- John Lewis Middle School's botany and culinary arts program in Waukegan has its own greenhouse where, initially in the program, students learned how to cook their crops, and now the program has expanded to also provide healthy food for people in a community some call a food desert or food swamp.
- Students are learning that a food desert is where food stores do not have fresh produce available and lack the land to grow fresh produce.
- Health Department Executive Director Mark Pfister said, "a 'food swamp' is also a danger to people in low-income areas with fewer options."
- Pfister said, "a food swamp is an area where people eat inexpensive, processed food which can lead to poor health conditions like diabetes, heart disease or obesity."
