- The Illinois DCEO made over \$21,000,000 available to support for installation and/or replacement of entire Heating, Ventilation and Air Conditioning (HVAC) Systems in multi-family, low to moderate income rentals. The funding opportunity does not require local match.
- Lake County Community Development is proposing an application requesting the maximum of \$2,000,000.
- If selected, the funds would be pass through to eligible landlords/property owners with low-to-moderate (LMI) income qualified rental units located in Lake County.

Joint resolution accepting the Supporting Municipalities for Asylum Seeker Services (SMASS) funds from the Metropolitan Mayors Caucus (MMC) and authorizing an emergency appropriation in the amount of \$1,130,238 for grant administration and implementation.

- In August the County Board approved a grant submission seeking funding through MMC's SMASS program, funded through the Illinois Department of Human Services.
- Lake County was awarded \$1,130,238 in pass-through funding for the State's fiscal year 2025 (from July 1, 2024, to June 30, 2025).
- The funding will be distributed to key community providers to supplement their
 existing services to asylum seekers in Lake County, as follows: \$924,298 to Mano
 a Mano Family Resource Center and \$184,404 to North Suburban Legal Aid.
- Lake County will receive \$21,536 to administer the program.

 various field elements to manage traffic operations, snow and ice maintenance
 operations, and provide the public with accurate and real-time information to make
 informed travel decisions.
- This project is included in the Transportation Improvement Program and designated as Section 25-00000-18-GM.

8.11 24-1230

Joint resolution authorizing a contract with Meade Inc., Willowbrook, Illinois, in the amount of \$499,997 for the installation of accessible pedestrian signals and appropriating \$600,000 of ½% Sales Tax for Transportation funds.

- Work includes the removal of existing traffic signal equipment, installation of accessible pedestrian signals, maintenance of existing traffic signal installation, and other related work.
- There was a public call for bids, and a total of two bids were received, ranging from \$499,997 to \$630,317.87, and the lowest responsible bidder is Meade Inc., Willowbrook, Illinois, in the amount of \$499,997.
- This project is included in the Transportation Improvement Program with construction to begin in 2024 and designated as Section 24-00999-04-TL.

Joint resolution authorizing an agreement with HR Green, Inc., McHenry, Illinois, to provide Phase II design engineering services for a proposed shared-use path along Illinois Route 137 (Patriot Path), at a maximum cost of \$1,768,704, and appropriating \$2,123,000 of 1/4% Sales Tax for Transportation funds.

- A consulting firm will be utilized to complete these Phase II design engineering services for the remaining two path segments, including segment two, from Sage Court on the north to Illinois Route 43, and segment three, from Illinois Route 43 to US Route 41.
- Lake County selects professional engineering firms in accordance with the Local Government Professional Services Selection Act, 50 ILCS 510/1 et. seq.
- The Lake County Division of Transportation's (LCDOT) Consultant Selection Process has been approved by the Federal Highway Administration and the Illinois Department of Transportation, and the firm selected for this project was selected in accordance with this approved process.

Joint resolution authorizing a professional services agreement with Davey Resource Group, Inc., Kent, Ohio, to prepare a Lake County Urban and Community Forestry Plan in an amount not to exceed \$144,395.

- The 2023 Strategic Plan directs staff to implement the Lake County Regional Tree Initiative in Fiscal Year 2024 to lead in the effort to prevent further increases in global temperature, mitigate climate change effects, and protect and enhance our natural environment.
- As part of the Fiscal Year 2024 budget, funding was allocated to contract with a
 firm to prepare an adaptive Urban and Community Forestry Strategic Plan in
 alignment with the Chicago Region Trees Initiative Master Plan 2050 that directs
 action on making trees healthier, more abundant, more diverse, and distributed
 equitably throughout Lake County, and including any necessary policy
 recommendations and budgetary needs for the County Board regarding urban
 forestry.
- A Request for Proposal was extended to 14 vendors, sealed proposals were received from three vendors.
- Based on the criteria set forth in the Request for Proposals, the evaluation committee selected Davey Resource Group, Inc., Kent, Ohio, as the most qualified and favorable proposal for Lake County.

- Title II of the Americans with Disabilities (ADA) Act requires the removal of
 existing barriers in public places that impact the ability for individuals with
 disabilities to participate in government programs, services and activities.
- As part of the Fiscal Year 2024 budget, funding was allocated to contract with a firm to develop and implement an ADA transition plan for the County's public rights-of-way and update the existing ADA transition plan for all other facilities, programs and services, in accordance with all applicable laws and guidelines.
- A Request for Proposal was extended to 28 vendors, sealed proposals were received from six vendors.
- Based on the criteria set forth in the Request for Proposals, the evaluation committee selected Kimley-Horn of Deerfield, Illinois as the most qualified and favorable proposal for Lake County.
- The Agreement for the work includes a review of the 2016 Transition Plan prepared by ACT Services; 2018 curb ramp evaluations; ADA compliance review of policies, practices, programs, and activities; pedestrian street crossings along the public rights-of-way sidewalks; on-street accessible parking; review of current facilities data; a public outreach program and culminate in the development of an ADA Transition Plan that staff will be trained to maintain and update.

- Contract modification Number One for continued architectural and engineering services in the amount of \$446,883 was approved by the Finance and Administrative Committee on February 9, 2023.
- In accordance with Section 33.082 of the Lake County Purchasing Ordinance, this
 contract modification is germane to the original contract as signed and is in the
 best interest of Lake County, it is hereby requested that the Purchasing Agent be
 authorized to enter into Contract Modification Number Two.
- This Committee Action authorizes Contract Modification Number Two with DLR Group, Inc. not to exceed the amount of \$400,000 for additional design services, bid document preparation and construction administration for Depke Phase 2 Bridge Project, increasing the contract from \$1,140,833 to \$1,540,833.

Enterprise Information Technology

8.20 <u>24-1256</u>

Resolution authorizing a contract with CDW-G of Vernon Hills, Illinois, in the amount of \$175,749.75 for LogicMonitor implementation, licensing and support.

- LogicMonitor is a platform that will provide Enterprise IT with the ability to monitor
 all the County's IT infrastructure and applications through a single dashboard and
 use the analysis and reporting to take proactive measures to prevent downtime and
 operational impact.
- The LogicMonitor platform will allow Enterprise IT to retire multiple legacy
 monitoring systems and replace them with a single solution that covers all aspects
 of county IT systems. This platform will provide detailed analysis and reporting of
 county IT system availability, reducing downtime and operational impact with

proactive alerting and visibility across the entire IT environment.

- This contract authorizes an agreement with CDW-G for the duration of one year with options of extending up to three additional one-year periods, for an initial term cost of \$175,749.75 which includes \$20,300 for professional services to implement and \$155,449.75 for licensing and support. Subsequent annual renewals are estimated to increase five percent with each one-year renewal for a total not to exceed cost in the final term of \$179,952.52.
- In accordance with Section 33.115 of the Lake County Purchasing Ordinance, a cooperative purchasing contract with CDW-G has been identified through Omnia Partners (23-6692-02) to procure needed goods, services, construction, or professional services that have been competitively solicited and awarded.
- Omnia partners competitively procured technology products, solutions, and related services through a Request for Proposal (RFP) that allowed multiple awards to qualified vendors. Omnia Partners received 18 proposals and identified five qualified vendors, of which CDW-G was awarded a contract.

- A Digital Equity Coordinator and a Digital Equity Manager have been hired to implement the strategies contained in the Lake County Broadband and Digital Equity Action Plan using funds from the American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA).
- The NTIA has established the Digital Equity Competitive Grant Program to promote digital inclusion and equitable access to technology
- Staff intends to submit an application to apply for NTIA grant funds to further expand and support the goals of the Digital Growth Initiative.

Resolution authorizing the adoption and execution of an Intergovernmental Agreement (IGA) regarding Lake County Shared Services to LakeComm for the period of LakeComm's Transition and Startup.

- Since 2018, Lake County has provided general administrative and personnel support to Regional 9-1-1 Consolidation efforts at no or minimal cost to participating agencies.
- The establishment of a Shared Services Agreement is in the best interest of Lake County taxpayers and LakeComm during its establishment and first year(s) of operations.

- The IGA includes compensation to the County.
- The LakeComm Member Board of Directors approved the IGA on September 18, 2024.
