All fees, excluding laboratory fees and fees established or controlled by Illinois statute or other authorized agencies, will be increased annually based on the Lake County Consumer Price Index.

Any fee in this schedule of fees may be waived or reduced by the Health Officer based on hardship, for public health reasons, or to commemorate public health awareness events/celebrations.

Fee for Board of Health Hearings

Appeals of Violations and/or Enforcement of Lake County Code Ordinances under Title XVII: Health

The Board of Health Hearings Committee may waive the fee based on hardship.

Fee for requested and/or required inspections of facilities where no fee is specified by this schedule of fees. Examples include, but are not limited to: massage therapy facilities, tattoo parlors, medical facilities or recreational facilities.
