Joint resolution authorizing an emergency appropriation and approving a Title IV-D Intergovernmental Agreement (IGA) between the Illinois Department of Healthcare and Family Services (IDHFS) and the Lake County State's Attorney for the continuation of the State's Attorney's Child Support Enforcement Program for the period of July 1, 2025, through June 30, 2027, for a maximum reimbursement amount of \$1,629,842 for staff wages and benefits.

Since 1985, the State's Attorney's Office has entered into an annual
 Intergovernmental Agreement with the Illinois Department of Healthcare and Family

Services to provide child support enforcement services.

- Pursuant to these annual agreements, the State's Attorney's Office is to be reimbursed for reasonable costs for providing these services, as determined by IDHFS.
- Currently, the CSE staff includes two full-time assistant state's attorneys, a .15 full-time equivalent (FTE) assistant state's attorney/supervisor, three full-time legal assistants and 2.60 FTE paralegals.
- The Child Support Enforcement division handles approximately 12,000 active cases, including those to establish paternity, to set support upon voluntary acknowledgment, to establish medical support orders and to enforce orders for payment of support.
- IDHFS has tendered a proposed two-year Contract for 2026-2027 to reimburse
 personnel costs not to exceed \$1,629,842 66 percent of which is federal funds.
 Funding for 2026 will be \$798,942 and 2027 will be \$830,900. Approximately 80
 percent of staff salary and fringe will be covered by IDHFS and the remainder will
 be covered by the State's Attorney's operating budget.

Joint resolution authorizing a contract with Peter Baker & Son Company, Lake Bluff, Illinois, in the amount of \$489,390.69 for the resurfacing of various roads in the Grant Township Road District, which will be improved under the Illinois Highway Code for a total of 1.90 miles.

- There was a public call for bids, and a total of three bids were received, ranging from \$489,390.69 to \$499,752.20, and the lowest responsible bidder is Peter Baker & Son Company, Lake Bluff, Illinois, in the amount of \$489,390.69.

Joint resolution authorizing a contract with Meade, Inc., Willowbrook, Illinois, in the amount of \$299,276.50 for upgrades to traffic signal detection systems at 11 Lake County owned traffic signal locations and appropriating \$359,000 of 1/4% Sales Tax for Transportation funds.

- Upgrades to traffic signal detection systems at 11 Lake County owned signalized intersections are needed to replace legacy systems.
- There was a public call for bids, and a total of three bids were received, ranging from \$299,276.50 to \$449,487.40, and the lowest responsible bidder is Meade, Inc., Willowbrook, Illinois, in the amount of \$299,276.50.
- This project is included in the Transportation Improvement Program with construction to begin in 2025 and designated as Section 24-00999-07-TL.

- The RTA Section 5310 grant program call for projects is underway.
- Ride Lake County was created by the Lake County Board in 2022 and is operated by Pace.

- The Section 5310 funds will be used, along with County and Pace funds, to continue coordination of the Ride Lake County countywide paratransit program.
- This resolution authorizes the County to apply for the grant, and, if approved, it will be brought back to the Lake County Board for acceptance and appropriation of the necessary local matching funds.

Joint resolution authorizing a supplemental appropriation of \$172,511 of ¼% Sales Tax for Transportation funds for improvements to the intersection of Illinois Route 131 and Kenosha Road.

- The Illinois Department of Transportation (IDOT) realigned the intersection of Illinois Route 131 at Kenosha Road with turn lanes and a new traffic signal.
- The County Board, at its meeting on February 14, 2017, approved an agreement with IDOT and appropriated \$1,295,000 of 1/4% Sales Tax for Transportation funds for the County's share of this improvement.
- The total project cost is \$3,787,098 and the County's share is \$1,467,511.
- The increase in the County's share is due to the initial bid prices being higher than estimated and additional removal of unsuitable soils along Kenosha Road.
- This improvement is included in the Transportation Improvement Program and is designated as Section 17-00125-06-CH.

Joint resolution authorizing a three-year maintenance agreement with Midwestern Software Solutions, LLC (MS2), of Ann Arbor, Michigan, for the Traffic Crash Location System (TCLS) used by the Lake County Division of Transportation (LCDOT) at a cost of \$41,427 and appropriating \$50,000 of ½% Sales Tax for Transportation funds.

- LCDOT is a licensed user of the TCLS software for its traffic crash analysis.
- The TCLS software is utilized by LCDOT, design consultants, and Lake County municipalities for traffic crash analysis.
- The existing maintenance agreement with TCLS will expire on August 31, 2025.
- This resolution authorizes a three-year maintenance agreement with MS2 of Ann Arbor, Michigan, beginning September 1, 2025, and ending August 31, 2028.
- This project is included in the Transportation Improvement Program and is designated as Section 25-00000-17-EG.

Joint resolution authorizing execution of a contract with D'Land Construction LLC of Algonquin, Illinois, in the amount of \$2,744,239.30 for the Gages Lake Road Water Main Replacement Project.

- The Lake County Department of Public Works operates the Wildwood water system, which serves a population of 14,000, as well as several learning institutions.
- The water main pipes are approximately 50 years old within the project area, are
 reaching the end of their service life, and need to be replaced. Certain segments of
 the water main need to be upsized to increase the capacity of the distribution
 system.
- The County received bids from five contractors for this water main work, ranging from \$2,744,239.30 to \$4,082,960.
- This project is in the Department's Fiscal Year 2025 capital budget with \$2,900,000 allocated for construction.
- The award of this contract is recommended to the lowest responsive and responsible bidder, D'Land Construction LLC of Algonquin, Illinois, in the amount of \$2,744,239.30.

Joint resolution authorizing execution of a contract with Archon Construction Company, Inc., of Addison, Illinois, in the amount of \$269,493 for the North Chicago Water Interconnect Meter Vault Rehabilitation Project.

- Lake County Department of Public Works (LCPW) owns and operates the Vernon
 Hills Water System that serves approximately 30,000 residents in the Village of
 Vernon Hills and surrounding areas, including unincorporated Knollwood and
 Rondout, as well as parts of Mettawa.
- This water system has an interconnect vault located in the Knollwood area that connects LCPW's system with the City of North Chicago's water system. The interconnect vault is approximately 40 years old and requires rehabilitation.
- The County received bids from one contractor for the work to rehabilitate the meter vault in the amount of \$269,493.
- \$550,000 was budgeted for this project in the Department's Fiscal Year 2024 capital budget for construction.
- The award of this contract is recommended to the lowest responsive and responsible bidder, Archon Construction Company, Inc., of Addison, Illinois, in the

amount of \$269,493.

Joint resolution accepting a grant from Congressionally Directed Spending through the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency (US EPA) Community Grants Projects to support the Lake County New Century Town Water Reclamation Facility (NCT WRF) Centrifuge Project, including an emergency appropriation of \$959,752 in grant funds and an emergency appropriation from Fund 610 Public Works Fund reserves.

- Lake County Department of Public Works (LCPW) owns and operates the NCT WRF in Vernon Hills. The NCT WRF is the second largest of the three LCPW treatment plants.
- All WRFs require a dewatering process to separate the solid waste from clear effluent. The current dewatering equipment at NCT WRF is in need of replacement.
- The NCT WRF Project will replace the existing belt filter presses and associated equipment in the sludge dewatering building with new centrifuge technology.
- The grant amount totaling \$959,752 will be provided to the LCPW through the US EPA and only 80 percent of the requested cost (\$1,199,752) will be funded. LCPW is also seeking an emergency appropriation for the remaining 20 percent (\$240,000) from fund reserves. There is sufficient fund balance to handle this project that was on the Public Works capital plan.
- The grant term is from September 2, 2024, to October 30, 2027, and was secured through the office of Congressman Brad Schneider.

Joint resolution authorizing a contract with M.E. Simpson Co. Inc. of Valparaiso, Indiana, for the Lake County Department of Public Works (LCPW) water main leak detection and locating services.

- A Request for Proposals (RFP) was issued for the purpose of selecting a short list
 of qualified firms to provide a presentation on their ability to perform water main
 leak detection and locating services for LCPW. The County received proposals for
 this work from three vendors.
- Based on the RFP review and interview presentations, LCPW selected M.E.
 Simpson Co. Inc. of Valparaiso, Indiana, as the most qualified vendor for Lake County.
- The award of this contract is recommended to M.E. Simpson Co. Inc. of

Valparaiso, Indiana, to provide water main leak detection and locating services, renewable annually for up to four years. Pricing is pursuant to Exhibit A of the agreement.

• \$120,000 was budgeted in Fiscal Year 2025 for these services.
