7.5 <u>19-1744</u>

Joint resolution accepting the University of Chicago grant and authorizing an emergency appropriation in the amount of \$2,500 for the Extension for Community Health Outcomes (ECHO) grant.

- The \$2,500 University of Chicago grant will be used to cover the interface costs associated with connecting a new ultrasound machine to NextGen.
- The \$2,500 in additional grant funding has not been previously appropriated because the grant resources were secured after the County's adoption of the Fiscal Year 2019 budget.
- The grant award will be for the period July 1, 2019 through June 30, 2020.

7.6 <u>19-1809</u>

Joint resolution appropriating \$50,000 of Motor Fuel Tax funds for the 2020 repair and replacement of various guardrail and fence installations, under the applicable Illinois Highway Code.

- The County owns miles of guardrails and fences along the County highway system, and annual repairs and replacements must be made to various installations which are included in the highway improvement program, and designated as Section 20-00000-06-GM.
- Before the purchase of material or a contract service can be procured, an appropriation of \$50,000 of Motor Fuel Tax funds is required.

7.7 <u>19-1811</u>

Joint resolution appropriating \$141,200 of Matching Tax funds for inspection and maintenance of recently planted native landscape areas along various County highways.

- The County has planted native landscape areas for various projects on the County highway system that require routine inspection and maintenance, and designated as Section 20-00000-14-GM.
- This maintenance will be done by a contractor.
- Before a project letting can be held, an appropriation of \$141,200 of Matching Tax funds is needed.

7.8 <u>19-1804</u>

Joint resolution authorizing an agreement with Jorgensen and Associates, Inc., Lake Villa, Illinois, for land surveying services to support the design of improvements to Deep Lake Road, from Grass Lake Road to Depot Street, at a maximum cost of \$52,814, and appropriating \$65,000 of Motor Fuel Tax funds.

- Deep Lake Road, from Grass Lake Road to Depot Street, will be resurfaced.
- In addition to the resurfacing work, this improvement will include guardrail replacement, culvert replacement, improved drainage, and installation of bike-friendly shoulders.
- A consultant will be utilized to provide professional land surveying services to support the in-house design engineering work for the Deep Lake Road project.
- Lake County selects professional land surveying firms in accordance with the Local Government Professional Services Selection Act, 50 ILCS 510/1 et. seq.
- The Lake County Division of Transportation Professional Services Selection process has been approved by the Federal Highway Administration and the Illinois Department of Transportation, and the firm selected for this project was selected in accordance with this approved process.
- Public notices were published on March 29 and April 2, 2019, resulting in 11 firms submitting Statements of Interest and Statements of Qualifications. Three firms were shortlisted and interviewed on May 2, 2019.
- This resurfacing improvement has been identified within the County's pavement

management system, is included in the highway improvement program with target construction in 2021, and designated as Section 19-00999-66-RS.

7.9 <u>19-1819</u>

Joint resolution authorizing an agreement with Baxter and Woodman, Inc., Crystal Lake, Illinois, for water system modelling and capacity analysis.

- Lake County Public Works is seeking engineering services for water system modelling and capacity analysis. This master agreement, sourced through a full Statement of Interest (SOI) competitive process, will allow individual task orders to be issued up to a maximum cumulative value of \$200,000 for a given year. The term of the contract will be two years with three one-year renewal options to allow for future projects with services based on approved contracted rates.
- Vernon Hills and Knollwood Rondout Water Models is the initial project to be completed under this agreement.
- Lake County Purchasing received and evaluated SOI from 16 professional firms, of which three were short-listed.
- In accordance with the Local Government Professional Services Selection Act, the recommended firm is Baxter and Woodman, Inc.
- The initial contract with Baxter and Woodman, Inc. will include preliminary engineering design services and engineering design services based on contracted hourly rates in an estimated amount of \$150,670.
- This service was included and budgeted as part of the Fiscal Year 2019 Capital Improvement Program.

7.15 <u>19-1801</u>

Resolution authorizing a contract with Johnson Controls, Arlington Heights, Illinois, for Building Automation Systems (BAS) upgrades to the Center Courts in the amount of \$31,429.26.

- As part of Fiscal Year 2019 Budget Process, services were approved to retrofit the original air handler equipment with a variable speed drive to improve efficiency and decrease overall costs.
- This work will install and commission five wireless thermostats and occupancy sensors in the courtrooms, as well as, the secure hallways adjacent to the Judge's chambers on all four floors in the Center Courts facility. This will improve temperature control and reduce fan operation during winter and unoccupied hours, which will reduce oval operating costs.
- Lake County Purchasing identified a cooperative purchasing contract with Johnson Controls through the Sourcewell Cooperative Purchasing Program to procure the needed service by the original equipment manufacturer.
- Pursuant to Article 10-101 of the Lake County Purchasing Ordinance, Cooperative Purchasing, Lake County may participate in a cooperative purchasing agreement for the procurement of goods with one or more public procurement units in accordance with an agreement entered into between the participants.
- This contract authorizes the purchase the installation and commissioning of equipment facilities in the amount of \$31,429.26.

7.17 <u>19-1808</u>

Joint resolution amending rates for the Lake County Sheriff Deputies working off duty "Special Detail" for private business, individuals, and government units.

- The hourly rate charged to private businesses, individuals, and governmental units for special detail patrol has been \$63 per hour since July 1, 2015.
- The rates for employees performing patrol and command duties while on special detail has been \$41 and \$44.80 per hour, respectively, since July 1, 2015.
- The Sheriff is requesting to increase the special detail rate charged to private business, individuals and governmental units to a corresponding amount of \$70 per hour and \$76 per hour if the special detail requests a command officer; effective May 1, 2020.
- All related costs, including administrative cost, will be recovered from the organization requesting the service and any fines and forfeitures for any violations will be paid to the County.

- The Coroner's Office has an agreement to participate in the development of the State Unintentional Drug Overdose Reporting System (SUDORS).
- The Lake County Coroner's Office has been notified of reimbursement in the amount of \$26,000 for participation in this system, which was unbudgeted.

• The Coroner's Offices wishes to utilize this revenue to purchase mobile cadaver trays and related equipment for the Coroner's Office.

7.19 <u>19-1722</u>

Joint resolution approving First Amendment to the 2019 United States Housing and Urban Development (HUD) Action Plan.

- HUD requires the submission of an Annual Action Plan and associated amendments to govern the expenditure of federal funding.
- The Lake County Citizen Participation plan requires the execution and approval of an Action Plan Amendment for any new project or major change in scope of project.
- The First Amendment to the 2019 Annual Action Plan allocates \$28,681 in new 2019 program income and reallocates \$775,000 from stalled projects.
- Such reallocations require the proposed amendment to the Annual Action Plan be accompanied by a 30-day public comment period and public hearing.
- The Advisory and Recommendation Committees (ARCs) of the Housing and Community Development Commission (HCDC) recommended the replacement projects and programs for funding.

Joint resolution accepting the Health Resources and Services Administration (HRSA) grant and authorizing an emergency appropriation in the amount of \$66,000 for quality improvement funding.

- The \$66,000 Health Resources and Services Administration grant will be used for staff training, patient satisfaction software, and consultant services.
- The \$66,000 in additional grant funding has not been previously appropriated because the grant resources were secured after the County's adoption of the Fiscal Year 2019 budget.
- The grant award will be for the period August 1, 2019 through July 31, 2020.

PUBLIC WORKS, PLANNING & TRANSPORTATION

7.21 <u>19-1807</u>

Joint resolution authorizing a supplemental appropriation of \$1,600,000 of ½% Sales Tax for Transportation funds for the construction and Phase III construction engineering to reconstruct and widen Weiland Road, from Deerfield Parkway to Aptakisic Road.

• The County has been allocated federal funds to reconstruct and widen Weiland Road, from Deerfield Parkway to Aptakisic Road, and the Illinois Department of Transportation (IDOT) administers all federal highway funds.

- The County Board, at its meeting on May 14, 2019, approved an appropriation of \$4,295,000 of 1/4% Sales Tax for Transportation funds for this improvement.
- There was a public call for bids by IDOT and the apparent low bid amount is \$12,469,513.24, which is approximately 12 percent higher than the engineer's estimate.
- The County's local share of construction, based on the known bids, is estimated to be \$4,910,066.
- This improvement is included in the highway improvement program with construction planned to begin in 2020, and designated as Section 18-00158-13 -WR.

7.22 <u>19-1812</u>

Joint committee action item approving Change Order Number Four consisting of an increase of \$10,836.04 for additions to the Hart Road at U.S. Route 14 intersection improvement Phase II consultant agreement.

- Change Orders need to be approved by the standing committees for cumulative net increases over 10 percent.
- The Hart Road at U.S. Route 14 intersection improvement project is under contract with TranSystems Corporation, Schaumburg, Illinois, in the amount of \$927,604.31 as approved by the County Board on November 20, 2012, and designated as Section 09-00174-05-CH.
- The Lake County Division of Transportation (LCDOT) has secured \$742,100 in federal funds for this engineering design work.
- Additional engineering services are necessary for several revisions to the original scope of work as detailed in the attached Supplement Number Four.
- Change Order Number Four includes additional engineering services necessary as a result of agreement negotiations with the Union Pacific Railroad.
- Change Order Number Three included additional soil borings and geotechnical analysis on the west side of Hart Road just south of the Union Pacific Railroad Tracks, and a revision to the final engineering plans and specifications as being required by the Illinois Department of Transportation (IDOT) as part of their federal approval process.
- Change Order Number Two included work to revise two parcels on the plat of highways with property needs for the project based on negotiations between the parcel owners and DOT, and additional environmental work to update the Preliminary Environmental Site Assessment (PESA) and the wetland delineation report that expired in 2015.
- Change Order Number One included the addition of an eight-foot shared use path along the west side of Hart Road, from U.S. Route 14 south to the project limits. The Village of Barrington has a project that will extend this path south to Barrington High School.

Joint resolution authorizing an agreement with AECOM Technical Services, Inc., Chicago, Illinois, to provide professional engineering services for a countywide Single Occupancy Vehicle Reduction Study, at a maximum amount of \$592,490.

- The Lake County Division of Transportation (LCDOT) will conduct a countywide Single Occupancy Vehicle Reduction Study to develop travel demand management strategies applicable to Lake County that will reduce vehicle trips with only one person in the vehicle.
- The study will have a public outreach component that will involve the public as well as key stakeholders.
- A consulting firm will be utilized to perform these professional engineering services.
- The LCDOT Consultant Selection Process has been approved by the Federal Highway Administration and the Illinois Department of Transportation, and the firm selected for this project was selected in accordance with this approved process.
- LCDOT received and evaluated Statements of Interest and Qualifications from two professional firms, of which two were short-listed and presented to a consultant selection committee.
- As a result of the interviews, the selected and recommended firm is AECOM Technical Services, Inc., Chicago, Illinois, with a maximum cost of \$592,490.
- This study is included in the highway improvement program to begin in 2020, and designated as Section 18-00999-56-ES.

7.24 <u>19-1741</u>

Joint resolution providing for the receipt of a maximum of \$469,600 State Planning and Research (SPR) federal planning funds reimbursement from the Illinois Department of Transportation (IDOT) to Lake County for a countywide Single Occupancy Vehicle Reduction Study and appropriating \$770,000 of ¼% Sales Tax for Transportation funds.

- The Lake County Division of Transportation (LCDOT) will conduct a countywide Single Occupancy Reduction Study utilizing a consultant.
- IDOT will reimburse Lake County up to 80 percent of the study cost using SPR federal planning funds.
- Federal funds require a 20 percent local match which will be paid by Lake County.
- The estimated study cost is \$592,490, with a maximum reimbursement of \$469,600.
- The Public Works, Planning and Transportation Committee, at its meeting on January 9, 2019, discussed opportunities for grant funding during the Division of Transportation Director's Report. The Public Works, Planning and Transportation Committee agreed with the recommendation to apply for grant opportunities to help fund the study.

Joint resolution authorizing the execution of a contract with Sheridan Plumbing and Sewer, Inc., Bedford Park, Illinois, for Southeast Central Interceptor Sanitary Sewer Heavy Cleaning in Libertyville area in the estimated amount of \$732,160 based on unit pricing using a shared services contract.

- Lake County Public Works provides sewer service throughout portions of Lake County and undertakes cleaning and televising of sanitary sewer systems.
- As part of the County's shared services initiative, Public Works has been working closely with the County Administrator's Office to identify shared service opportunities.
- Pursuant to Article 10-101 of the Lake County Purchasing Ordinance, Cooperative Purchasing, Lake County may participate in a cooperative purchasing agreement for the procurement of goods with one or more public procurement units in accordance with an agreement entered into between the participants.
- RHMG, on behalf of the Northwest Lake Facility Planning Areas (FPA) wholesale advisory committee prepared bid documents for Fiscal Year 2019 Sanitary Sewer Cleaning and Televising Program.
- Bid documents include Part A for a joint shared bid between Lakes Region Sanitary District, Village of Round Lake Beach, Village of Hainesville, Village of Round Lake Park, and Village of Round Lake Heights sewers; and Part B for a bid regarding the Lake County southeast central interceptor sanitary sewer heavy cleaning.
- Sheridan Plumbing and Sewer, Inc. submitted the lowest responsive and responsible bid for Part B in the estimated amount of \$732,160 for 19,171 feet of sewer cleaning.
- Lake County Public Works Department coordinated with Northwest Lake FPA Wholesale Advisory Committee through their Sanitary Sewer Cleaning and Television Program to obtain the equivalent negotiated 2019 contract pricing.

7.26 <u>19-1824</u>

Joint resolution authorizing a contract with Openedge, Lindon, Utah, to provide credit card and e-check processing services for the Lake County Public Works Department's Tyler Incode 10 utility billing software at a current estimated annual cost of \$102,145.

• Due to technological advances and enhanced security requirements a replacement utility billing system was necessary, and on July 10, 2018 the County Board awarded Tyler Technologies a contract to implement Incode 10 as the Public

Works department's new billing software system.

- The department needs to utilize a payment processor that will maintain the same level of service options for its customers including electronic credit card and e-check payments. The department's current credit card processor will not integrate with the Tyler product.
- Openedge is the only source that can provide electronic credit card and e-check payments that directly integrates with the Tyler Incode 10 software.
- The Department is unable to move forward with the anticipated year end 2019 system implementation until the new credit card processor is selected.
- Pursuant to Article 6, Section 102 of the Lake County Purchasing Ordinance, the Purchasing Agent approved the bid exemption on the basis that there is only one source for the required goods, service, or construction item.
- This authorizes the Purchasing Agent to execute an agreement with Openedge to provide electronic credit card and e-check processing services for the Tyler Incode 10 utility billing software at a current estimated annual cost of \$102,145.

7.27 <u>19-1802</u>

Joint resolution authorizing an emergency appropriation for Watershed-Based Plan Implementation by the Stormwater Management Commission (SMC) in the amount of \$1,189,807.03 and funded by grant 3191915 from the Illinois Environmental Protection Agency (IEPA).

- SMC has entered into an agreement with the IEPA for a grant (Grant 3191915) under Section 319 of the Clean Water Act for implementation of seven projects identified in watershed-based plans.
- Total estimated project costs are \$3,700,000, and local project sponsors will provide the required match. An emergency appropriation is needed as funds for this grant (\$1,189,807.03) are not included in the current fiscal year budget.
- SMC will administer the grant, provide administrative and technical assistance to the local project sponsors and will be reimbursed for staff time spent on the project.

7.28 <u>19-1828</u>

Joint committee action authorizing the Stormwater Management Commission (SMC), to submit a grant application to the Illinois Emergency Management Agency for two Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) grant programs.

• SMC is applying for a FEMA Pre-Disaster Mitigation program grant and a Flood Mitigation Assistance grant for the purpose of flood-prone home buyouts.

- SMC will use Corporate Capital Improvement Plan (CCIP) cash as a 25 percent match, for a total project cost of approximately \$1,800,000.
- The grants will purchase, demolish and restore vacant properties for up to seven homes that have been prioritized based on purchase price, depth of flooding and insurance damage claims.
- During the project, approximately \$90,000 in grant funds received will be used for the reimbursement of SMC staff efforts for project administration.
- The local match to be supplied for the grant is in accordance with the SMC Comprehensive Plan, and if the grant is awarded, will be brought back to the County Board for acceptance and allocation.

Joint resolution authorizing an emergency appropriation for the Lake County Multi-Hazard Acquisition Project by the Stormwater Management Commission (SMC) in the amount of \$1,517,598 and funded by the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) Pre-Disaster Mitigation program through the Illinois Emergency Management Agency (IEMA).

- SMC has entered into an agreement with the IEMA for a grant (PDMC-PJ-05-IL-2017-010) for the buyout of two landslide-prone and two flood-prone properties in Lake County.
- Property will be acquired initially by the Lake County SMC and then transferred to local municipality, township or other local governments upon completion of the project.
- Emergency appropriations are needed for the project cost of \$1,517,598 which is not included in the current year budget. SMC will use funding for project expenditures, which will be reimbursed by the IEMA.

Joint resolution authorizing a Power Purchase Agreement and Lease with WCP Solar, Naperville, Illinois, for the purpose of advancing the solar panel project feasibility process for the 10 proposed County sites and to calculate the pricing of the County-owned proposed solar sites.

- A combined joint solar procurement opportunity Request for Proposal (RFP) was issued in March 2019 to procure a portion of the participating entities' electrical demand through solar power.
- Lake County served as the lead agency in the joint solar power RFP that included 40 sites identified by the County and seven partnering Lake County municipalities.

- Lake County received eight proposals in response to RFP, and interviews were conducted with three firms.
- Based on the criteria set forth in the RFP, the proposal submitted by WCP Solar was determined as the most qualified and most favorable for Lake County and the other Lake County municipalities.
- The recommended agreement is a Power Purchase Agreement (PPA) and Lease that will have a term of 25 years. The County will not own the solar panels but will be responsible for the operation and maintenance of each system and through this contract will delegate the tasks to WCP Solar.
- The final electrical rate for the solar panels will be calculated based on a series of criteria. The final rates will be brought back to the Committee in the form of a contract modification.
- A buyout provision is included in the Agreement for each site should the County elect to purchase the system in either the eighth or fifteenth year of the Agreement.

- The Lake County Clerk's Office currently owns 600 ePollbooks which are used for election judge training, early voting and election day voting. This amount is insufficient to adequately support the upcoming 2020 election.
- The Lake County Clerk's Office is in need of an additional 100 ePollbooks in order to continue providing distinguished election service.

- The Lake County Clerk's Office applied for and received an Illinois Voter Registration State Grant from the Illinois State Board of Elections and wishes to appropriate those funds for the purchase of these ePollbooks.
- Pursuant to the County's Code, Chapter 55 of the Illinois Complied Statutes (55 ILCS 5/3-2003.2), the County Clerk has the authority to control the internal operations of his or her office and to procure the necessary equipment, materials and services to perform he duties of the Office.
- This resolution authorizes an emergency appropriation and authorizes the County Clerk to enter into an agreement in the amount of \$145,300 for the purchase of 100 ePollbooks from Robis, Inc.

Resolution authorizing a Collective Bargaining Agreement (CBA) with Teamsters Local Union No. 700, as the exclusive representative for the Correctional Lieutenants Employee's Bargaining Unit of the Lake County Sheriff's Office.

- The CBA shall be effective for a four-year period from December 1, 2018 through November 30, 2022.
- Wages will increase 2.5 percent on December 1, 2018 and 2.85 percent on December 1, 2019. Wage increases will be same across the board as non-represented employees of the County on December 1, 2020 and December 1, 2021.
- The Employer and Union will re-open the wage clause, after Lake County and the Metropolitan Alliance of Police (Correctional Sergeants representative) settle their contract, to ensure there is a five percent differential between the top Correctional Sergeant wage and the Correctional Lieutenant promotional wage.
- The Union agreed to other contractual changes including but not limited to changes in the overtime formula and eligibility for holiday pay.
- It is projected that the cost of the general increase will be \$11,846.71 for Fiscal Year (FY) 2018 and \$25,689.58 for FY 2019.

- This budget reflects all budget actions as approved by Standing Committees and the Financial and Administrative Committee.
- The proposed budget continues to maintain our core services and funds new investments in the County's employees, infrastructure, citizens' health and well-being, justice system and much more.

• The levy ordinance for this SSA (Loon Lake) is required to be adopted annually.

7.41 <u>19-1795</u>

Ordinance appropriating funds and providing for the levy of a direct tax sufficient to produce \$164,919.60 for the Northeast Lake Facilities Planning Area Special Service Area (SSA) Number Nine.

- In 1994, the County Board established the Northeast SSA Number Nine.
- This SSA was established to assist in the financing the new Northeast sewer system.
- A special tax roll was created that sets forth the amount to be levied each year against all parcels in the SSA.
- This ordinance lists the amounts to be levied for the tax year 2019 to be collected during calendar 2020.

7.42 <u>19-1794</u>

Ordinance providing for the levy of a direct annual tax sufficient to produce \$35,200 for Special Service Area (SSA) Number 12.

- In 2004 the County Board established the Woods of Ivanhoe SSA.
- This SSA provides funds to maintain private roads in Ivanhoe Subdivision.

7.43 <u>19-1793</u>

Ordinance providing for the levy of a direct annual tax sufficient to produce \$260,000 for Special Service Area (SSA) Number 13.

• The levy ordinance for this SSA (Spencer Highlands) is required to be adopted annually.

7.44 <u>19-1792</u>

Ordinance providing for the levy of a direct annual tax sufficient to produce \$13,925 for Special Service Area (SSA) Number 14.

• The levy ordinance for this SSA (Oak Pond Lane) is required to be adopted annually.

7.45 <u>19-1791</u>

Ordinance providing for the levy of a direct annual tax sufficient to produce \$56,640 for Special Service Area (SSA) Number 17.

- In 2016 the County Board established the Ivanhoe Estates SSA.
- This SSA provides funds to maintain private roads in the Ivanhoe Estates residential community.

7.46 <u>19-1806</u>

Resolution authorizing the Department of Finance and Administrative Services to post the appropriate accounting and budget entries for Fund 303 Series 2010A, Fund 304 Series 2011A, and Fund 301 Series 2019 to properly record financing activities within the Debt Service Funds.

- On July 9, 2019 the Lake County Board adopted Ordinance 19-1078 providing for the issuance of not to exceed \$54,000,000 General Obligation Refunding Bonds (Sales Tax Alternate Revenue Source) to refund Series 2010A and Series 2011A General Obligation Sales Tax Alternate Revenue Bonds.
- On August 7, 2019 a total of 41 bids were submitted and the final accepted bid resulted in a net present value savings of \$7,067,181.
- Final sale and closing occurred on September 5, 2019 and required the creation of the 2019 General Obligation Refunding Bonds debt service fund to record the receipt of earnest money deposits, pay closing costs, and properly account for the related transactions.
- After final debt service payments in Fiscal Year (FY) 2019 for Series 2010A and Series 2011A Bonds, any residual fund balances are required to be transferred to the Series 2019 debt service fund.
- This resolution authorizes the Department of Finance and Administrative Services to post final closing entries for Fund 303 Series 2010A and Fund 304 Series 2011A, post opening entries for Fund 301 Series 2019, and to create budget authority in Fund 301 Series 2019 for transactions occurring in FY2019.

7.47 <u>19-1384</u>

Ordinance amending Chapter 33, Purchasing, of the Code of Ordinances by establishing responsible bidder requirements on public works projects.

- Lake County seeks to enhance its ability to identify the lowest responsible bidder on all public works construction projects by instituting more comprehensive submission requirements which are in compliance with Illinois law.
- The ordinance will apply for all construction contracts in excess of \$100,000 financed, in whole or in part, with County public funds.
- The ordinance shall not apply to federally funded construction projects if such application would jeopardize the receipt or use of federal funds in support of such a project.
- Division of Transportation projects shall be exempt from provisions of the Ordinance if they are not in concurrence with Illinois Department of Transportation rules.
- Responsible bidders shall comply with all applicable laws prerequisite to doing business in Illinois, the County Purchasing Ordinance and not conflict with any federal law.
- Responsible bidders and bidder's sub-contractors must participate in active

apprenticeship and training programs approved and registered with the United States Department of Labor's Office of Apprenticeship for each of the trades of work contemplated under the awarded contract.

• Notice will be provided to the potential vendors who may be impacted by the County's municipal partners impacted by the changes to Chapter 33 of Title 3 of the Lake County Code of Ordinances that will become effective November 12, 2019.

7.48 <u>19-1854</u>

Committee action authorizing the County Administrator's Office (CAO) to submit a grant application to Reaching Across Illinois Library System (RAILS) for grant funding to support the Census 2020: It Counts effort.

- The County is seeking grant funding for residents who don't have computers or internet access who frequent County offices such as the Central Permitting Facility in Libertyville, Court and Administrative Complex in Waukegan, Veteran's Assistance Commission in Gurnee, and the Workforce Development Office on the College of Lake County campus in Waukegan, to self-respond to the Census 2020.
- The purpose of the grant is to increase participation in the 2020 Census.
- The grant will fund 20 computer devices with internet access and promotional materials, such as fact sheets, posters, and postcards to increase the Census 2020 response rate.
