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Purpose / Summary

- Review current state of Rental Assistance Programs in Lake County and discuss needs and recommendation for options.

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Public Engagement Components

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Background



- Presented external request process options to the Special Committee on April 29, 2022 and discussed future public engagement
- Related to public engagement, received direction to:
 - Formalize process for external requests
 - Finalize plan for engagement for future presentation/discussion
- Three primary public engagement components discussed previously:
 - Online Questionnaire / Survey
 - Public meeting / townhall-type meetings
 - External partner request process

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Public Engagement



- US Treasury ARPA Compliance and Reporting Guidance
 - Recovery Plan Performance Report
 - Document how the County's planned use of funds incorporates written, oral, and other forms of input that captures diverse feedback from constituents, community-based organizations, and the communities themselves.

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Component Review



- Online Questionnaire
 - Requests separate and overall ranking/prioritizing different components of recovery and response
 - Public Health
 - Household Assistance
 - Economic and Business Investment
 - Infrastructure & Facility Investment
 - County Service Investment
 - Requests additional suggestions for each component that are not shown or clear
 - Opportunity for other components not included
 - Can be released and left open throughout engagements

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Component Review



- Public Meeting / Townhall (in-person)
 - Proposing 2 in-person community information/feedback events
 - Round Lake Area (evening)
 - Waukegan Area (evening)
 - Work with community leaders to communicate event, support
 - Station-based breakouts that align with ARPA expenditure categories
 - Subject matter experts review current work and discuss potential ideas/needs with members of the community
 - · Translators, scribes, comment cards
 - · One general station for help with questions, ARPA understanding

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Component Review



- Public Meeting / Townhall (virtual)
 - Proposing 1 virtual public engagement event
 - · Initial presentation with background
 - Listening session
 - Translator present
 - Solicit feedback on priorities / needs

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Component Review



- External Partner Request Program
 - Guided by:
 - Program guidelines
 - Request form
 - Scoring methodology / criteria
 - Develop a scoring criteria based on the feedback and priorities solicited during previous components

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
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Component Review



- Program Guidelines
 - Only requests that are eligible for funding under a specific direct ARPA eligibility category will be considered. All requests that will require revenue replacement dollars will not be scored or considered.
 - The request will be scored based on a number of established criteria and a list provided to Lake County's Special Committee on COVID-19 Pandemic Recovery and Investment for review and consideration.
 - Eligible requestors include not-for-profits/non-profits and local units of government other than municipalities.
 - The physical location of the program or service provided needs to be within the geographical boundaries of Lake County, Illinois.
 - Funding will be provided on a reimbursement basis unless a case is established for upfront funds.
 - The minimum request value for this program is \$50,000. No maximum request is established however the soft program maximum allocation is currently \$10 million.

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
FERA Update

- Started with 15 partners, now 12
- Providing 12 months of assistance with utilities




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Rental Assistance Need



- Eviction Court is modified to assure landlords and tenants have applied for assistance
 - Courts operating two days a week to keep up with demand
- State programs are winding down
 - Court-based program ending 9/30
 - Future rounds dependent on funding
- New need from COVID variants and the impacts of inflation



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Proposed Pathway Forward



- Wind down FERA
 - Application portal closes June 30, 2022
 - Partners continue to work on applications until contracts are spent
- Communicate the success of FERA
- Pivot to new program with open/closed application rounds
 - New program will allow us to communicate clearly about the program changes
 - Model allows for better prioritization
 - Ramp down assistance as the recovery continues

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Proposed New Rental Assistance Program



- Continue to work through community partners, likely fewer
- First application period open in October
- Targeted benefits
 - Limit of six months of rental assistance, no utilities
 - FERA assistance counts towards the limit
- Continue Eviction Court applications on a special path
 - Applications always open
 - Continue 12 months of rental assistance, no utilities
- Run program consistent with ERA guidance to allow spending of additional funds, if they become available

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Proposed Budget Options



Option 1: Two Rounds of Assistance (Fall and Spring) = \$6m*

Cost Category	Amount
Direct Assistance	\$5,175,000
Project Delivery (for partners)	\$575,000
Lake County Program Staff	\$250,000

Option 2: Three Rounds of Assistance (Fall, Spring and Summer) = \$10m*

Cost Category	Amount
Direct Assistance	\$8,640,000
Project Delivery (for partners)	\$960,000
Lake County Program Staff	\$400,000

Option 3: Wind Down and Return to Status Quo

June 3, 2022 *includes a court-based program and post-round assessment
