




211 is more than a Three Digit Phone Line





Reporting capabilities provide real-time, searchable data on local needs



211 will support 911 Operators and First Responders by providing:

- One place to easily refer non-emergency requests
- A single well maintained database of health & human service providers rather than multiple databases supported and maintained by a myriad of groups
- Follow up calls by 211 navigators to ensure caller got the help they needed
- Additional time to address true emergencies by:
 - Reducing the number of non-emergency calls to 911
 - Providing an additional source of Information for the high volume of disaster response and recovery resource inquiries
