WORKFORCE DEVELOPMENT

7.1 12-0362

Joint resolution accepting the Illinois Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity (DCEO) Trade Globalization Adjustment and Assistance Act grant modification and authorizing an emergency appropriation in the amount of \$150,873.

- DCEO provided a modification to the Trade Globalization Adjustment and Assistance
 Act grant to the Lake County Workforce Development Department in the amount of
 \$150,873.
- The grant is for the term of October 1, 2011 to September 30, 2012, and includes funding for individuals certified as eligible under the Act.
- This funding is expected to cover training services for workers affected through fifteen plant closings or lay-offs.
- This action is required to allocate these funds into the Workforce Department's budget and authorize acceptance of this modification.

Joint resolution approving the Summer Youth Employment Worksite Agreement.

- Annually, the County approves a Summer Youth Employment Worksite Agreement with various organizations that will provide summer youth employment as part of the Lake County 2012 Summer Youth Employment Program.
- The Worksite Agreement outlines the responsibilities of the participating summer worksites and Lake County.
- This year, this agreement will be entered into with 30 to 35 organizations that will participate in this program.
- The joint resolution authorizes the County Board Chairman or their designee to sign the agreements.

7.3 12-0491

Joint resolution authorizing various agreements for the Lake County Workforce Development Department's Youth Program Services.

- Lake County desires to enter into contracts for Youth Programs with qualified providers to service In-School and Out-of-School Youth under the federal Workforce Investment Act.
- Lake County extended Requests for Proposal to 194 providers and received 11 sealed proposals from seven service providers.
- The Workforce Development Board Selection Review Committee recommended, and the Workforce Investment Board approved, awards to six service providers that offered favorable proposals to meet the diverse needs of the student populations to be served.
- Contracts were approved for three In-School Youth Programs, including: North Chicago High School #187, Future First, North Chicago, IL in the amount of \$150,000 to service 22 youth, Zion Benton High School, Jobs For Bees, Zion, IL, in the amount of \$150,000 to service 21 youth and Waukegan High School, SHINE Educational Leadership Program, Waukegan, IL in the amount of \$150,000 to service 26 youth.
- Contracts were approved for five Out-of-School Youth Programs, including: North Chicago High School #187, CNA Program, North Chicago, IL in the amount of \$115,000 to service 15 youth, Waukegan High School, Pharmacy Tech Program, Waukegan, IL in the amount of \$150,000 to service 24 youth, Youth Build Lake County, North Chicago, IL for \$102,000 to service 12 youth, and First Institute Training and Management, Inc., Waukegan, IL, for \$160,000 to service 20 youth and Computer Systems Institute, Crystal Lake, IL in the amount of \$125,000 to serve 14 youth.
- In total, these contracts will cost the County \$1,102,000 and will be funded with the County's allocation of federal Workforce Investment Act funds.

7.4 12-0446

Ordinance authorizing an amendment to the Lake County Public Nuisance Ordinance.

- The proposed amendments declare the operation of tanning facilities and body art facilities without a valid permit to be a public nuisance; and therefore, enforceable under the administrative adjudication process.
- The violations, as incorporated, would be enforceable by Lake County Health Department Staff.

7.5 12-0447

Ordinance authorizing certain amendments to the Lake County Administrative Adjudication Ordinance.

 The proposed amendments relocate the administrative adjudication fines and fees into the Administrative Adjudication Ordinance, and allow the use of a range of fines in lieu of a set fine per violation.

- These amendments will assist in making the ordinance more consistent with state law and administrative adjudication best practices, establishing fairness in fines and incentivizing compliance. A corresponding repeal of the currently separate fee/fine schedule is proposed.
- Other amendments are proposed to correct minor clerical procedural issues.
