Law & Judicial

7.1 09-1369

Joint resolution authorizing the Purchasing Agent to enter into a two-year agreement with renewals with Abbott Laboratories, Inc., Abbott Park, IL for the purchase of reagents and a service contract for an Abbott AxSym Chemistry Analyzer for the Office of the Lake County Coroner in the estimated annual amount of \$33,000.

- Lake County has used Abbott Laboratories drug detection chemistry analyzer equipment since 2002.
- There is a need in the Office of the Lake County Coroner to purchase reagents and a service contract to support the equipment.
- Abbott Laboratories Inc., Abbott Park, IL is the equipment manufacturer and the only source to purchase reagents and a service contract.
- The Purchasing Agent consulted with an ad hoc review group and determined that this purchase is exempt from bidding on the basis of sole source.
- This purchase will cost an estimated annual amount of \$33,000 charging account 101-3500010-65020-000-000-000-00000.

7.2 <u>09-1370</u>

Joint resolution authorizing a contract with Corporate Express Business Interiors, A Staples Company, Woodridge, IL for the installation of full height furniture wall systems in remodeled Public Defender's Offices located at 15 S. County St., Waukegan IL, in the amount of \$132,523.08 and to award a one year contract with renewal options for future wall system projects as required.

- Lake County extended an Invitation to Bid to 6 potential contractors and sealed bids were received from 4 contractors and opened at 2:00 p.m., on March 24, 2009.
- Corporate Express Business Interiors, was the low, responsive, and responsible bidder in the amount of \$132,523.08. Other bids submitted ranged in the amounts of \$157,161.75 to \$228,917.

- Corporate Express Business Interiors bid included a discount off the "September 2008
 Trendway Architectural Walls" price list for pricing of future unspecified projects for Lake
 County. This discount includes all materials, labor, design services, project management
 and installation of the full height furniture wall systems.
- This contract will be charged to account 101-1103265-82020-000-000-000-00000.

7.3 09-1406

Joint resolution ratifying an Emergency Procurement with Oracle Corporation, Redwood Shores, CA for annual software maintenance for Service Oriented Architecture Infrastructure (SOA) software for Lake County in the amount of \$53,293.06.

- On June 13, 2006 the County Board approved the purchase of a competitively solicited license for the Service Oriented Architecture Infrastructure (SOA) software to support the Integrated Justice Project in the amount of \$98,700 with BEA Systems, Chicago, IL.
- On January 3, 2007 the Law and Judicial and Financial and Administrative Committees approved a contract modification for the purchase of an additional license for testing and development in the amount of \$203,110.
- In early 2009 Oracle Corporation, Redwood Shores, CA purchased BEA Systems.
- Oracle Corporation is the only source that can provide the software maintenance.
- There was a need to act immediately to acquire the annual renewal of the software maintenance for both licenses in order to minimize disruption to government services.
- The Purchasing Agent issued a purchase order and consulted with an ad hoc review group and confirmed that this purchase is exempt from bidding on the basis of sole source.
- This service costs \$53,293.06 for a one (1) year period, charged to account #101-1300020-71230-000-000-000-13314.

7.4 <u>09-1342</u>

Joint resolution authorizing the execution of an intergovernmental agreement with the Village of Third Lake for the purpose of providing Sheriff's Marine Patrol Services.

- The Village has agreed to continue the Marine Patrol Services contract for one more year during the months of May through October on the waterways of Third Lake.
- The Contract continues an hourly rate of \$78 for the service of two Sheriff's Marine Patrol Unit officers and one boat to be scheduled between the hours of 8:00AM to 8:00PM.
- The rates will remain the same as last year.

7.5 09-1343

Joint resolution authorizing the execution of an intergovernmental agreement with the Wildwood Park District for the purpose of providing Sheriff's Marine Patrol Services to the Park District.

- The Park District has agreed to continue the Marine Patrol Services contract for one more year during the months of May through September on the waterways of Gages Lake.
- The contract continues an hourly rate of \$78 for the service of two Sheriff's Marine Patrol
 Unit officers and one boat to be scheduled on weekday and weekend afternoons and
 evenings, according to the Park District's needs.
- The rates will remain the same as last year.

7.6 09-1344

Joint resolution authorizing the execution of an intergovernmental agreement with the Fox Waterway Agency for the purpose of providing Sheriff's Marine Patrol Services for the Agency.

- The Agency has agreed to continue the Marine Patrol Services contract for one more year during the months of May through September on the waterways of Chain O'Lakes.
- The contract has a base amount of \$45,150 in 2009, but authorizes the Sheriff's Office and County Administrator's Office to negotiate up to a 5% increase over the current amount.
- Based on the current rate, the entity is subject to the following fee schedule:
 - A) Payment of \$15,050 upon the execution of this Agreement;
 - B) Payment of \$15,050 on or before July 30, 2009;
 - C) Payment of \$15,050 on or before September 30, 2009.
- The Agency shall provide a commercial general liability coverage policy in the amount of \$1,000,000 prior to the commencement of this agreement.

7.7 09-1368

Joint resolution establishing rates for the Lake County Sheriff Deputies working off-duty; "Special Detail", for private business, individuals and government units.

- The hourly rate for special detail patrol shall be \$60 per hour until December 1, 2009.
- The rate paid to the Deputy personnel will change from time and a half to a fixed rate of \$38 per hour.
- The rate for command working a command required detail will change from time and a half to a fixed rate of \$41.80 per hour. Command posts are only contractually required on 4% of all special details worked.
- These rates were reviewed by staff from the Sheriff's Office, the County Administrator's Office and Finance and Administrative Services.
- These rates will be reviewed annually to assure costs are being recovered.

7.8 09-1350

Joint resolution authorizing and supporting the establishment of a Lake County Sexual Assault Coordinating Council.

- A county-wide council coordinating the investigation, prosecution and management of sexual assault cases that will benefit the entire County.
- The proposed Council will be established by State's Attorney Michael Waller, Circuit
 Judge Victoria Rosetti, Gurnee Police Chief Robert Jones, Superintendent of Regional
 Office of Education Roycealee Wood, and Zacharias Center Executive Director Torrie
 Flink.
- The proposed Council's bylaws, which establish the Council's membership and operating guidelines, are attached for review and approval.

7.9 09-1359

Joint resolution authorizing the application for a Justice and Mental Health Collaboration grant from the US Department of Justice (USDOJ) Office of Justice Programs (OJP) Bureau of Justice Assistance (BJA) on behalf of the Mental Health Court program for the purpose of providing financial assistance for a part time Assistant State's Attorney and

Assistant Public Defender and applicable fringe benefits each to the State's Attorney's Office and the Public Defender's Office, and associated equipment.

- The Mental Health Court (MHC), a facet of the Therapeutic and Intensive Monitoring (TIM) Court program, is eligible for federal funds under an expansion grant.
- The State's Attorney's Office is applying for federal funds from the USDOJ "Justice and Mental Health Collaboration" Grant, administered through the USDOJ Office of Justice Programs (OJP) Bureau of Justice Assistance (BJA).
- The grant period is 24 months, and awards of up to \$200,000 in federal funds will be made per program. Program total maximum, after 20% (up to \$50,000) match, is \$250,000. The match will be provided as "in-kind" and not "cash", through items that are already budgeted for Mental Health Court operations through the various departments that participate in the Court.
- Program Purpose Areas include hiring a part time Assistant State's Attorney in the State's Attorney's Office for Mental Health Court operations, hiring a part time Assistant Public Defender in the Public Defender's Office for Mental Health Court operations and thereby increasing Mental Health Court's capacity to serve eligible offenders
- Goals include: treating more eligible mentally ill offenders through the MHC, reducing recidivism among MHC program participants, and increasing the number of jail beds available for violent and serious criminal offenders.

Health & Community Services

7.10 09-1416

Joint resolution adopting the 2009 Winchester House Market Study including the associated financial and capital study.

- The County Board commissioned 3 prior studies to review the management, financial information, and market share of Winchester House in senior care.
- The third study, the 2007 Transition Plan, focused on identifying the primary and secondary market areas, projected population needing skilled nursing care, revenue and expenses, and resident occupancy. The conclusion was that the primary and secondary service areas for Winchester House can support a new skilled nursing facility of approximately 175 beds.
- On September 11, 2007 the County Board adopted a resolution which established the
 Winchester House Operating Policies that set parameters for resident payer mix, directs
 facility operation within revenues and the property tax levy, requires that capital bonds for
 a new skilled nursing facility be retired using revenues and the property tax levy, and that
 the number of employees be in line with industry standards and tied directly to operational
 performance and occupancy.
- In 2009, a Market Study update was commissioned and found that the maximum capacity
 of the skilled nursing facility was 175 beds. An associated financial and capital study was
 also performed and found that a new 175 bed skilled nursing facility is financially and
 operationally feasible and would operate within projected revenues and the property tax
 levy.
- The joint resolution reaffirms the September 11, 2007 resolution, adopts the 2009 Market Study update including the associated financial and capital study findings that a 175 bed skilled nursing facility is feasible, and directs that the final number of beds be determined through the architectural design process. The joint resolution also directs the County Administrator's Office to oversee and insure that the architectural design process and the construction of a new skilled nursing facility be accomplished within the parameters and requirements of the Winchester House Operating Policies.

7.11 09-1309

Joint resolution authorizing the Purchasing Agent to enter into a contract with Plunkett Raysich Architects, LLP of Milwaukee, Wisconsin for Architectural and Engineering Services for the design of a replacement skilled nursing care facility in the amount of \$1,565,000 and approve an emergency appropriation in the amount of the contract.

- Lake County desires to enter into a contract for architectural and engineering services for the design of a replacement skilled nursing care facility.
- Statement of Interest #28188 was called for by publication. Notices were sent to 47 firms;
 responses were received from 12 firms.
- In accordance with Section 5-101 (3) of the Lake County Purchasing Ordinance and the Local Government Professional Services Selection Act, a Selection Committee evaluated all firms, then selected and interviewed 4 firms.
- Negotiations were conducted and it was determined to be in the best interest of the County to enter into a contract with Plunkett Raysich Architects, LLP of Milwaukee, Wisconsin at a reasonable compensation for the services rendered.
- The scope of services include architectural and engineering services required for the
 development of a 175 bed skilled nursing care facility to be located on the County's
 Libertyville Campus. The scope of services include programming and needs analysis in a
 format required by IDPH, complete site and building design and preparation of all required
 construction documents, interior design services, construction administration services and
 all other services ancillary to proving architect of record services for a new skilled nursing
 care facility.
- This contract will cost the County \$1,565,000 and is being funded through an emergency
 appropriation in this amount in the Capital Improvement Program. The County will be
 reimbursed for the cost of this contract by a future bond issuance.

7.12 09-1355

Joint resolution authorizing the Purchasing Agent to enter into a contract with Air Con Refrigeration & Heating, Inc, Waukegan, IL for the installation of a Boiler Heating Plant in the Belvidere Medical Building, Waukegan, IL, in the amount estimated not to exceed \$589,900.

- Lake County desires to enter into a contract to provide and install a replacement boiler heating plant in the Belvidere Medical Building.
- Invitations for Bids were extended to 12 contractors and 12 sealed bids were received and opened on March 10, 2009.
- Air Con Refrigeration & Heating, Inc., Waukegan IL is the lowest responsive and responsible bidder in the amount of \$589,900. Other bids submitted ranged in the amounts of \$598,900 to \$670,200.
- This contract will cost the county an estimated amount of \$589,900, charging to account 101-1103265-82020-000-000-011200.

7.13 <u>09-1346</u>

Joint resolution approving an emergency appropriation for the Motorola Training Grant for \$100.000 for training assistance.

- The IL Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity awarded a grant to Lake County Workforce for \$100,000.
- This grant was awarded due to the recent announcement by Motorola to lay-off 667 workers from the Libertyville facility.
- This grant will be used to provide training assistance exclusively to approximately 16 20

laid-off Motorola workers.

- At this time, the state has no additional funds available from this funding source. Once
 additional funds are available at the state level, a modification will be submitted to request
 additional dollars. Workforce Stimulus funds will also be used to provide training to
 additional Motorola workers.
- An emergency appropriation must be executed to add these funds to the Lake County Workforce Development Department. The total increase is \$100,000.

7.14 09-1348

Joint resolution approving the Summer Youth Employment Worksite Agreement.

- It is necessary to enter into Summer Youth Employment Worksite Agreement with various organizations to provide summer youth employment work positions for the Lake County 2009 Summer Youth Employment Program.
- The Worksite Agreement outlines the responsibilities of the summer worksites and the County of Lake.
- In order to execute these agreements, it is necessary to authorize the County Board Chairman or their designee to sign the agreements.

7.15 09-1376

Joint resolution approving an emergency appropriation to accept the American Reinvestment and Recovery Act (ARRA) grant and allocate the funds to Workforce Development.

- With the passage of the American Recovery and Reinvestment Act of 2009, the Illinois
 Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity has awarded Lake County funds
 under the Workforce Investment Act.
- The total funds available for Lake County are \$5,202,612 and are available for expenditure from February 17, 2009 until June 30, 2011.
- Lake County Workforce will receive \$1,104,266 in Adult funds, \$1,657,089 in laid off worker funds, and \$2,441,257 in youth funds.
- Other changes as a result of this legislation are that the youth funds can be used for a stand alone Summer Employment Program and the age requirement for youth has been expanded to 24 years.
- Thus, an emergency appropriation needs to be approved to allocate these funds into the Workforce Department budget and authorize acceptance of this grant.

7.16 <u>09-1388</u>

Joint resolution entering into an Incumbent Worker Training Grant with Siemens Building Technologies for \$39,500.

- In response to a news release, Siemens Building Technologies expressed interest in the incumbent worker training program. Siemens Bldg Technologies resides in Buffalo Grove with corporate headquarters located in New York City. Worldwide, Siemens and its subsidiaries employ 428,000 people in 190 countries; in the U.S. 69,000 employees in all 50 states and in Puerto Rico; the Illinois facility employs 1,000 employees. The mission is optimized facility performance and solutions that encompass comfort, life style, security, energy efficiency, critical manufacturing environments and building operations
- After consultation with Siemens Bldg Technologies, a training curriculum was developed to train 263 full time employees for a total of 2,104 training hours in Lean Manufacturing which in turn will allow the company to remain competitive in manufacturing

and long-term job retention; create a Lean Enterprise/Environment and Operation and further help the company to move the manufacturing workforce to Self-Directed Work Teams. The occupations of employees to be trained are: Production Operators, Material Handlers, QA Inspectors, Procurement Analysts, Buyers and Customer Service Representatives.

• The state policy requires that an employer with 100 or more employees provide 50% of the cost of the training. The policy also states that employee wages & fringes can be used to off-set the employer match without employer having to pay additional funds out of pocket. The total cost of training is \$39,500. Lake County Workforce Development will reimburse \$39,500 and the company will provide employee hourly wages of an additional \$19,750 to show for their portion of the match. Cost per employee is \$150.19 for 8 hours of training for each employee.

Revenue, Records & Legislation

7.17 09-1347

Joint resolution designating the Cornerstone National Bank & Trust Company as an additional depository in which the funds and monies in the custody of Robert Skidmore, as County Treasurer and as Ex-Officio County Collector, may be deposited.

 Cornerstone National Bank & Trust Company would like their Lake Zurich branch to start collecting property tax payments upon approval.

Public Works & Transportation

7.18 09-1377

Joint resolution authorizing the execution of a new master agreement between Lake County and the Village of Lincolnshire regarding the cost of maintenance, construction and installation, as well as future costs associated with current and future traffic control signals under the jurisdiction of the Lake County Division of Transportation and including provisions for emergency preemption systems.

- County Signals; New Traffic Signal Master Agreement: Village of Lincolnshire
- Traffic signals were installed on County Highways within the boundaries of the Village of Lincolnshire including Emergency Vehicle Preemption Systems (EVPS) which are currently maintained by the Village of Lincolnshire.
- Lake County is revising all EVPS master agreements so that the local agency will be responsible for maintenance and future cost of the emitters and LCDOT will be responsible for maintenance and future cost for preemption systems.
- Lake County is incorporating the EVPS changes into new traffic signal master
 agreements with the communities regarding the cost of maintenance, construction and
 installation, as well as future costs associated with current and future County owned traffic
 control signals.

7.19 09-1378

Joint resolution appropriating \$1,700,000 of Motor Fuel Tax funds for the supply of ice control salt materials needed for the 2009 - 2010 winter season and designated as Section 10-0000-00-GM.

- <u>Ice Control Salt (2009 2010 Winter Season): Appropriation</u>
- The Division of Transportation annually appropriates funds for the procurement of ice

control salt.

- The contract letting for ice control salt for the winter season of 2009 2010 will be conducted by the State of Illinois during April of 2009.
- An appropriation of \$1,700,000 is made from the Motor Fuel Tax fund for this purchase.

7.20 09-1379

Joint resolution authorizing the execution of a joint agreement between the Village of Wauconda and Lake County for the installation of Lake County PASSAGE wireless communication Hub #2 on a village owned water tower situated along Gilmer Road.

- Lake County PASSAGE, Wireless Communication Hub #2: Village of Wauconda Agreement.
- Wireless communication technology has advanced enough to meet the communication needs of Lake County PASSAGE in certain limited areas, as part of the Phase II contract.
- Such an area is in various parts of central Lake County including the Village of Wauconda.
- This agreement provides for the installation of communications antennae on the Village of Wauconda water tower situated adjacent to Gilmer Road designated as Wireless Communication Hub #2.

 Appropriation
- Preliminary Plans and specifications for this improvement have been prepared.
- By prior agreement, among Lake County, the Village of Round Lake and Avon Township Road District, dated January 17, 2003, the Village of Round Lake was to acquire necessary right-of-way for this improvement to be reimbursed by Lake County.
- The Village of Round Lake has completed this right-of-way acquisition and has submitted an invoice for said acquisition.
- Before this invoice can be paid an appropriation of \$265,000 of Matching Tax funds is necessary.

Joint committee action item approving Change Order No. 1 consisting of an increase of \$399,636.76 for revisions to the design engineering services for the Peterson Road improvement from US Rte. 45 to IL Rte. 83 and designated as Section 07-00098-17-WR.

- Peterson Road from US Rte. 45 to IL Rte. 83, Design Engineering Services: LCDOT Change Order No. 1
- Change orders need to be approved by the standing committees for cumulative net increases over 10%.
- The Peterson Road project is under contract originally totaling \$541,066.39
- This Change Order No. 1 is for the design engineering services work associated with extending the project limits to include the design of the intersection of Peterson Road and IL Route 83 and to add the services of a Right-of-Way acquisition consultant.
- The added work is part of the pending change to the Lake County/Village of Grayslake Central Range Transportation agreement.
- The change to the Central Range Transportation agreement involves the county using Village funds for the interim improvement of the intersection of Peterson Road and IL Rte. 83 toward the 4-lane widening on Peterson Road.

Joint resolution authorizing the execution of a contract with Spaceco, Inc. for Phase II design engineering services for the extension of Midlothian Road from its existing northerly terminus northerly to Harris Road at a maximum cost of services described of \$157,143.31 and appropriates \$50,000 of Matching Tax funds and \$140,000 of the ½ % Sales Tax for Transportation and Public Safety and designated as Section 09-00244-03-FP.

- Midlothian Road Extension, from existing northerly terminus, northerly to Harris Road:
 Consultant Agreement and Appropriation.
- Midlothian Road has previously been extended northerly from Peterson Road in order to accommodate the Lake County fair relocation to the former Titus Farms property.
- Lake County now desires to extend Midlothian Road northerly to Harris Road.

Resolution to accept an Illinois Terrorism Task Force / US Department of Homeland Security Interoperable Emergency Communications Grant Program (IECGP) grant, authorize the emergency appropriation of up to \$132,000 for planning and training for voice interoperability, and recognize the "Lake County Interoperable Communications Task Force" as the cross-discipline, cross-jurisdiction technical governance body responsible for overseeing the Tactical Interoperable Communications Plan (TICP) for Lake County.

- The United States Department of Homeland Security (US DHS) has made funding available to local jurisdictions through its "Interoperable Emergency Communications Grant Program" (IECGP).
- In 2008, Lake County (through the Sheriff's Office) was awarded funding to improve the
 interoperability of two-way (radio) voice communications through the "Public Safety
 Interoperable Communications" (PSIC) grant program. A portion of the PSIC funds were
 originally planned to enhance planning and training for voice interoperability within Lake
 County.
- Lake County was recently notified that Lake County is one of the initial ten recipients of funding under the IECGP for the award of up to \$132,000 for the purpose of developing and implementing a comprehensive "Tactical Interoperable Communications Plan" (TICP) for Lake County and all partner jurisdictions.
- Because the IECGP funding is designated only for the development of, training about, and exercising of the TICP and related policies and procedures, the Sheriff's Office is able to reprogram some PSIC funds from planning activities to equipment purchase, and thereby obtain additional equipment (four new two-way radios) under the PSIC grant program.
- The IECGP grant will reimburse allowable costs incurred in the development of, training about, and exercising of the TICP for Lake County and all partner jurisdictions.
- As required by the grant, the Lake County Sheriff's Office and Lake County EMA have assembled stakeholders to form the "Lake County Interoperable Communications Task Force" in conjunction with the current PSIC grant program, and this group includes representation from various jurisdictions and disciplines throughout the County.
- The IECGP grant funded TICP development process must be completed by the end of June, 2010, and submission of all requests for reimbursement received by the ITTF within thirty days of that time.
