





- "Virtual" Improvements, Shared Services and Other Efficiencies:
  - Increased percentage of registrations completed online
    - 2019 67%
    - **2020 75%**
    - **2021 77%**
  - Added the Village of Hainesville as an additional municipal subscriber to the Tyler EnerGov system via intergovernmental agreement
  - Amended an existing intergovernmental agreement with the Village of Fox Lake to expand the range of services provided



- "Virtual" Improvements, Shared Services and Other Efficiencies:
  - Virtual ZBA Public Hearings and Development Client Meetings
  - Virtual Inspection Program
  - Virtual Administrative Adjudication Hearings
  - Renewed temporary enforcement inspection program



- Regulatory Improvements
  - Temporary COVID-related Landscape Waste Open Burning Restrictions for the unincorporated area
  - CRS Recertification retained rating as a Class 6 (20% discount on flood insurance premiums) via increased flood protection requirements, public education, etc.




- Sustainability
  - Helped initiate Commercial PACE (Property Assessed Clean Energy) program for Lake County
  - Achieved a Silver designation from SolSmart, a program funded by the US Department of Energy Solar Energy Technologies Office, for enacting best practices to reduce barriers to solar energy growth and streamline solar installation permitting processes

#### **Permit Revenue**




#### Total Revenue / Year: January - March & Permit


