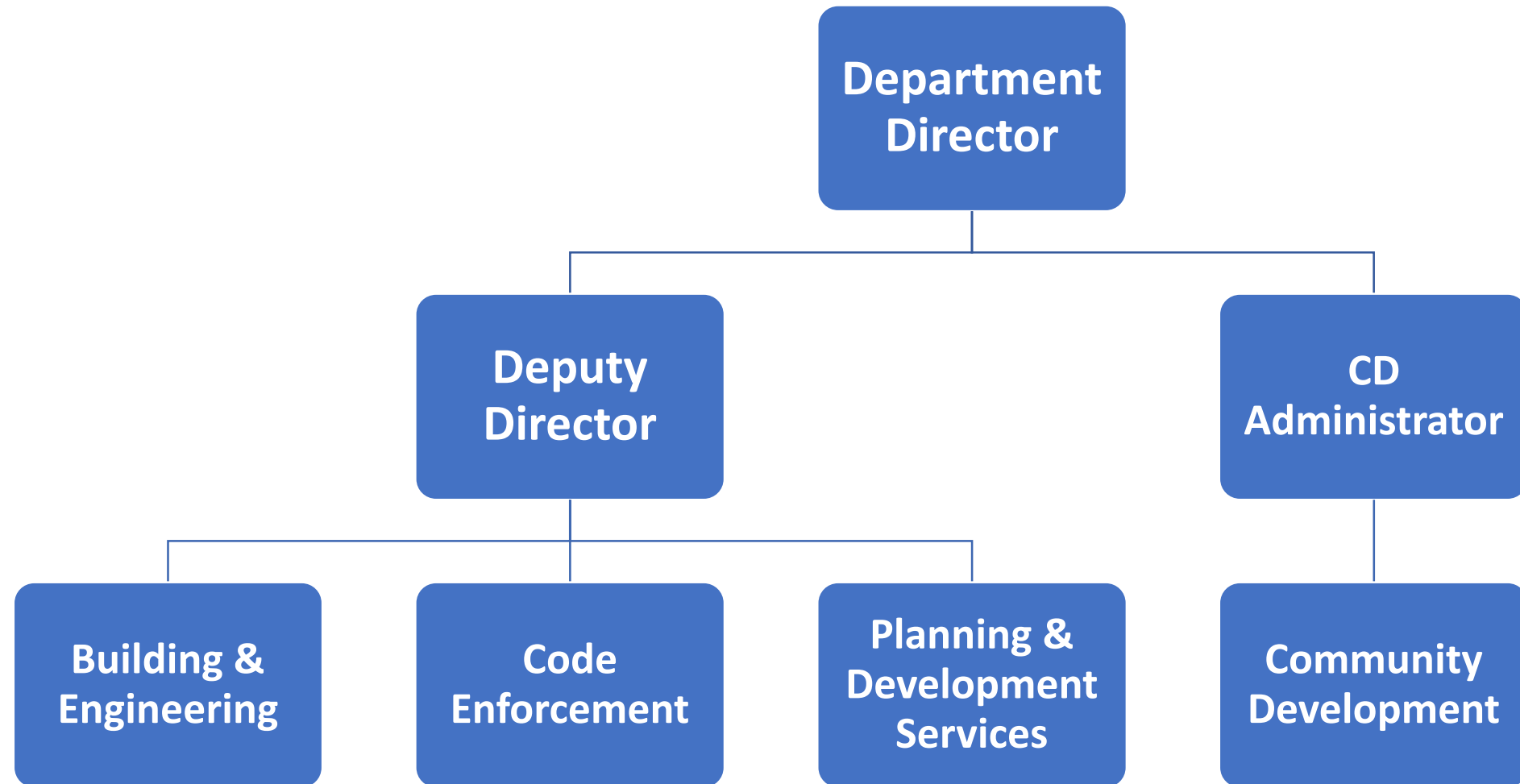

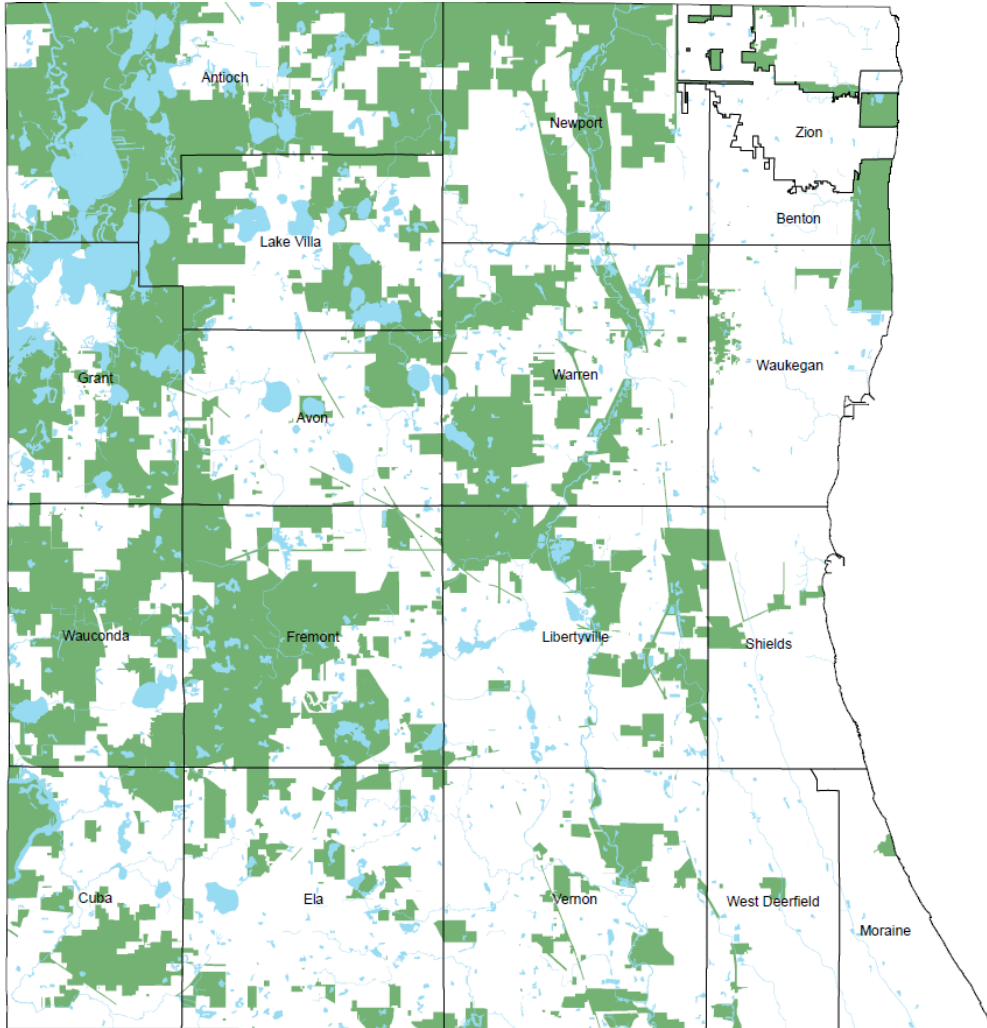

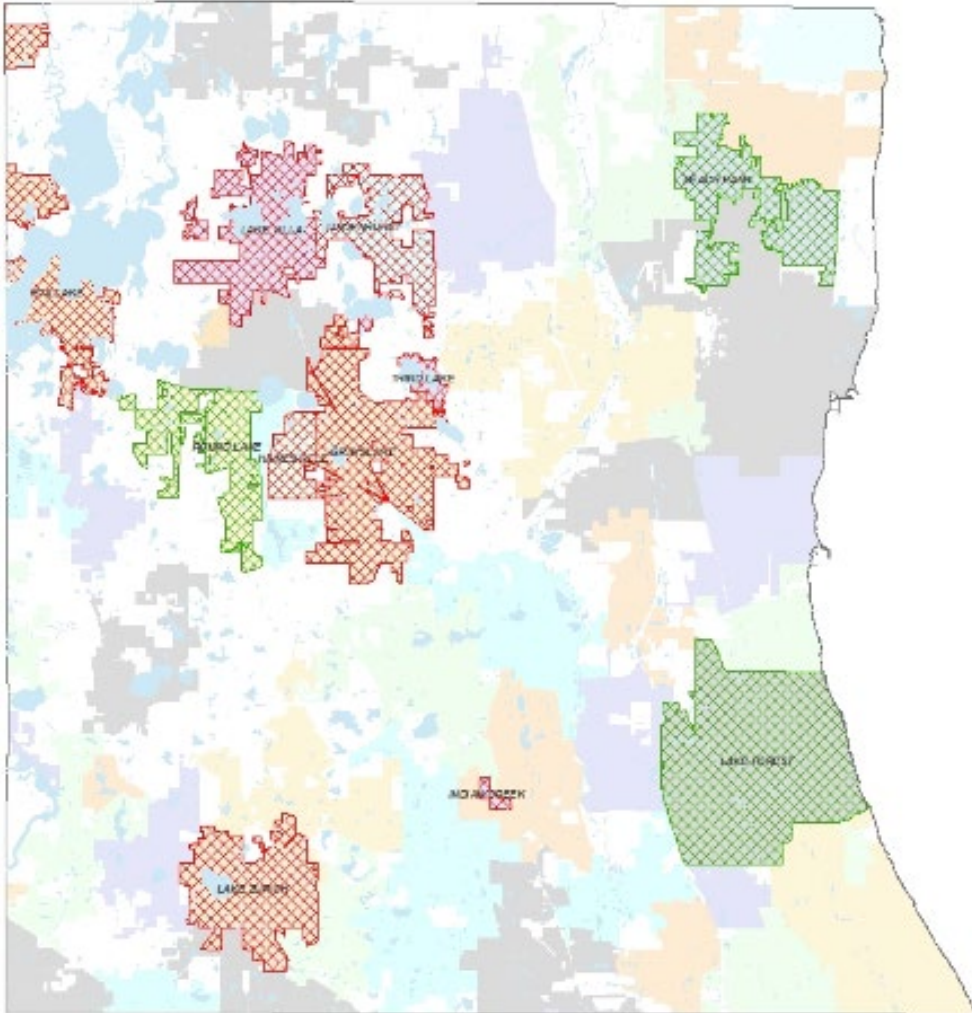

2021-2022 Highlights

- **Shared Services and Other Efficiencies:**
 - **Completed IGA Inspection/Plan Review Rate Study (conclusion: labor cost/rate has been kept level since 2015 due to staff model efficiencies)**
 - **Renewed existing IGA with Hainesville**
 - **Lake Villa has now fully implemented permitting software (EnerGov)**

2021-2022 Highlights

- “Virtual” Improvements, Shared Services and Other Efficiencies:
 - Continued Virtual Meeting Format for the following:
 - ZBA Public Hearings*
 - Development Client Meetings
 - Virtual Inspection Program
 - Virtual Administrative Adjudication Hearings*
 - *Recently moved back to live meetings to comply with OMA*
 - Renewed temporary enforcement inspection program (lower cost, seasonal efficiencies)
 - County Board adopted unincorporated waste hauling franchise agreements for the northern and southern halves of the County (effective June 1, 2022)

2021-2022 Highlights

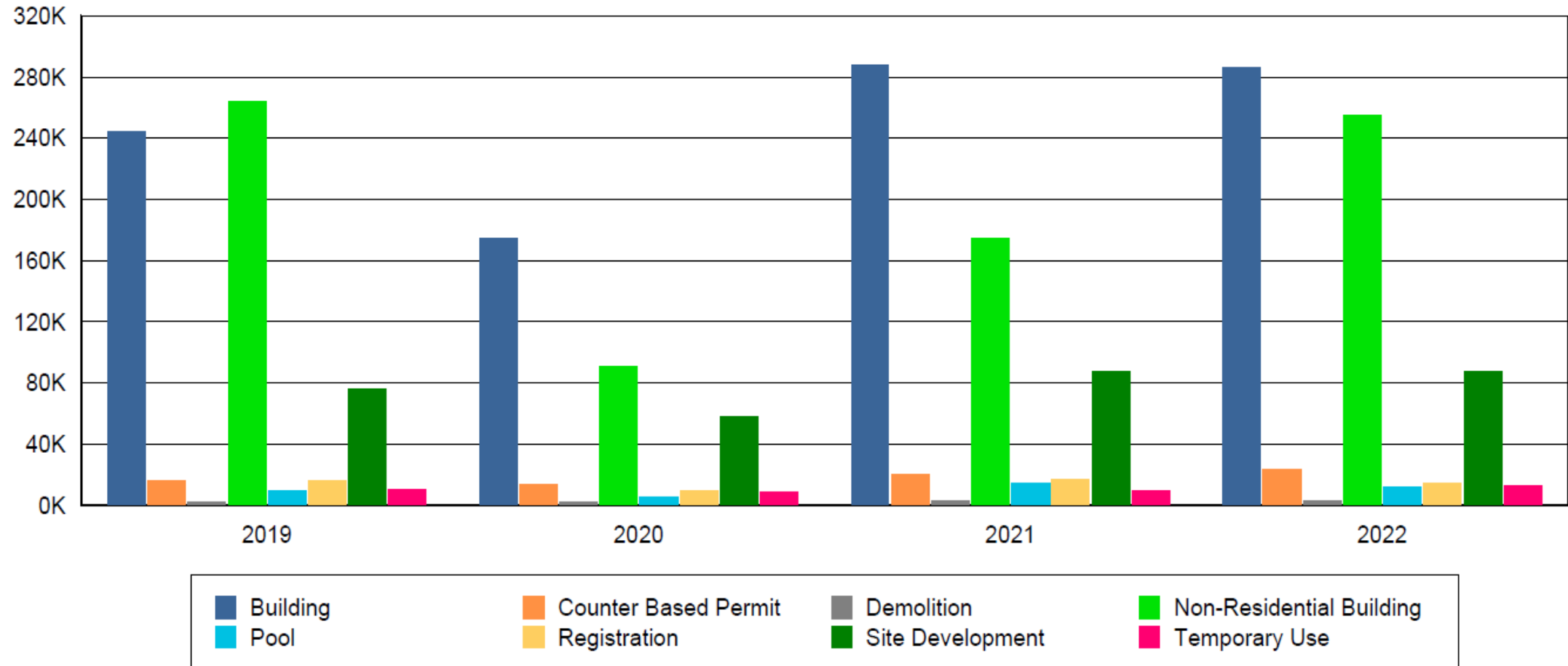
- **Regulatory Highlights**
 - **Temporary Landscape Waste Open Burning Restrictions for the unincorporated area (throughout 2021, Winter 2022)**
 - **County Board adoption of permanent Landscape Waste Open Burning Restrictions for the unincorporated area (effective June 1, 2022)**
 - **County Board adoption of Adult Use (Recreational) Cannabis Business zoning regulations for the unincorporated area (adopted May 2021)**
 - **CRS Recertification – retained rating as a Class 6 (20% discount on flood insurance premiums) via increased flood protection requirements, public education, etc.**

2021-2022 Highlights

- **Sustainability**
 - **Achieved Gold designation from SolSmart, a program funded by the US Department of Energy Solar Energy Technologies Office, for enacting best practices to reduce barriers to solar energy growth and streamline solar installation permitting processes**
 - **Text amendments (in progress) related to wildlife rehabilitation facilities and ecotherapy uses**

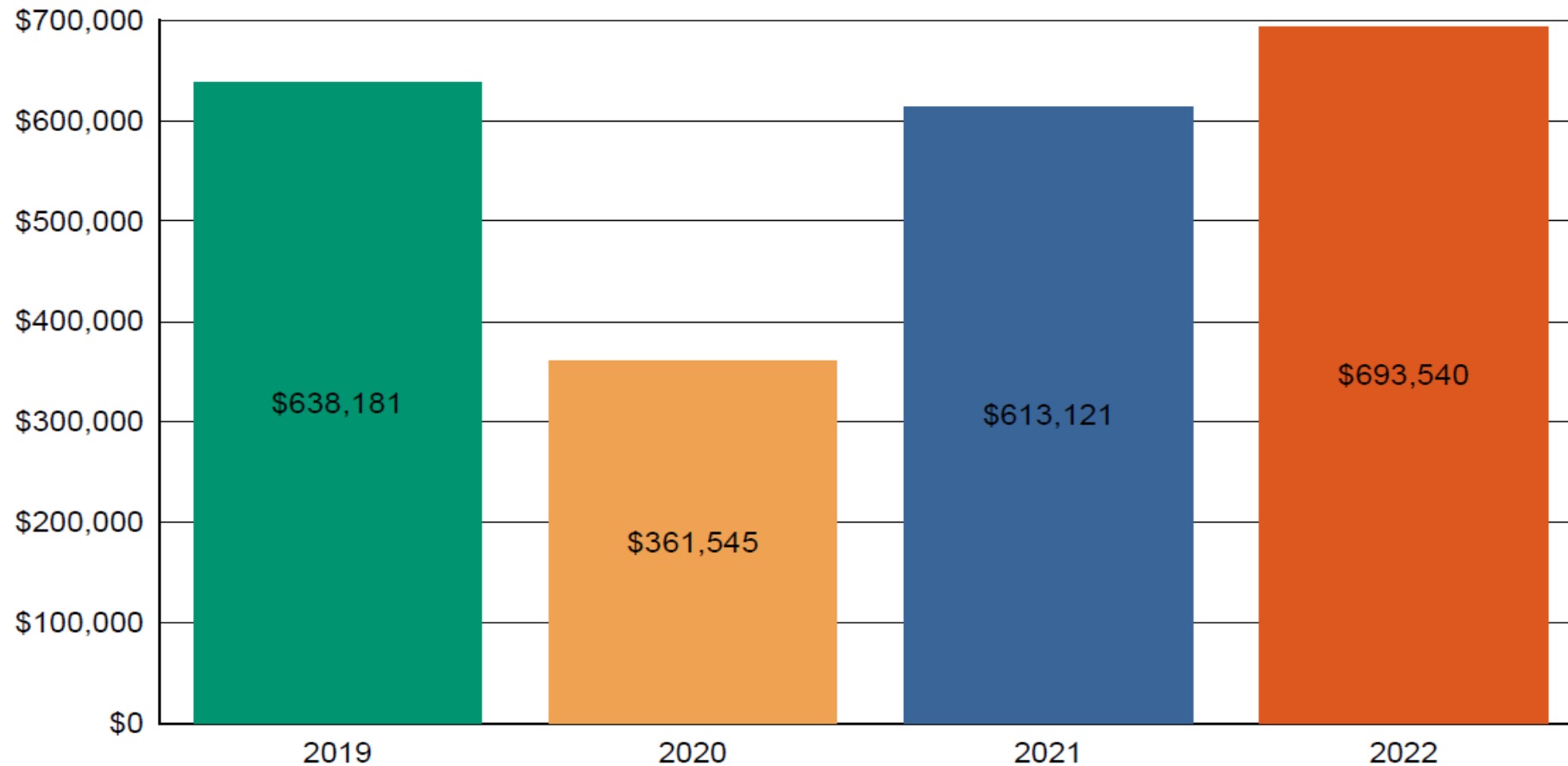
Permit Revenue

Total Revenue / Year: January - April & Permit Type

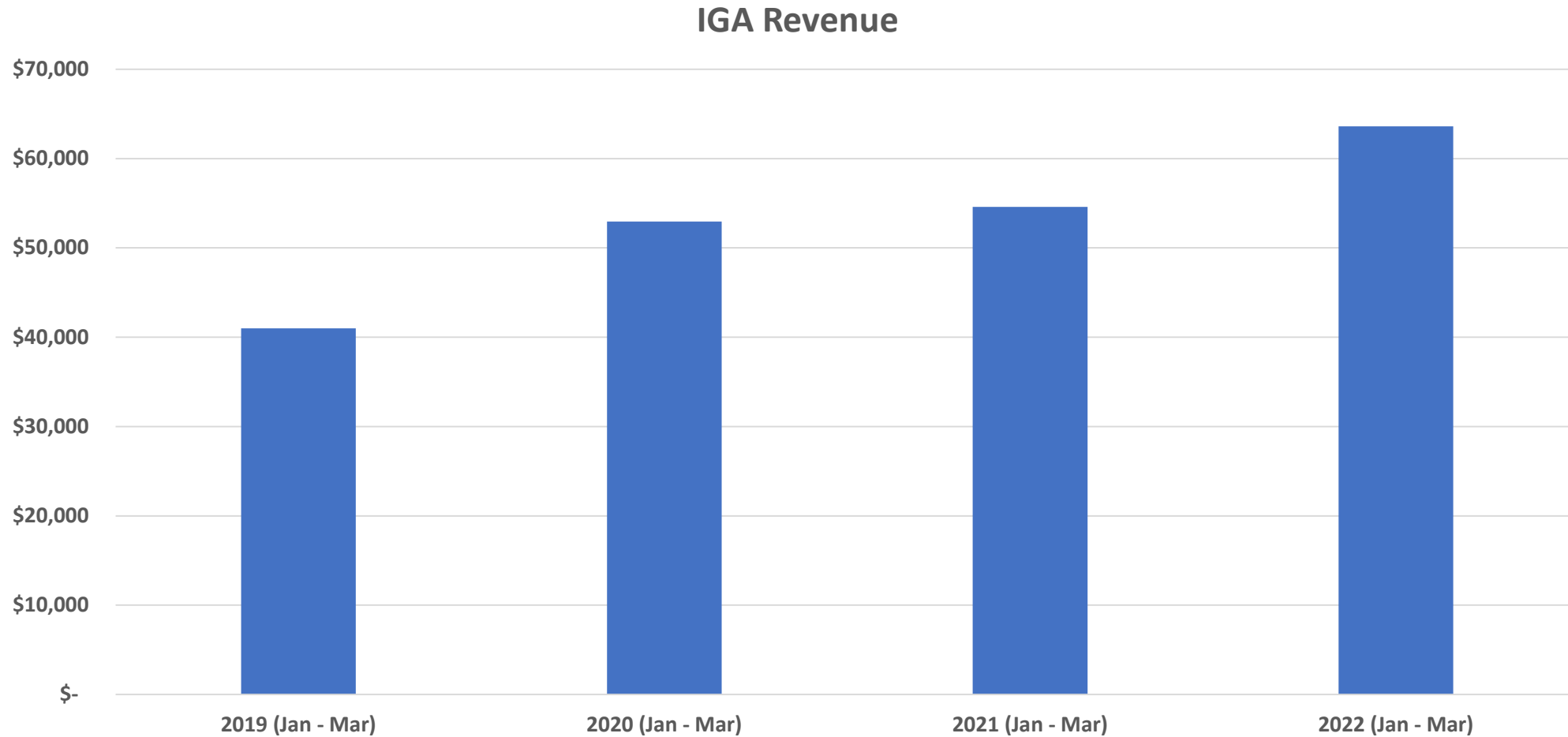


Permit Revenue

Total Permit Fees / Year: January - April

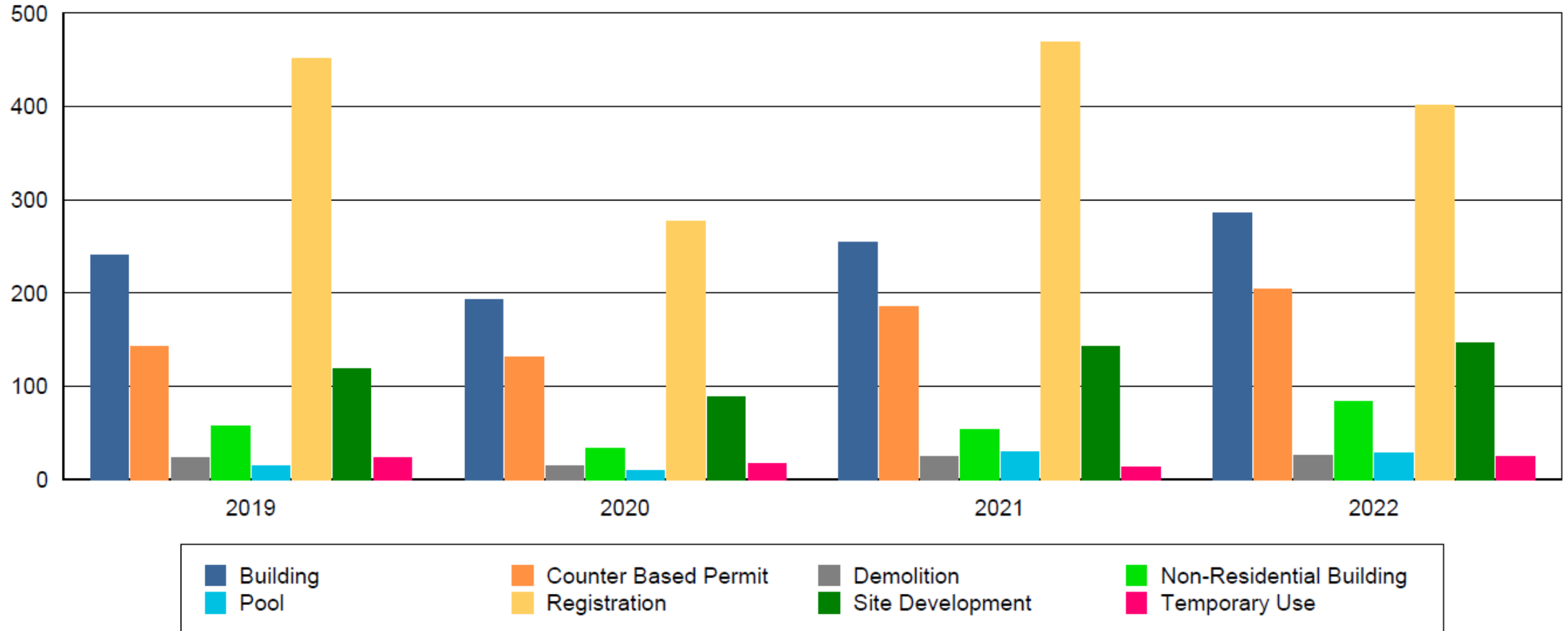


IGA Revenue



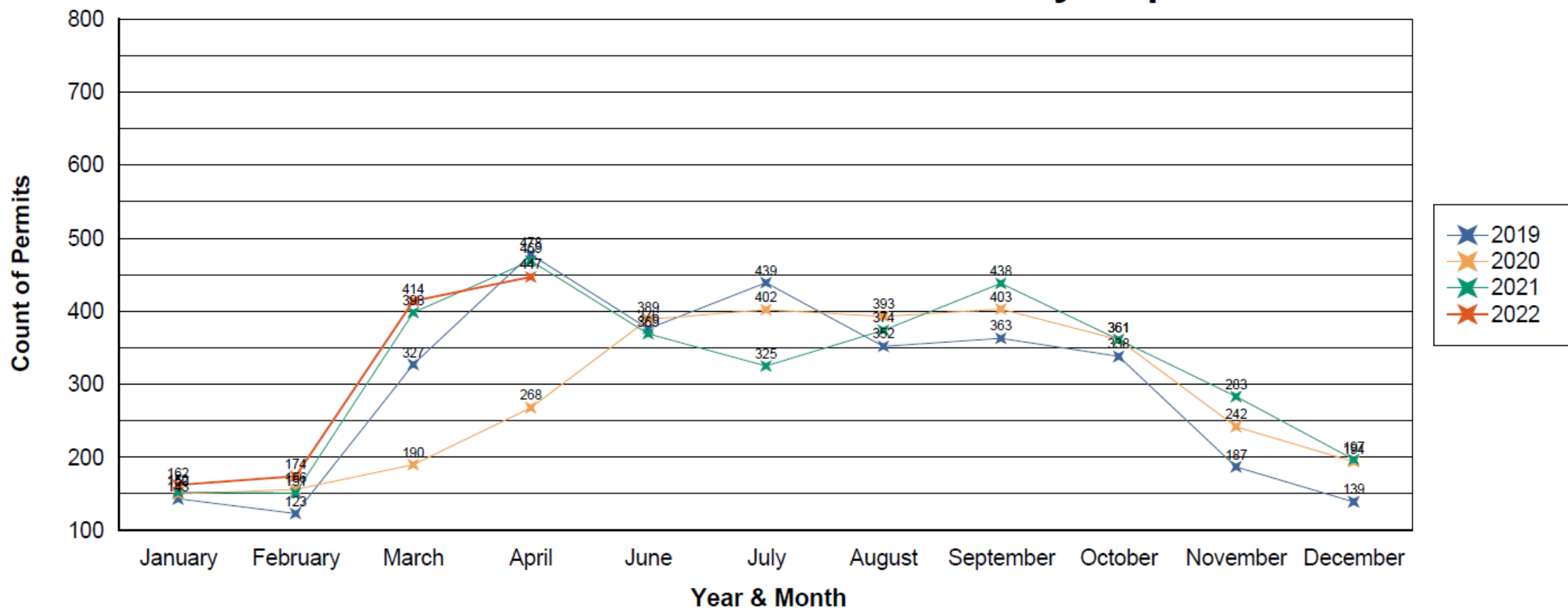
Permit Counts

Count of Permits / Year: January - April

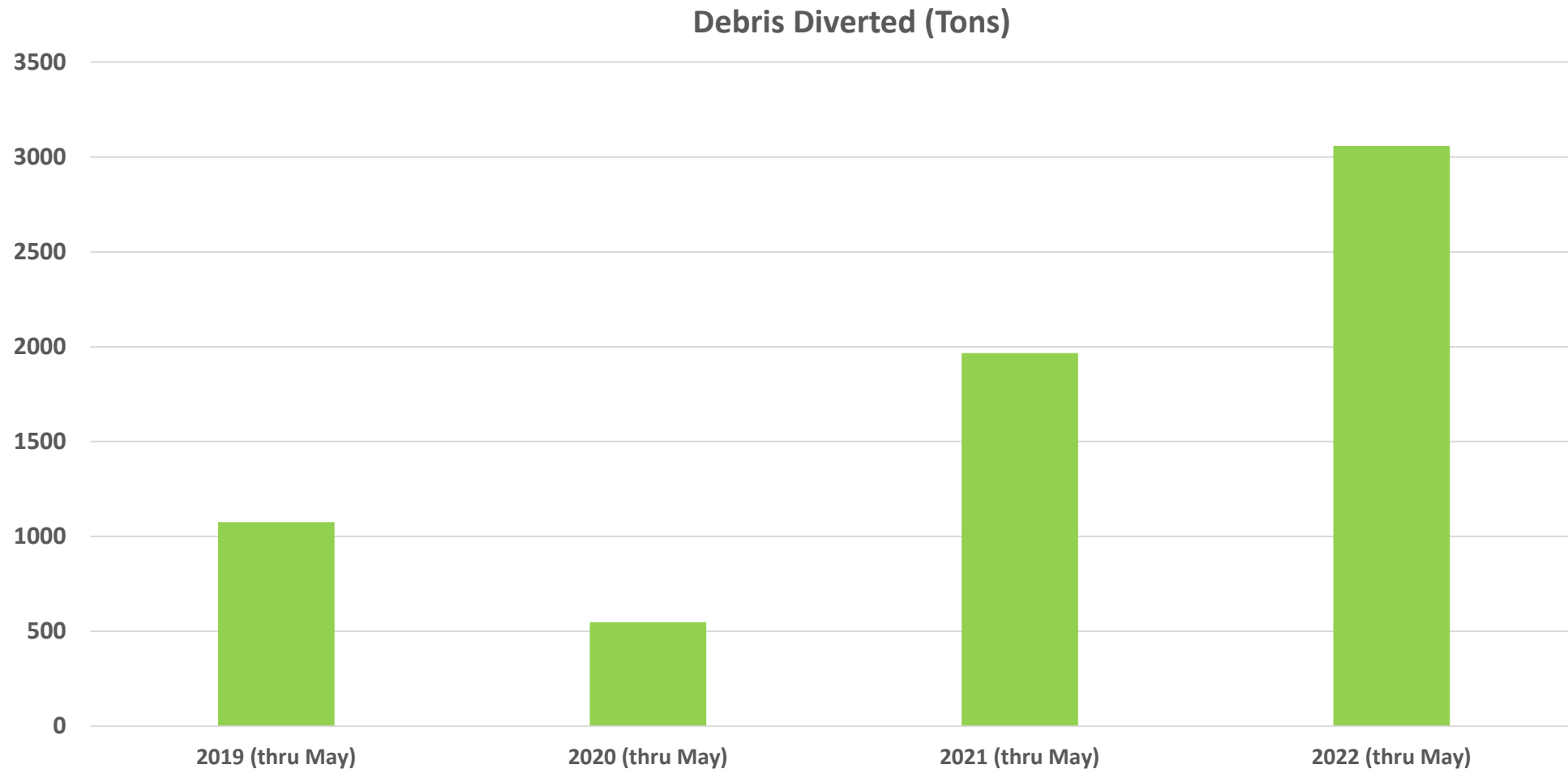


Permit Trend

2022-2023 Looking Ahead

- **Shared Services and Other Efficiencies:**
 - **Renewing existing intergovernmental agreements**
 - **Continuing to explore new “mutual aid” intergovernmental agreements throughout the County and expansion of existing intergovernmental agreements**
 - **Completing upgrade of permitting software (EnerGov) to accommodate additional efficiencies**
 - **Completing the implementation of the Landscape Waste Open Burning Regulatory Program and unincorporated Waste Hauling Franchise Program**

2022-2023 Looking Ahead

- **Regulatory Improvements**
 - **Completing comprehensive updates to the building codes**
 - **Complete UDO text amendments relating to development streamlining and various policy topics (including sustainability-related)**
 - **Native Trees and Plant Initiative**
 - **Sustainability Incentives Ordinance**
 - **Affordable Housing Policy Options**
 - **Dark Sky Lighting Policy Options**

2022-2023 Looking Ahead

- **Sustainability**
 - **Various sustainability-policy regulatory topics (see above)**
 - **Implementing (with CAO) a regional tree initiative (per E&E direction)**
