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To Whom it May Concern regarding Lake County Ordinance 172 Care of Larry Mackey:

Spay and Stay has some concerns and notes regarding the revised ordinance as well as the fees from LCAC.

More clarification is needed on the differences between "owner", "caretaker", and "harborer". It would be good if it was specified that anyone who has cats participating in a TNR program be exempt from any "animal atlarge" violations or fees.

Education should also include information regarding pets versus at-large animals (including feral cats). This information should require a representative of a TNR organization present in order to help promote accurate information for TNR services.

The revised list of fees offers distempers but no rabies vaccinations. This should be updated.

Municipal contract fees list disposal fees: are these regarding already deceased animals?

Duplicate fees charged to TNR organizations and caretakers: When LCAC collects an animal from a Lake County municipality, they have an agreement for charges regarding transportation (and other fees) for that municipality. When Spay and Stay members or caretakers pickup colony cats from LCAC, they are also charged a transportation fee on top of boarding and rabies fees (if animal is not up to date on vaccination). Why is a transportation fee being applied twice?

Why are we being charged boarding fees when these are stray or feral cats, living outdoors with no permanent shelter and no actual owners? Animals are often picked up the same day as well, which should not cost a boarding fee. What is the definition of a "day" that applies to such a fee? Overnight?

We are a 501(c)3 organization that is supported with funds via donations and grants. We receive no public funds. There should be a limit to what fees we as an organization (or our caretakers) pay: vaccinations and overnight boarding is acceptable; transportation is not). We offer services to the public that LCAC is unable to, and it feels like we are being punished for it.
