- 7.1 13-0234

Joint resolution authorizing emergency appropriations for FY 2013 in various funds for certain projects, items and activities, which were budgeted in the prior year and not completed.

- This resolution authorizes the carry-over, or re-authorization, of certain FY 2012 activities.
- These activities were not included in the FY 2013 budget while the carry-over list and associated budget amounts were determined; to include them would have hindered the proper scrutiny of the new FY 2013 budget.
- Without this action, these projects and/or items will not have the budget authority required.

Law & Judicial

7.2 <u>12-1167</u>

Joint resolution authorizing a contract for the installation, equipment and annual maintenance for a new 9-1-1 phone system, with Motorola Solutions, Inc., Schaumburg, IL in the amount of \$630,461.

• Lake County Emergency Telephone System Board (ETSB) currently has four Public Service Answering Points (PSAP) that act as separate systems and require a manual

- telephone transfer between systems to operate the response to 9-1-1 calls.
- The phone system utilized by the PSAPs was originally purchased in 1992. Several
 software upgrades have been implemented; however, with the significant change in
 phone system technology the current system is no longer meeting the needs of the
 users
- A Request for Proposal (RFP) was issued for a turnkey system that provided an
 integrated approach for all PSAPs in conjunction with the National Emergency Number
 Association Next Generation 9-1-1's (NENA NG 9-1-1) initiative aimed at updating the 9
 -1-1 service infrastructure in the United States and Canada to improve public
 emergency communications services in a wireless mobile society.
- This new 911 phone system is capable of accepting all calls for emergency services no
 matter the network of origin, provides enhanced call taker capability, allows for remote
 diagnostics, enables networking between PSAPs to allow backup support during
 periods of high call volume, and the system architecture can accept more call types.
- The RFP was sent to 24 vendors and proposals were received from six firms.
- A selection committee comprised of staff from the ETSB Technology Committee and Purchasing Division recommend the services of Motorola Solutions, Inc. as the firm who best meets the needs of the County based on the RFP evaluation criteria. The ETSB approved this purchase on October 2, 2012.
- The contract includes purchase and installation of software, hardware, annual
 maintenance, training, a security and disaster recovery plan, and a three year warranty
 at a contract amount of \$630,461 with an estimated annual cost of \$56,369 for
 maintenance support and software upgrades for years two and three.

7.3 13-0259

Joint resolution authorizing an emergency appropriation with offsetting revenue in the amount of \$92,787 to implement Adult Redeploy Illinois programming for the Nineteenth Judicial Circuit.

- The Adult Redeploy Illinois Oversight Board recently announced that the Nineteenth Judicial Circuit was awarded \$92,787 in Adult Redeploy Illinois supplemental funding for the grant period of February 1, 2013 through September 30, 2013.
- A total of \$18,000 will be used for EPICS (Effective Practices in Community Supervision) training and \$74,787 will be used for a 30-day residential treatment program for 12 high risk offenders at Gateway.
- This resolution authorizes an emergency appropriation of \$92,787 and the execution of a program agreement to accept the grant funding. The grant does not require a match.

7.4 13-0255

Joint resolution for the purchase of consulting services with URL Integration, Colorado Springs, CO to develop and implement data driven electronic filing functionality for six (6) civil case types including public access for the Circuit Court Clerk's Civil E-Filing application in an amount not-to-exceed \$1,041,200.

• The Circuit Court Clerk had a contract approved in August of 2010 to develop and implement an electronic filing system for court records. The requirements analysis and the platform for electronic filing (e-filing) was developed along with the first case type. In the midst of this implementation process, the Supreme Court of Illinois decided to developed statewide rules for e-filing; and at that time, put all e-filing projects on hold

including Lake County's.

- The Supreme Court has now issued its rules relating to public access to court records as well as e-filing for civil cases; therefore, Lake County can now proceed in implementing an electronic filing.
- As the initial contract was awarded and significant work was completed toward implementation of e-filing, the Circuit Clerk has a bid-exempt requirement for the purchase of consulting services from URL Integration to develop and implement electronic civil filing (e-filing) for the remaining civil case types.
- The Executive Justice Council reviewed the e-filing implementation plan and approved it at their meeting on February 19, 2013.
- The civil e-filing system will utilize web application software tools to provide a secure interface for registered individuals to pay and file instantaneously with the Circuit Court Clerk's office.
- Lake County has a long standing and successful relationship with URL Integration who
 has provided professional services for the integration of justice agencies.
- The Purchasing Agent convened an ad hoc group that approved bid exemption on the basis of the long standing, successful relationship. The knowledge gained through this relationship adds value integral to the services provided.
- This project is a budgeted project with funds coming from a special revenue fund known as the Document Storage Fund. The contract will cost the Circuit Court Clerk an amount not to exceed \$1,041,200.

Health & Community Services

7.5 13-0253

Joint resolution approving the 2013 Annual Action Plan allowing Lake County to become eligible for grant funding from the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD).

- In December, four Application Review Committees (ARC) met to review applications and make recommendations for funding.
- At the December 14, 2012 CDC Executive Committee meeting, the recommendations from each ARC were endorsed and codified into the draft 2013 Annual Action Plan.
- In January 2013, the CDC approved the draft plan and commenced the required public hearing.
- Comments have been solicited for 30 days and must now be reviewed by the Executive Committee, as well as the full CDC.
- The HUD deadline for submission of the plan is March 15, 2013.
- Due to the unique scheduling of committee meetings in advance of the March Board meeting, and in order to meet HUD's deadline, it is necessary for the plan to be reviewed by the Health & Community Services (HCS) and Financial & Administrative (F&A) Committees prior to the CDC meeting.

7.6 13-0170

Joint resolution accepting two Illinois Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity (DCEO) WIA Rapid Response Grants and authorizing an emergency appropriation totaling \$165,399.

The County is in receipt of two DCEO WIA Rapid Response Grants.

- The first grant of \$76,208 includes funding for staff costs related to case management services to unemployed individuals certified as eligible under the Trade Act (workers affected through fifteen plant closings or lay-offs) for the program period July 1, 2012 to June 30, 2014.
- The second grant of \$89,191 includes funding to support the services of the veterans who completed an eleven week work experience program for the program period July 1, 2012 to June 30, 2013.

7.7 13-0247

Joint resolution authorizing a contract with Berger Excavating Contractors, Inc. in the amount of \$2,564,407 for the construction of a second force main at the Portwine Lift Station.

- As part of the County's long-term infrastructure improvements program the Portwine Lift Station requires construction of a second parallel force main to service the Southeast Lake County area.
- This project will include installation of 10,500 feet of 16-inch diameter force main and a new valve/metering vault at the lift station.
- The County published a request for bids and received five bids ranging from \$2,564,407 to \$4,202,238.
- Award of this contract is recommended to the lowest responsive, responsible bidder, Berger Excavating Contractors, Inc., Wauconda, Illinois in the amount of \$2,564,407.
- This resolution authorizes Purchasing Agent to execute a contract with Berger Excavating Contractors, Inc. in the amount of \$2,564,407 for this project.

7.8 13-0277

Joint resolution authorizing emergency appropriations in FY 2013 Lake County Division of Transportation (LCDOT) capital funds for projects previously approved and for additional revenue.

- FY 2013 LCDOT Capital Funds: Emergency Appropriation.
- This resolution authorizes emergency appropriations in the FY 2013 LCDOT capital funds budget for previously approved projects and additional revenue.
- These projects and revenue were not included in the FY 2013 budget.
- Without this action, these projects and revenue will not have the budget authority required.

7.9 13-0254

Joint resolution authorizing the execution of an Illinois Environmental Protection Agency (IEPA) standard formal Highway Authority Agreement, and a Lake County Supplemental Highway Authority Agreement, between A-Tire County Service and Lake County, for a "No Further Remediation" (NFR) letter for its property at 363 North Cedar Lake Road, Round Lake, Illinois, which is necessary for the redevelopment of said

property.

- 363 North Cedar Lake Road, Round Lake: Highway Authority Agreements with A-Tire County Service.
- A-Tire County Service owns property situated at 363 North Cedar Lake Road, Round Lake, Illinois, which has, or had, leaking underground storage tanks impacting the right-of-way of Cedar Lake Road, North of Illinois Route 134.
- A-Tire County Service is requesting a NFR letter from the IEPA relative to this property.
- As a condition of granting said NFR letter, the IEPA requires property owners to enter into standard formal Highway Authority Agreements stating rights and obligations relative to contaminants that may have migrated into nearby highway rights-of-way.
- Lake County has determined that a Supplemental Highway Authority Agreement is also necessary.
- This resolution authorizes the execution of both agreements with A-Tire County Service.

7.10 13-0256

Joint resolution appropriating \$1,200,000 of Motor Fuel Tax funds for ice control salt materials needed for the 2013-2014 winter season, and designated as Section 14-00000-00-GM.

- 2013-2014 Winter Season Ice Control Salt: Appropriation.
- The Lake County Division of Transportation (LCDOT) annually appropriates funds for the procurement of ice control salt.
- LCDOT's contract for salt for the 2012-2013 winter season, which was provided by the State of Illinois, Department of Central Management Services, will be extended for the winter season of 2013-2014.
- This resolution appropriates \$1,200,000 of Motor Fuel Tax funds for this purchase.

7.11 13-0257

Joint resolution appropriating \$170,000 of Motor Fuel Tax funds for concrete pavement patching, where necessary, on various County highways and designated as Section 13-00000-10-GM.

- 2013 Concrete Pavement Patching: Appropriation.
- Each year, the County undertakes patching of its concrete pavements to preserve surface quality, including repairing damaged manholes, catch basins, curbs, and gutters.
- This patching and repair is done on isolated sections of pavements that are not listed in the Five-Year Program for resurfacings/rehabilitation/reconstruction, but identified by the Pavement Management System as needing repair.
- Before a letting can be held, an appropriation of \$170,000 of Motor Fuel Tax funds is necessary.

7.12 13-0270

Joint resolution appropriating \$505,000 of Matching Tax funds and \$120,000 of Motor Fuel Tax funds for annual bituminous maintenance of various roads and bike paths on the County highway system, and designated as Section 13-00000-13-GM.

- <u>2013 Bituminous Maintenance: Appropriation.</u>
- Each year, the County undertakes maintenance of its bituminous and concrete

pavements, bituminous shoulders, and bike path pavement to preserve the surface quality.

• Before a project letting can be held, an appropriation of \$505,000 of Matching Tax funds and \$120,000 of Motor Fuel Tax funds is necessary.

7.13 13-0269

Joint resolution authorizing a contract to provide crack sealing of asphalt and concrete pavement, where necessary, on various County highways to Behm Pavement Maintenance, Crystal Lake, Illinois, in the amount of \$38,427.05, and designated as Section 13-0000-04-GM.

- 2013 Crack Sealing: Contract Award.
- Each year, crack sealing is done to County highways that have recently been resurfaced.
- A total of three bids were received, ranging from \$38,427.05 to \$49,365.03, and the lowest responsible bidder is Behm Pavement Maintenance, Crystal Lake, Illinois in the amount of \$38,427.05.

7.14 <u>13-0268</u>

Joint resolution authorizing the execution of an agreement with the Illinois Department of Transportation (IDOT) for \$236,700 of Truck Access Route Program (TARP) funds for the Peterson Road improvement, from Illinois Route 83 to US Route 45, and designated as Section 07-00098-17-WR.

- Peterson Road, from Illinois Route 83 to US Route 45: IDOT Agreement.
- Peterson Road, from Illinois Route 83 to US Route 45, is to be improved by widening and reconstruction.
- IDOT has awarded \$236,700 of TARP funds to offset cost of upgrading this highway to accommodate 80,000 pound trucks.
- This resolution authorizes an agreement with IDOT for use of those funds for this improvement.

7.15 <u>13-0282</u>

Joint resolution appropriating \$9,240,000 of 1/4% Sales Tax for Transportation and Public Safety funds, \$3,720,000 of Matching Tax funds, \$3,000,000 of County Bridge Tax funds and \$240,000 of Motor Fuel Tax funds for the construction improvement of Peterson Road from Illinois Route 83 to Franklin Boulevard, and designated as Section 07-00098-17-WR.

- Peterson Road from Illinois Route 83 to Franklin Boulevard: Construction Appropriation.
- Peterson Road from Illinois Route 83 to Franklin Boulevard will be improved from a
 two-lane roadway to a four-lane divided roadway with concrete pavement, landscaped
 median, the installation of new traffic signals, the signal interconnection with Lake
 County PASSAGE, and a bike path on the north side.
- This improvement is included in the 2013 Program.
- Before a project letting can be held, an appropriation of \$9,240,000 of ¼% Sales Tax for Transportation and Public Safety funds, \$3,720,000 of Matching Tax funds, \$3,000,000 of County Bridge Tax funds and \$240,000 of Motor Fuel Tax funds is

necessary.

7.16 13-0281

Joint resolution authorizing the execution of an agreement with the Village of Lake Villa for the jurisdictional transfer of Old Petite Lake Road from Lake County to the Village, and the relocation of a watermain along Cedar Lake Road at Monaville Road designated as Section 06-00153-07-CH.

- Old Petite Lake Road and Cedar Lake Road at Monaville Road: Village of Lake Villa Agreement.
- Lake County will transfer the jurisdiction of Old Petite Lake Road to the Village of Lake Villa, including a newly constructed bike path.
- Cedar Lake Road at Monaville Road will be improved by construction of a single lane modern roundabout, lighting and non-motorized travel accommodations.
- The Village of Lake Villa's municipal watermain lies within the limits of the County improvement of Cedar Lake Road at Monaville Road.
- Lake County will relocate the Village's watermain at no cost to the Village.
- The Village Board of Lake Villa approved this agreement on February 13, 2013.
- This resolution authorizes the execution of an intergovernmental agreement with the Village of Lake Villa.

7.17 <u>13-0283</u>

Joint resolution authorizing the execution of an amendment to the agreement with Commonwealth Edison (ComEd) for the relocation of transmission facilities located within the ComEd right-of-way and the CNRR (Canadian National Railroad) right-of-way for the Rollins Road at Illinois Route 83/CNRR intersection/grade separation improvement, appropriating a supplemental \$1,000,000 of ½% Sales Tax for Transportation and Public Safety funds, and designated as Section 08-00080-56-BR.

- Rollins Road at Illinois Route 83/CNRR ComEd Agreement Amendment and Supplemental Appropriation.
- The intersection improvement of Rollins Road at Illinois Route 83/CNRR is included in the County's 2012-2017 Highway Improvement Program.
- At the July 20, 2012 County Board meeting, an agreement with ComEd was approved for relocating transmission facilities and \$3,625,000 of ½% Sales Tax for Transportation and Public Safety funds was appropriated based on an estimated cost of \$3,080,732.
- ComEd has completed detail engineering, the previous letter agreement was based on preliminary engineering, and the new estimated cost is \$4,525,905.
- This is for additional work on the ComEd transmission mains that run parallel with Illinois Route 83 in the railroad right-of-way because a longer route for the temporary power lines was required.
- This resolution authorizes the execution of an amendment to the agreement with ComEd that provides for the relocation of their facilities, and appropriates a supplemental \$1,000,000 of 1/4% Sales Tax for Transportation and Public Safety funds for these utility relocations.

7.18 13-0275

Joint resolution appropriating \$43,530,000 of ½% Sales Tax for Transportation and Public Safety funds, and \$295,000 of 2010A General Obligation (GO) bond funds for the intersection improvement of Rollins Road at Illinois Route 83, Rollins Road Gateway Improvement, and designated as Section 08-00080-56-BR.

- Rollins Road Gateway Improvement; Construction Appropriation.
- This improvement includes the construction of a grade separation of Rollins Road under the Canadian National Railroad (CNRR), the reconstruction of the intersection of Rollins Road and Illinois Route 83, and the reconstruction and relocation of Rollins Road and Hainesville Road to provide increased traffic capacities.
- FY 2014 Illinois Commerce Commission (ICC) Grade Crossing Protection funding in the amount of \$10,876,264 has been identified for the construction of this project.
- Before a project letting can be held, an appropriation of \$43,530,000 of ½% Sales Tax for Transportation and Public Safety funds, and \$295,000 of 2010A GO bond funds is necessary.

7.19 13-0276

Joint resolution authorizing an agreement with Alfred Benesch & Company, Chicago, Illinois, for the provision of Phase III construction engineering services, at the intersection of Rollins Road at Illinois Route 83, for the proposed Rollins Road Gateway improvement for a maximum cost of services described as \$3,713,945, appropriating \$4,460,000 of ½% Sales Tax for Transportation and Public Safety funds for these engineering services, and designated as Section 08-00080-56-BR.

- Rollins Road Gateway Improvement; Phase III: Consultant Agreement and Appropriation.
- The improvement of the intersection of Rollins Road at Illinois Route 83, and the grade separation of Rollins Road under the Canadian National Railroad (CNRR) is a chosen project for the transportation challenge bond program.
- A consultant will be utilized to complete Phase III construction engineering services.
- The selected and recommended firm is Alfred Benesch & Company, Chicago, Illinois, for a maximum cost of services described as \$3,713,945.
- This resolution appropriates \$4,460,000 of ½% Sales Tax for Transportation and Public Safety funds.

Joint resolution adopting an ordinance requesting the conveyance of a parcel of land from the Lake County Forest Preserve District (LCFPD) to Lake County, relating to the Lindenhurst Park District's Grass Lake Road Tunnel, and designated as Section 09-00075-15-BT.

- Grass Lake Road Tunnel Land Transfer Ordinance, Lake County Forest Preserve
 District.
- The Lindenhurst Park District will be constructing a tunnel under Grass Lake Road within Lake County's right-of-way.
- A land conveyance from LCFPD is necessary to extend the right-of-way to accommodate the tunnel and meet Lake County's specifications.
- An ordinance is required to request conveyance of parcels of land from the LCFPD to

Lake County.

Joint resolution authorizing a contract for the intersection improvement of Fairfield Road and Illinois Route 176, Fairfield/176 intersection improvement, to Berger Excavating, Wauconda, Illinois, in the amount of \$11,839,495.86, and designated as Section 12-00113-17-CH.

- Fairfield/176 Junction Improvement; Contract Award.
- This improvement includes the reconstruction and widening of Fairfield Road at Illinois
 Route 176, from one lane to two through lanes in each direction, turn lanes, the
 installation of new traffic signals, and the signal interconnection with Lake County
 PASSAGE.
- A total of 5 bids were received, ranging from \$11,839,495.86 to \$15,449,544.62, and the lowest responsible bidder is Berger Excavating, Wauconda, Illinois, with a contract amount of \$11,839,495.86.

7.22 <u>13-0272</u>

Joint resolution appropriating \$3,375,000 of County Bridge Tax funds for the construction improvement of Miller Road, from Glen Circle Drive to Biltmore Drive, and designated as Section 08-00118-09-BR.

- Miller Road Bridge: Construction Appropriation.
- Miller Road, from Glen Circle Drive to Biltmore Drive, will be elevated by the placement of a dry-land bridge with 3-spans to alleviate road flooding.
- This improvement is included in the 2013 Program.
- Before a project letting can be held, an appropriation of \$3,375,000 of County Bridge Tax funds is necessary.

7.23 13-0287

Resolution authorizing a two year agreement, with renewal options, with Johnson Controls, Inc, Arlington Heights, IL, for software and maintenance of the building automation systems for the Johnson Control boilers, chillers and air handler units of various County facilities in the annual amount of \$61,194.

- To meet County goals of energy and operational efficiencies, the County utilizes a BACnet building automation system to monitor the functionality of the equipment.
- The hardware and software maintenance agreements from the original installation of the boilers, chillers, and air handler units at the various County facilities has expired.
- To maintain the current level of service for the equipment there is a need for ongoing extended warranty of hardware and software maintenance for the building automation systems.
- Johnson Controls, Inc., Arlington Heights, IL is the manufacturer of the system and the only source that can perform the maintenance service.
- The Purchasing Agent consulted with an ad hoc review group and determined that this

purchase is exempt from bidding on the basis of sole source.

This service agreement will cost an annual amount of \$61,194.

7.24 13-0289

Resolution authorizing a two year agreement with renewal options with SimplexGrinnell, Addison, IL, for fire alarm service and maintenance of various County facilities in the annual amount of \$64.169.

- SimplexGrinnell fire alarm monitoring systems have been installed at the following facilities: Winchester House, 911 Center, Juvenile Detention Facility, Probation Office, Lake County Jail and Work Release Tower.
- The hardware and software maintenance agreements from the original installation of the equipment at the various locations has expired.
- To maintain the current level of service for the equipment there is a need for ongoing annual testing and an extended warranty of hardware and software maintenance for the fire alarm system.
- SimplexGrinnell, Addison, IL is the manufacturer of the system and the only source that can perform the maintenance service.
- The Purchasing Agent consulted with an ad hoc review group and determined that this purchase is exempt from bidding on the basis of sole source.
- This service agreement will cost an annual amount of \$64,169.
