



- 54 flood problem areas identified



2016 Stream/Detention Inventory Program Summary

Stream inventories - (9 Factors measured/each segment)

- 98 Miles Completed
- 1022 Discharge Points (pipes/tiles) 181 potential problems
- 36 Erosion Areas identified
- 2073 Debris Jams 1553 marked as Obstructing Flow
- 810 Culvert/Bridge Crossings 92 maintenance recommendations





Detention Basin inventories (40 Factors measured)

- Control structures, inlet/outlet conditions
- Erosion Issues
- 1279 completed, 676 maintenance recommendations
- All data being compiled for on-line access
