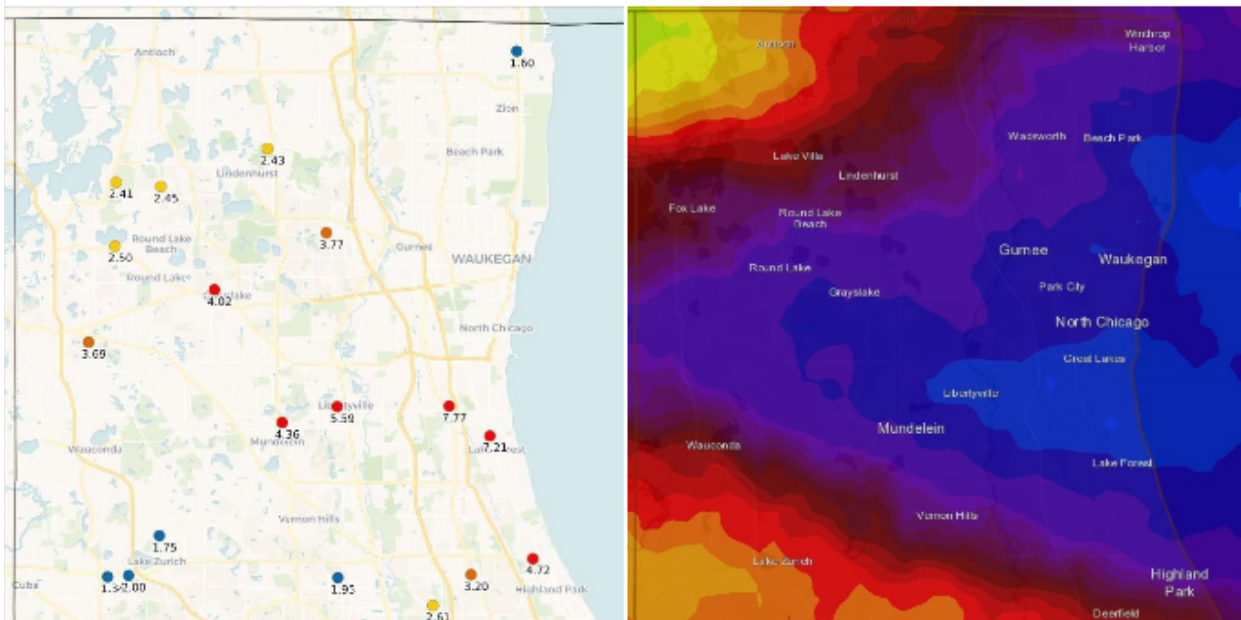
Over the past week we've seen Rain, Rain, and more RAIN!

Storms rolled through Lake County dropping between 2 to 7.77 inches of rain from July 21-24. The central area of the county saw the heaviest rainfall. One CoCoRaHS station between Libertyville and Lake Bluff reported 7.77 inches of rainfall!

Prior to this rain event, much of Lake County was dry and the watersheds were able to receive the rainfall. This is especially true in parts of northern Lake County that is experiencing abnormally dry conditions, AKA a slight drought.

Lake County was forecast to receive additional significant rainfall on Sunday, however that system stayed to the north and did not drop significant rainfall in any of Lake County's watersheds. Instead, it dropped more than five inches of rain in portions of southeastern Wisconsin.
