- Social determinants/drivers of health
 - Poverty, access to care, unemployment, housing

Top Findings




- Engagement
- Upstream factors and social determinants
- Stigma hinders access to treatment and recovery services
- Need for more prevention, early intervention and education
- Dual diagnosis care and wraparound services
- Hiring and retaining quality behavioral health workforce
- Transparency and inclusivity

Overdoses Geographically




Distribution of All Opioid-Related Deaths Across Lake County, 2018-2022

Disproportionate Impact



20% of Opioid-Related Deaths were Black Residents

- Race-ethnicity Specific Rate Of Opioid Overdose ED Visits (per 10,000 ED visits)
 - 31.1 for non-Hispanic Blacks
 - 19.3 for non-Hispanic Whites

"Spend Money to Save Lives"



Goal: 5% decrease in fatal overdoses and a 10% decrease in non-fatal overdoses by April 2026.

Accomplish this by funding:

- Harm reduction
- Case management and system navigation
- Recovery services

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"Focus on Racial Equity"



- Priority given to strategies projected to impact
 - Black residents
 - Communities with highest overdoses
