- National Incident Management System (NIMS) Expects Local First
 - Solve challenges with your resources before asking for help
 - Many municipalities are self-sufficient or need limited help
- Many Overlapping Jurisdictions
 - Different expectations and different procedures
 - Many mutual aid agreements create safety net of support
- Mutual Aid Organizations
 - Accessible without asking Lake County Government for help
 - Law Enforcement, Fire Protection, Hazardous Materials, Public Works, Emergency Management, and more

Review of Responsibilities and Authorities by State Law and Policy



- Counties <u>must</u> have Emergency Services & Disaster Agency (ESDA)
 - ESDA is responsible for emergency management
 - Lake County Emergency Management Agency is our ESDA
- Municipalities (<500,000 residents)</p>
 - <u>May</u> establish ESDA by ordinance
 - Must have designated liaison to county, even if no ESDA
 - Counties don't have jurisdiction in municipalities with ESDAs
- Each political subdivision (county, city, village, incorporated town) <u>must</u> notify Illinois Emergency Management Agency <u>annually</u>:
 - How it provides emergency management
 - Who is responsible

Review of Responsibilities and Authorities by State Law and Policy



- Each ESDA mandated or created by ordinance <u>must</u>:
 - Create a documented Emergency Management Program (EMP)
 - Prepare an Emergency Operations Plan (EOP)
 - Remain consistent with national standards ... NIMS
- EOPs specify how that jurisdiction will direct and control response to and recovery from an incident or emergency
- Open for debate...does a County automatically assume responsibility for a municipality that chooses not to create an ESDA, including its EMP and EOP?
 - Laws and codes do not express a definitive answer
 - Regardless, Lake County will help if contacted for assistance

Lake County EMA Operations-Related Responsibilities



- Develop, coordinate, and provide emergency management for:
 - Unincorporated areas
 - Municipalities that annually identify the County provides their emergency management
- When requested by municipalities, coordinate County, State, and Federal resources and support
- Maintain contact with municipal liaisons and ESDAs
- Certify non-mandated ESDAs, when requested by municipality, including:
 - Review EOPs
 - Approve emergency management-related exercise plans



- Hazardous materials releases Beach Park, Waukegan, Volo, and Lincolnshire
- First responders had robust Incident Command capabilities and direct access to plenty of mutual aid
- County involvement
 - Sheriff's Office -- both direct jurisdiction (Beach Park and Volo) and mutual aid calls
 - Coroner -- direct call from Incident Command (Waukegan)
 - Lake County EMA coordinated County-unique services and support to unincorporated areas from:
 - Health Department
 - Division of Transportation
 - Stormwater Management Commission
