### Lead Agency "Working Group" Mission

Mission: The goal of this working group is to reach consensus on the most appropriate lead agency to advance paratransit coordination and service improvements in Lake County, Illinois and aid in developing a transition plan.

- Conducted seven (7) public meetings to consider alternatives
  - July 2019 July 2020

### What is Paratransit?

A shared and flexible on-demand service that responds to rider requests for travel within a defined service area geared toward individuals with mobility limitations that prevent them from accessing scheduled bus service, and/or live outside an area served by scheduled bus service.

Ride Lake County Eligibility: Service is open to seniors (age 60+), individuals with disabilities, and in some instances the general public.

ADA paratransit service that compliments Pace's fixed-route bus services is implemented

#### LCCTSC

Formation of Lake County Coordinated Transportation Services Committee to guide paratransit coordination efforts in the county

• 2010: Ride Lake County West begins operating

2012: Transportation Market Analysis evaluates existing demand response services and provided service improvement recommendations

2016: Ride Lake County Central begins operating



- 7/8/20: Working Group provides recommendation



### Existing Paratransit & Local Bus Services



- 41 non-fixed route options
  - 5 Pace Dial-A-Ride services
  - 2 coordinated Dial-A-Ride services
  - 14 township/municipality bus/van services
  - 13 township/municipality taxi subsidy programs
  - At least 7 human service agency programs
- At least \$3.6 million spent annually
- One-way cost per trip ranges from < \$10 to \$40</li>
- Fares range from free or donation to \$3 one-way

# Ride Lake County Existing Conditions



### **Ride Lake County**

- Two separate services Ride Lake County Central and Ride Lake County West
- Both use Pace curb-to-curb dial-a-ride
- Ride Lake County Central and Ride Lake County West have different administrative structures
- Pace and LCDOT perform admin tasks like mobility management, billing, and invoicing
- Lake County coordinates federal grants, generates ridership reports, ridership forecasting, and staffs Ride Lake County committees

### Top Market Study Recommendations

### **Governance Changes**

- ✓ Establish working group to identify the appropriate lead agency
- Dissolve LCCTSC
- Create Ride Lake County
   Committee

### **Mobility Management**

- Centralized Trip
   Information/Planning
- Marketing Program
- Mobility Manager for Lake County Region

<u>Note</u>: The goal of these changes is to simultaneously improve both (1) the administration of the service; and (2) the experience for the users of service by providing efficient, reliable and affordable transportation options to our residents.

## Peer Comparison

### **Administrative**

- County as an executive sponsor
- Locals sponsor their local trips
- Pace performs mobility management

### **Financial**

- Multiple layers of funding
- Standardized fare structure
- Pace's legacy funding rolled into larger service model
- Pace fully funds call center

# "Lead Agency" Work Group Recommendation

The Lead Agency Working Group recommends that <u>Lake County Government</u> serve as <u>Executive Sponsor</u> in a new countywide service model and on a new Ride Lake County Committee, to be made up of local funding sponsors and service providers that will be created and replace the Lake County Coordinated Transportation Services Committee (LCCTSC).

### Proposed Roles and Responsibilities (Draft)



#### **Executive Sponsor**

- Assist with recruiting/vetting local sponsors
- Serve as a political change agent
- Manage Pace agreement for County sponsored services
- Establish Executive Committee to oversee Lake County government service(s)

#### **Local Sponsors**

- Register local riders
- Address resident inquires
- Cost participation
- Pace service agreement



#### **Service Provider/Mobility Manager**

- Manage sponsor agreements, billing and coordinate federal grants
- Conduct analysis to improve service and efficiencies
- Operate service and call center
- Mobility Manager (ridership reports & forecasting, resident inquiries, staff local committees)

#### **Ride Lake County Committee**

- Advance paratransit coordination and service improvements
- Define Service Area/Destinations
- Set Sponsorship levels

Note: plan requires further discussion with Pace Bus and stakeholders.

## Lake County's Executive Sponsor Role

### **Transition to Countywide Service: 2020-2022 (Tentative)**

- Work with Pace and local partners to determine the administrative and funding model and governance best suited for the Ride Lake County program
- Coordinate recruitment of local sponsors via Letters of Intent and/or Inter-governmental Agreements
- Dissolve LCCTSC and form new Ride Lake County Committee made up of local funding sponsors and service providers
- Identify Lake County Government sponsored services and administrative structure (Ex. Funding regional trips, trips to County Courthouse and Health Department)

# Lake County's Executive Sponsor Role

### **Beginning of New Service: 2023 (Tentative)**

- Manage Pace agreement for Lake County Government sponsored services
- Support the Ride Lake County Program as a member and sponsor
- Assist with identifying and recruiting new local sponsors
- Serve as a liaison between Ride Lake County and regional agencies like the RTA and CMAP

### Next Steps

✓ Pace Leadership Discussion and Buy-In

✓ County Board Approval

- ✓ Begin transition to Countywide Service
  - Market new service to potential partners
  - Seek letters of intent
  - Formulate task force to create new administrative and funding models
