
#### **Homeless Point-in-Time Count**



- In partnership with the Lake County Coalition for the Homeless
- Annual census count of people experiencing homelessness
- Overnight search for people sleeping outside
- Required by HUD, data compiled and reported to Congress
- Wednesday, January 25th



# **Lake County Coordinated Entry to Homeless Crisis Response System**



#### **Homeless Data**



- Point-in-Time Count Report is a snapshot of the population and includes some demographics.
- Longitudinal System Analysis assesses the pathways of people through the system.
  - Used statewide to project gaps.
- System Performance Measures provide overall data on items such as number of newly homeless and average length of time homeless.
  - Used annually for funding priorities.
- By-Name List is real time data on who is experiencing homelessness.
  - Updated by multiple sources.
  - Used for triage into housing vacancies.

# **System Performance Measure Data**



- 1,189 people experienced literal homelessness last year
- People experiencing literal homelessness stayed for an average of 102 nights in shelter
- 808 (83%) are experiencing homelessness for the first time
- 41% exit to a permanent housing destination

# **System Performance Measure Data**




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### **By-Name List**



- Real time data updated by multiple service providers
- Reported monthly and used in meetings to drive improvement
   Chronic Homelessness in Lake County



#### **Functional Zero**



- Measure and concept by Built for Zero to drive progress at the population level.
- Achieved when the number of people currently homeless is less than the average number who are housed monthly.
- Once the milestone is achieved, it must be maintained. It is not lost if you exceed the number once.
- Lake County achieved functional zero for veteran homelessness in December 2018.
- Currently, working on chronic homelessness goals.
