

UDS Measure: Statin Compliance

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Statin

- A medication taken to lower the LDL (bad) cholesterol. Patients take the medication daily, and the cost is approximately \$10-15 a month (lower with a 90-day supply).
- Bad cholesterol likes to stick to the arteries, causing a reduced blood flow and the chance for a blockage or closure of the arteries.
- Statins lower the risk of having a heart attack or stroke in the future.



What Conditions?


- History of a cardiovascular disease
 - Heart Surgery
 - Heart Attack
 - Stroke
 - At risk for the above
- Diabetes Type 1 or 2 between 40 and 75yo
- Anyone with an LDL > 190

We use a tool – ASCVD Risk – which measures the possible risk of any future event.
