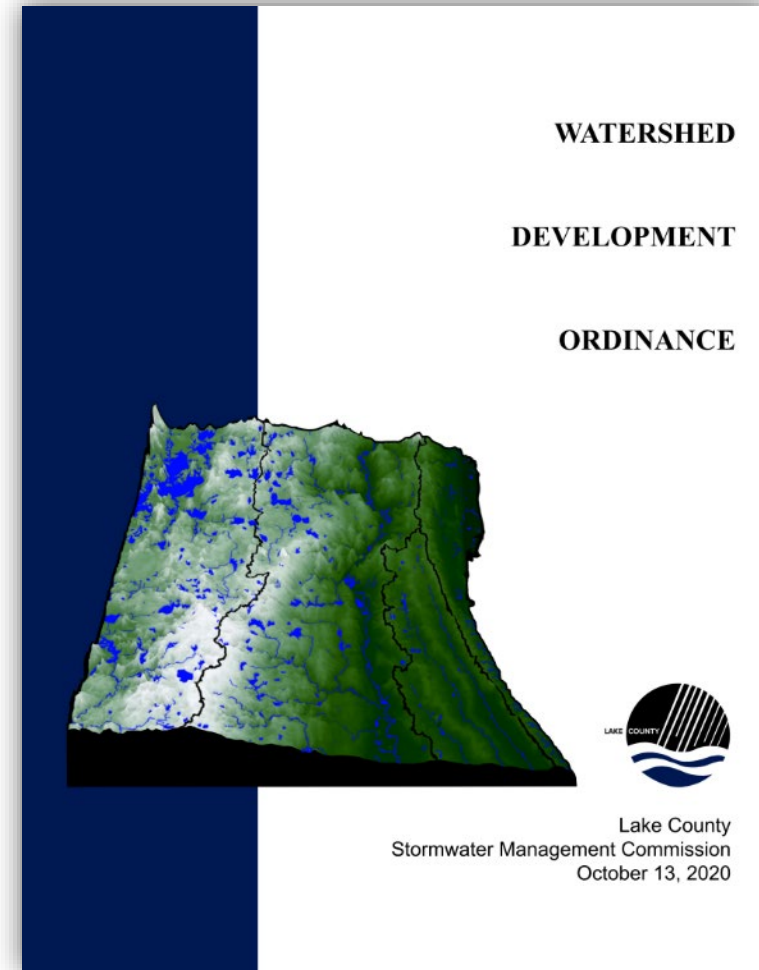

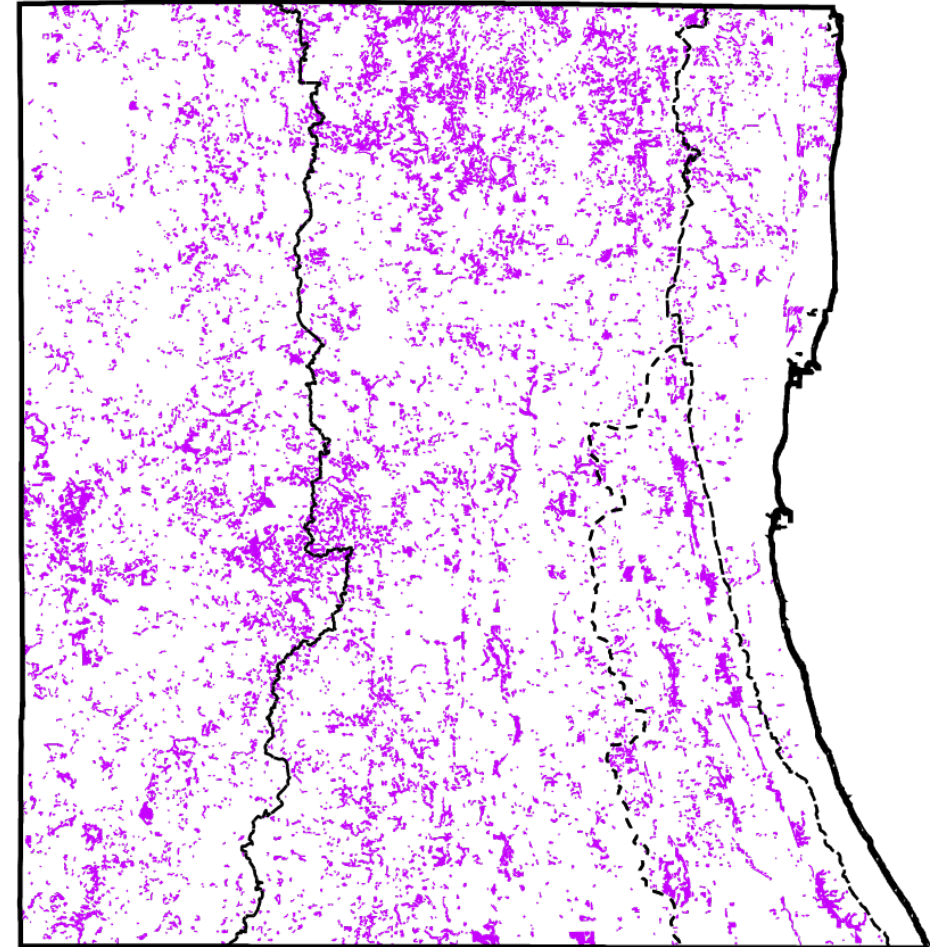

- Available on SMC website and Lake County Open Data portal



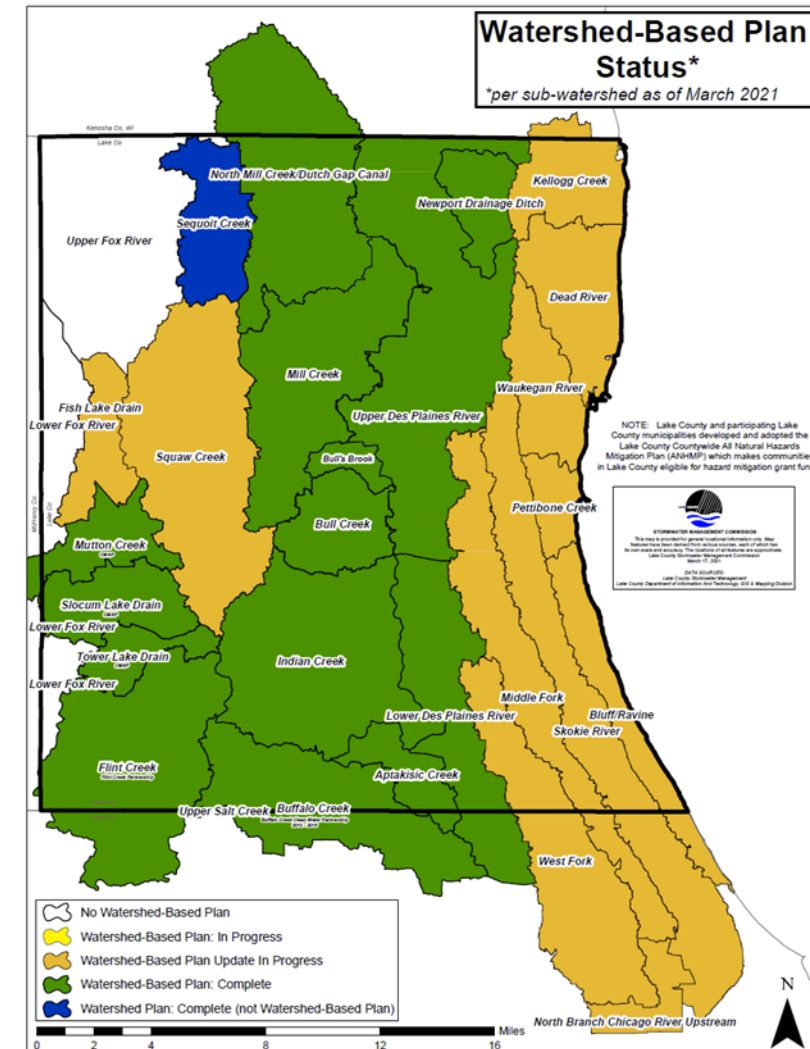

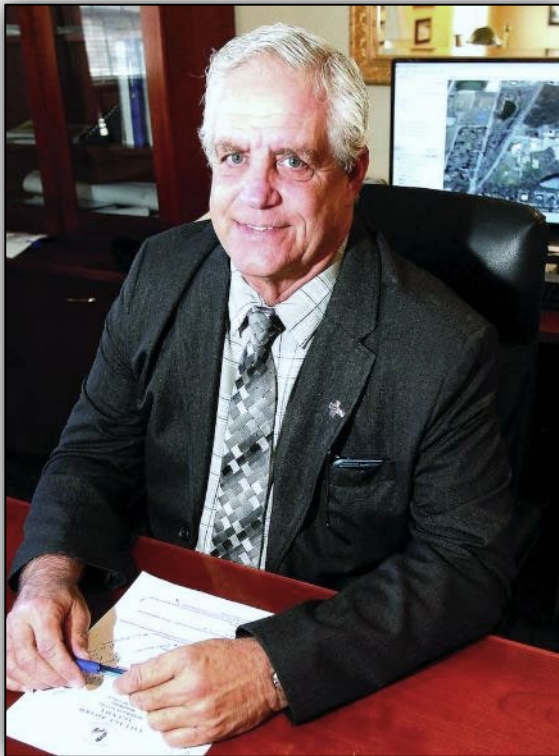
