- A. Case Management System for the 19th Judicial Circuit Court/Circuit Clerk for the Criminal, Traffic, Civil, Family and Juvenile Divisions
- B. Case Management System for the State's Attorney Office

C. Case Management System for the Public Defender Office

In addition to new case management applications for the above justice entities, Lake County sought proposals for a new Enterprise Service Bus (ESB) or similar application to support existing and new data exchanges between the three justice entities, their stakeholders, and other related State and County entities.

The Circuit Court and Circuit Clerk's office is also required to interface with the newly-implemented statewide e-filing system mandated by the Illinois Supreme Court. Proposers are invited to explain how their applications well interface with the mandated statewide e-filing system.

Department Recommendation:

Lake County Purchasing received and opened eight proposals in response to the Integrated Case Management System RFP. An interdepartmental review team evaluated the proposals based on their technical merit and selected four firms to provide on-site vendor demonstrations. Following the vendor demonstrations, the review team re-scored the finalist and selected Journal Technologies as the most qualified and favorable for Lake County.
