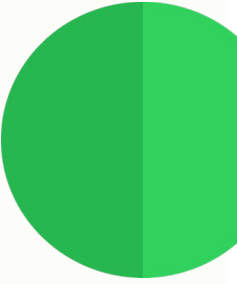

1. Yes. They are motion activated, and operate 24 -hours per day.
 2. Lake County Sheriff's Office owns and administers access to the cameras.
 3. Yes
 4. Flock Safety technology is operational in 1500+ US cities including Zion, Vernon Hills and Libertyville, along with 60+ other cities in Illinois. Law enforcement reports they help solve upwards of 400 crimes per day.
 5. The 4th amendment protects against "unreasonable searches and seizures" of which this is not. Flock technology indiscriminately collects public information on public roads. There is no expectation of privacy on a public road, and Flock devices capturing an image of a vehicle in public is akin to a civilian standing on a corner capturing images or jotting down a description of a vehicle involved in a crime.
 6. It is our understanding that when Illinois DOT permits LPR installations they do not take on liability for how the data is used by ISP or local law enforcement agencies and we have no reason to believe it would be different for Lake County.

How does this technology prevent and eliminate crime?

- **Proactive:** Real-time alerts when stolen or wanted vehicles enter your jurisdiction
- **Investigative:** As clearance rates increase, crime rates decrease

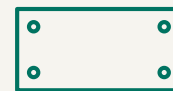

Ottawa PD




City of Ottawa, IL

- Several of Ottawa's Flock Cameras required permitting from IDOT .
- After completing the permitting process, the first two cameras installed each resulted in stolen vehicle alerts within the first 12 hours .
- Two stolen vehicles were recovered and suspects in custody, likely preventing the vehicles from being used for other crime .



Protecting Privacy

- Footage owned by County and will never be sold or shared by Flock
- 30 day data retention period - then permanently deleted
- Short retention period ensures that all data not associated with a crime is automatically deleted & unrecoverable
- Takes human bias out of crime-solving by detecting objective data, and detecting events that are objectively illegal (ex. Stolen vehicles)
- All data is stored securely in the AWS Government Cloud
- Search reason is required for audit trail

- NOT facial recognition software
 - NOT used for traffic enforcement
 - End to End Encryption of all Data
 - NO PII is contained in Flock
 - Not connected to registration data or 3rd party databases (Carfax, DMV)
 - Optional Transparency Portal

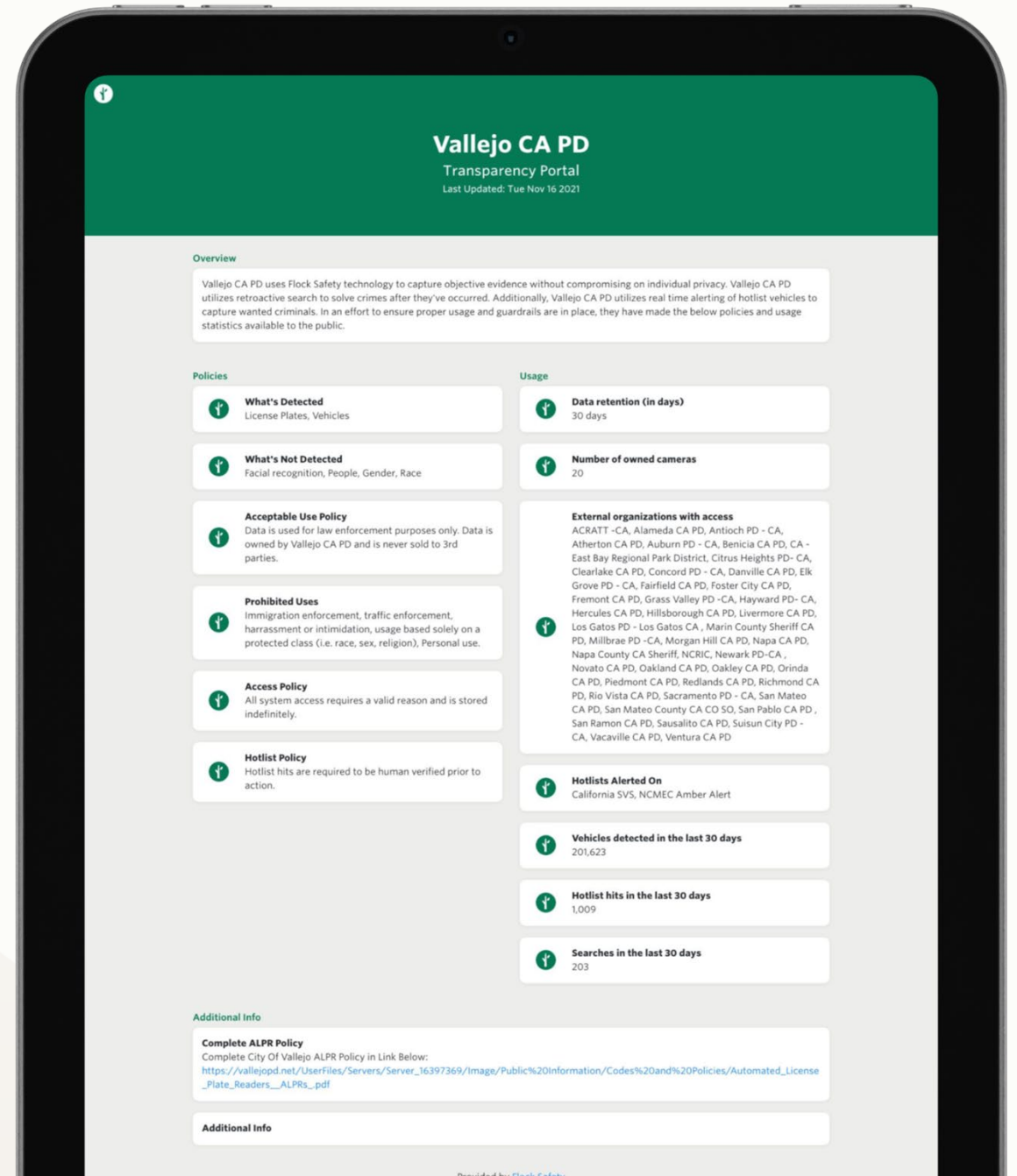
