



*CBCC waiting list count includes all those sentenced to Periodic Imprisonment that are currently being "Held until criteria is met" participating in inpatient treatment, those that are in other correctional facilities as well as those that have been "Released until criteria met". Generally, those released until criteria is met report to begin their sentence 2-3 weeks after their sentencing date. Persons "Held until Criteria met" receive available beds prior to those that have been "Released until criteria met"

** The Electronic Monitoring waiting list count includes those in inpatient treatment, those that are in other correctional institutions, and those that have been "Released until criteria met". Generally, those "Released until criteria met" begin their sentence 10-14 days after being sentenced.

Inmate Status Definitions

❖ Inmates may have only one status at any given time

Status: Pretrial

Definition: Any inmate that is awaiting final disposition on any Lake County Criminal ~~or Civil~~ charge(s). This includes inmates sentenced on one charge and still awaiting final disposition on another Criminal ~~or Civil~~ charge, and Sexually Violent Persons (SVP), Sexually Dangerous Persons (SDP), Petition to Revoke (PTR) and post-conviction.

Status: Sentenced – Lake County Jail

Definition: Any inmate that has been convicted and sentenced to time in the Lake County Jail. This does not include inmates awaiting final disposition on any Lake County Criminal ~~or Civil~~ charge(s), awaiting DOC transport, periodic imprisonment, work release, electronic monitoring or awaiting a bed at treatment facility.

Example: Inmate is sentenced to 180 days in the Lake County Jail on a single charge and has no other Lake County charges pending.

Status: Sentenced –Lake County Community Based Correctional Center (CBCC)

Definition: Any inmate that has been convicted and sentenced to time in the Lake County CBCC. This includes inmates sentenced to Periodic Imprisonment and Electronic Home Monitoring. This does not include inmates awaiting final disposition on any Lake County Criminal ~~or Civil~~ charge(s).

Example: Inmate is sentenced to 180 days of Periodic Imprisonment or Electronic Home Monitoring on a single charge and has no holds for other jurisdictions or any other Lake County charges pending.

Status: Sentenced – Illinois Department of Corrections (IDOC)

Definition: Any inmate that has been convicted and sentenced to time in the IDOC. This does not include inmates awaiting final disposition on any Lake County Criminal ~~or Civil~~ charge(s), post-trial motions, post-conviction petitions, Sexually Violent Persons (SVP), Sexually Dangerous Persons (SDP) status hearings and witnesses.

Example: Inmate is sentenced to 1 year in the IDOC on a single charge and has no other Lake County charges pending.

Status: Hold for Outside Agency

Definition: Any inmate that has no Lake County charges pending but is being held under agreement with another government agency. This does not include inmates awaiting final disposition on any Lake County Criminal ~~or Civil~~ charge(s), and extradition.

Example: Inmate has no Lake County charges pending but has a hold for IDOC.

- Only properly classified inmates may be housed in a Dormitory style POD.
- Specialized Housing includes Medical, Segregation and Classification housing and is not available for general population.
- Booking includes individuals in booking cells at the time this report was generated. This may include individuals pending completion of the booking process, awaiting transfer to the classification housing unit as well as those pending release. While Booking has a capacity it should never be considered as available housing rather a short term processing area.
- There are 740 Jail Beds and 168 Work Release beds (908 Total). An inmates ability to stay in a given housing type will depend upon their sex, classification level as well as discipline and medical issues.
