Background



<u>Purpose</u>

At the October 6, 2021 PWPT Committee meeting, LCDOT staff was directed to investigate the possibility of allowing for the installation of Automatic License Plate Readers (ALPR) within the county-owned public highway right-of-way.

Requests

- The City of Zion has formally requested that LCDOT allow the installation of ALPRs along several county highways within the Zion municipal limits.
- Several other Lake County municipalities have notified LCDOT that they are considering using ALPRs.

Automatic License Plate Readers



 High speed computer-controlled camera

What are they?

- Can be mounted on poles, mobile trailers, police vehicles
- Captures license plate numbers, location, date and time, photograph of vehicle, driver and/or passengers
- Data uploaded to vender's central server
- Vender leases data access to their customers



Peer Agencies



- IDOT, District 1 allows via permit
- DuPage County allows via permit, 2 permits issued to municipalities to date
- Kane County allows via permit, 1 permit issued to municipality to date
- Will County allows via formal agreement, 8 municipal agreements approved to date
- McHenry County no requests for installation to date

Potential Next Steps



- Request additional information
- Provide direction to staff
 - Do not allow ALPR installations within county highway right-of-way
 - Allow ALRP installations within county highway right-of-way
- Staff develop permit conditions for installation of ALRPs
 - Permit would be issued by LCDOT to the municipality
