson Rd at IL Rte. 60 Relocation; Advance Construction: Appropriation
- The relocation of Peterson Rd at IL Rte. 60 is included in the county's 2009-2014 Highway Improvement Program.
- Kinder Morgan has 3 natural gas lines in the area of the improvement, for which "utility protection slabs" must be placed.
- The placement of these utility protection slabs can be done before the construction of the main improvement.
- This resolution appropriates \$575,000 of 1/4% Sales Tax for Transportation and Public Safety funds for this advance construction.

7.4 <u>10-0123</u>

Joint resolution authorizing the execution of an agreement between Lake County and V3 Companies of Illinois, LTD, Woodridge, Illinois, for the provision of Phase III construction engineering for the proposed relocation of Peterson Road at IL Rte. 60 and also the advance contract for the construction of utility protection slabs at a maximum cost for services described of \$1,065,803.55. This resolution also appropriates \$1,280,000 of Matching Tax funds and designated as Section 00-00098-11-CH.

- Peterson Rd at IL Rte. 60, Relocation: Engineering Consultant Agreement
- Phase III construction engineering is required for this improvement.
- This resolution provides for an agreement with V3 Companies of Illinois, LTD, Woodridge, Illinois, for construction engineering services and appropriates \$1,280,000 of Matching Tax funds.

Joint resolution authorizing the execution of an agreement among Lake County, the Village of Kildeer and the Village of Deer Park for the widening improvements to Quentin Road (Rue Royale to White Pine Road) and the relocation of the proposed regional bike path along Quentin Road to an off-road route, and designated as Section 02-00051-08-WR.

- Quentin Rd (Rue Royale to White Pine Rd); Widening Improvements and Regional Bike Path Relocation: Villages of Killdeer and Deer Park Agreement.
- Quentin Rd from Rue Royale to White Pine will be widened to 5 lanes, including the improvement of the county legs of the intersection at US Rte. 12 within the Villages of Kildeer and Deer Park.
- The improvement will include a regional bike path in the Quentin Rd right-of-way.
- The Villages of Kildeer and Deer Park propose the relocation of the regional bike path from White Pine to Long Grove Rd off of the Quentin Rd right-of-way, with future construction by those entities.

Joint resolution authorizing the execution of an agreement between the State of Illinois and Lake County for partial funding from the state for the resurfacing of Gilmer Road (*Diamond Lake Road to IL Rte. 83*). This resolution appropriates \$515,000 of Matching Tax funds for this improvement designated as Section 10-00079-15-RS.

- Gilmer Rd, (Diamond Lake Rd to IL Rte 83), Resurfacing: Appropriation and IDOT Agreement.
- The resurfacing of Gilmer Rd (Diamond Lake Rd to IL Rte. 83) is included in the County's 2009-2014 Highway Improvement Program.
- The State of Illinois will be providing up to \$300,000 of Emergency Repair Program which is state capital bond funds towards this improvement.
- This resolution authorizes the execution of an agreement with the State of Illinois for the state share of this resurfacing and appropriates \$515,000 of Matching Tax funds.

- A total of 3 bids were received and the lowest responsible bidder is Peter Baker & Son Company, Lake Bluff, Illinois, with a contract amount of \$2,173,034.19.

- River Rd (Kelsey Rd to Roberts Rd) and Kelsey Rd (US Rte 14 to IL Rte 22); Resurfacing:
 Contract Award
- This improvement is included in the 2009 2014 Pavement Management Program.
- A total of 4 bids were received and the lowest responsible bidder is Peter Baker and Son Co. Lake Bluff, Illinois, with a contract amount of \$1,040,721.08.

Joint resolution appropriating \$3,750,000 of ½% Sales Tax for Transportation and Public Safety funds for the construction of a three lane roadway, a bike path and railroad improvements as part of the Midlothian Road Extension (from the existing county fair entrance northerly to Moorehead Circle) and designated as section 09-00244-03-FP

• Midlothian Road Extension and Prairie Crossing Bike Path, Lake County Fair Entrance, to Moorehead Circle: Appropriation

- Midlothian Road will be extended from the existing county fair entrance northerly to Moorehead Circle.
- The Prairie Crossing Bike Path will be constructed on the west side of Midlothian Rd from Peterson Rd to Moorehead Circle.
- This resolution appropriates \$3,750,000 of ¼ % Sales Tax for Transportation and Public Safety funds.

7.10 <u>10-0135</u>

Joint resolution authorizing the execution of Amendment #1 to the Phase I agreement for the use of federal highway funds between the State of Illinois and Lake County for the provision of additional Phase I preliminary engineering services for the proposed replacement of the deck beams of the bridge carrying northbound Arlington Heights Road over Buffalo Creek and designated as Section 05-00193-04-BR.

- Arlington Heights Rd Northbound over Buffalo Creek, Bridge Deck Beam Replacements; Supplemental Phase I: IDOT Agreement.
- The county has been allocated Federal Highway Bridge Program (*HBP*) funds to repair this bridge and IDOT administers all federal funds.
- Phase I preliminary engineering is being expanded to include a bridge scour analysis and an asbestos verification and associated reporting.
- This Amendment #1 to the Phase 1 agreement provides for the county to receive 80% reimbursement for the additional cost of Phase I.

Joint resolution authorizing the execution of a supplemental agreement between Lake County and MACTEC Engineering and Consulting Inc., Chicago, Illinois, for the provision of additional Phase I preliminary engineering services for the replacement of the deck beams of the bridge carrying northbound Arlington Heights Road over Buffalo Creek at a supplemental cost of services described of \$4,050 and designated as Section 05-00193-04-BR.

- Arlington Heights Road Northbound over Buffalo Creek, Bridge Deck Beam Replacements: Supplemental Phase I: Consultant Agreement.
- The selected firm of MACTEC Engineering & Consulting Inc., Chicago, Illinois is proceeding with the Phase I engineering services.
- IDOT has determined that it is necessary to expand Phase I engineering services to include a bridge scour analysis and an asbestos verification and associated reporting.
- This resolution authorizes the execution of a supplemental agreement with MACTEC Engineering & Consulting Inc.

Joint resolution authorizing an Agreement with Aries Industries, Waukesha, WI to purchase a Lateral Inspection Camera System, for the Department of Public Works, Libertyville, IL in the amount of \$56,885.

In 2006 a Customized Hi-Cube Van, with an Aries Industries Inc Customized Color T.V.
 Sewer Inspection System was purchased for sewer line inspections.

- There is a need to purchase a lateral inspection camera system to be used as an
 extension to the existing sewer line camera equipment to identify obstructions affecting
 individual home service lines.
- The department conducted reviews of available sources and it has been determined that
 there is only one source available for the camera that is compatible with the Aries
 Industries Inc System Sewer Inspection equipment.
- The Purchasing Agent consulted with an ad hoc review group and determined that this purchase is exempt from bidding on the basis of sole source.
- This purchase will cost \$56,885 charging account # 610-4881099-83010-48310.

7.13 10-0105

Resolution authorizing emergency appropriations for FY 2010 in various funds for certain projects, items and activities, which were budgeted in the prior year and not completed.

- This resolution authorizes the 'carry-over' or re-authorization of certain FY 2009 activities.
- These activities were not included in the FY 2010 budget while the carry-over list and associated budget amounts were determined; including them at budget time would have hindered the proper scrutiny of the new FY 2010 budget.
- Without this action, these projects and/or items will not have the budget authority required.

7.14 10-0149

Tax Abatement Resolution for the 2005 General Obligation Bonds.

- When the County issued these bonds they were issued as alternative revenue bonds, which means that the taxes are paid from revenue other than property taxes.
- If the County has insufficient alternative revenue it must pay for the debt service with tax levy funds. For that reason there is actually a tax levy in the County Clerk's records for payment of principal and interest on these bonds.
- Each year the County must determine that it has sufficient funds to pay for the debt service and file a resolution with the County Clerk that there is no need of a tax levy to pay debt service. This is called tax abatement and this resolution authorizes the abatement.

7.15 <u>10-0150</u>

Tax Abatement Resolution for the 2001 General Obligation Bonds.

7.17 <u>10-0152</u>

Tax Abatement Resolution for Special Service Area # 10 tax levy.

- Special service areas are created to allow improvements to be made and debt to be issued to pay for these improvements. The debt service is then paid for by a special tax levy.
- Each year a separate tax is levied on the properties within the designated area to pay the debt service issued to pay for the improvements.
- In the case of the SSA #10 there were monies received from the sale of the bonds that were not used. These funds then can be used to help pay for that debt. Each year part of those funds is used to lower the tax levy.
- This resolution authorizes the taxes to be abated.

7.18 10-0142

Resolution authorizing a 2009 emergency appropriation for the amount of \$2,000,000 in Fund 510, Health, Life and Dental, to be offset by balances remaining in the fund.

- Resolution authorizing a 2009 emergency appropriation in the Health Life Dental Fund for \$2,000,000.
- There is sufficient fund balance available to allow this appropriation.
- Unanticipated high claims in 2009 have depleted the original budgeted amounts.
- The county is required to accrue all applicable expenses back to 2009.

7.20 10-0119

Resolution authorizing a joint purchasing agreement to participate in a joint aerial imagery project to be coordinated by the County of Cook, in an amount not to exceed \$100,346.64.

- The counties of Cook and Lake are part of a collaborative effort to jointly obtain digital aerial orthoimagery in FY 2010.
- The information obtained will provide consistent contemporaneous digital aerial coverage for Northeast Illinois that will support several regional applications including homeland security, emergency services, environmental planning and others consistent with Lake County's GIS program and will facilitate greater cooperation among the governments of Northeast Illinois.
- Lake County's portion of the joint contract will be an amount of not to exceed \$100,346.64.

7.21 10-0133

Resolution authorizing the Purchasing Agent to enter into a contract with Lafayette Group, Vienna VA for Consulting Services for a Tactical Interoperable Communications Plan (TICP) for Lake County.

- Lake County has been awarded federal Homeland Security funding by the Illinois
 Emergency Management Agency and the Illinois Terrorism Task Force, through the
 Federal Emergency Management Agency's Interoperable Emergency Communications
 Grant Program (IECGP) to improve the current status of interoperable communications in
 the area.
- There is a need for consulting services to develop and facilitate the implementation of a unified comprehensive Tactical Interoperable Communications Plan (TICP)
- Request for Proposals were extended to (9) nine proposers and (5) five proposals were received.
- An evaluation committee with representation from the Lake County Emergency
 Management Agency, Lake County Radio department, Lake County Sheriff's Office and
 the Lake County Interoperable Communications Council reviewed, evaluated and ranked
 all proposals.
- The evaluation committee determined that the proposal submitted by Lafayette Group, Vienna VA, IL in the amount of \$70,000 is the most favorable proposal.
- The cost will be charged to account number 101-1101040-79940-000-000-000-11400.

7.22 10-0116

Resolution authorizing a contract with Pro-Bel Enterprises, LTD, Ajax, Ontario, Canada for the design and build of a Roof Anchor System for the Lake County Administration Building and other campus buildings in the amount of \$459,520.

- Lake County desires to enter into a contract with Pro-Bel Enterprises Ltd, Ajax Ontario, Canada for the design and build of a Roof Anchor System for the Lake County Administration Building and other campus buildings.
- A Roof Anchor System is needed for external building maintenance and window washing, and is required by the Occupation Health and Safety Administration (OSHA).
- Invitations for bids were extended to fourteen (14) vendors and sealed bids were received on October 21, 2009 from three (3) vendors ranging from \$968,100 to \$1,208,225.
- The bid specification invited bidders to offer substitutions that would reduce the amount bid.
- Pro-Bel Enterprises, the lowest responsive and responsible bidder submitted substitutions and pre-design documentation resulting in a total bid reduction of \$508,580.
- The substitutions were reviewed and accepted by Facilities Management staff and by HDR Architecture, the Consultant Engineer for the project.
- The contract will cost \$459,520. charged to 101-1103285-82020-000-000-000-11193.

7.23 <u>10-0143</u>

Committee Action authorizing the Circuit Court to create a career path for an existing position, Senior Judicial Research Analyst (Grade 14).

- There is a need for the Courts to develop a career path for an existing position that will
 research and recommend process improvements to remain current with evidence-based
 practices in probation and detention services.
- This position will provide training for internal staff regarding existing and newly acquired

processes.

7.24 10-0147

Resolution establishing a policy to share with Lake County municipalities authority to issue Recovery Zone Bonds for governmental construction related purposes.

- Lake County received authority to issue \$39 million of Recovery Zone Bonds under the Federal American Recovery and Reinvestment Act.
- Borrowing under this program provides payment from the US Treasury of 45% of interest payments, which results in favorable interest rates.
- Lake County has the authority to share this capacity with other governments within the County.
- Lake County desires to make half of this allocation available to Lake County municipalities.
- Lake County will manage a program that will allow individual municipalities to request up to \$3 million of capacity for municipal projects.
- Capacity will be allocated based on a first come first funded basis with a lottery to determine distribution if needed.
- This capacity will be made available for construction related costs and for projects for which bonds will be sold by 12/31/2010.
