Grant Program Goals



- First year of funding goals:
 - 5% decrease of fatal overdoses by April 2026; and
 - 10% decrease of non-fatal overdoses by April 2026

- Purpose of funding perimeters:
 - Support creation of NEW evidence-based services

Grant Program Results Quarter 1, FY2025



- 16 Case Management services27 External referrals made to Lake County organizations
- **18** Warm hand-offs made to Lake County organizations
- **11** Applied for medical insurance
- **81** Received harm reduction services
- **52** Received naloxone
- **50** Received overdose prevention education
- **48** STARTED Medication Assisted Recovery
- 1 CONTINUING Medication Assisted Recovery
- 30 Received Recovery Support services by a peer
- Participated in counseling/groups provided by a licensed professional
- 4 Staff funded (partially or completely) to provide services

Grantee Learning Collaborative



- Quarterly Progress Reports
- Quarterly Meetings, Monthly Check-ins
- Grantee presentation
 - Mission, vision, purpose,
 - KPI and goals of their project
 - 10-15 minutes
 - Discuss progress/barriers
- Network with grant recipients
 - MOU and referral systems

Grant Process Adjustments



- Renew current grants-- additional year of funding
- Grant funding for NEW or EXISTING services
- Spring AND Fall grant cycles
- Include Youth Prevention/Education focus area

One Year vs Multi-Year Grants



• Pros:

- Flexibility for Funders
- Lower Long-Term Commitment
- Pilot-Friendly
- Increased Access

• Cons:

- Short Planning Horizon
- Instability for Grantees
- Risk of Superficial Impact
- Barrier to Smaller Orgs
- Inefficient Relationship Building

Pros

- Stability for grantees
- Encourages systemic impact
- Stronger partnerships
- Long-term outcomes

• Cons

- Multi-year budget commitments
- Less opportunities for new applicants
- Harder to adjust to external changes

Grant Process 2026



- Renew current grant recipients in April 2026
 - Letter of Intent by January 2026
 - Funding May 2026
 - \$500,000 total
- New grant opportunity in October 2026
 - Two-year funding award
 - May July applications
 - Funding November 2026
 - \$200,000 total
