

RECORDER OF DEEDS



Currently, we have nearly 7.5 million documents recorded and catalogued in the Recorder's office!

First elected in 1996, Mary Ellen is the first woman in Lake County's history to serve as Lake County Recorder of Deeds.

Over the past 2 years, we have said "goodbye" to many of our longtime family members who retired!

Due to these retirements, our staff was significantly reduced.

Our overall position count has declined as we left positions vacant.

We currently have a Full Time staff of 15 plus 2 administrative positions and 1 IT position.

Additionally, we have reallocated many of our positions out of the GENERAL FUND and into the Recorder's Automation, saving money for the General Fund.

14 staff members are allocated to our Automation Fund.

FUNDS

The Recorder's Office's Budget is made up of 3 Budget Funds.

The General Fund

The General County Fund receives **\$22** of every Recorded Document Fee collected by the Recorder's Office.

FUNDS

THE GIS FUND

Proceeds from the dedicated GIS Automated Fee are used to fund improvements to the Countywide Geographic Mapping System. **\$23** of every recorded document that is collected by the Recorder's Office is given directly to the County at year's end.

The Recorder's Office's Budget is made up of 3 Budget Funds.

The Recorder's Automation Fund

Per statute, the Recorder's Automation fund may only be used by the Recorder's Office to provide for efficient and effective retrieval of recorded documents. We make every effort to use this fund for computer equipment and maintenance and STAFF, so as to save funds for the General Fund. \$15 of every recorded document is allocated to this fund.

Because our Grantor/Grantee information is more accurate than what was able to be converted into The iasWorld platform, we were called upon to transfer the data from our database.



Our office is always looking for ways to aid Lake County residents in combatting mortgage fraud and identity theft.

We offer **PROPERTY CHECK!** A FREE online, 24/7, easy to use system that alerts users when a document is recorded against them or their property.

Currently, over 8,500 people are registered users! SIGN UP TODAY!

We mail out "Quit Claim Postcards" alerting people when a QUIT CLAIM DEED has been recorded against their property. This can be a potential indication of fraud and we take great care in notifying residents!

We mailed out 3,834 Quit Claim Postcards in 2018.

Documents recorded in our Office can be a good indicator of the Housing market and Foreclosure climate in Lake County.
