



- Developing approved Courses for CEU (Water/Wastewater).



## **Budget - FY'22**



- Operation = \$40M
- Personnel Cost = \$8M
- Debt Service = \$6M
- Capital = \$18M(5-yr CIP) = >\$89M(10-yr CIP) = >\$160M

Preservation = 79%
Modernization = 18%
Expansion = 3%







