<u>Strategic Initiatives</u>

- Regional Leadership Advancing Regional 9-1-1 Consolidation
 - Lake County, in partnership with the Lake County Emergency Telephone System Board (ETSB), will continue to advance efforts toward the regional consolidation of Emergency Telephone System Boards (ETSB) and Public Safety Answering Points (PSAP)
 - This will result in a reduction of call transfers and service delays, while providing the same or better service more efficiently

Goals and Strategies

- Goal 1: Provide Public Safety and Advance an Integrated, Data-Driven Justice System
 - <u>Strategy 2</u>: Regularly evaluate and implement enhanced technologies to provide effective service, transparency, data sharing and integration throughout the justice system.
 - <u>Action A</u>: Advance and support regional 9-1-1 consolidation. Evaluate and pursue both physical and virtual consolidation with partners.
 - <u>Action C</u>: Support the selection and replacement of public safety technology





Regional

9-1-1 Consolidation



- Expanded mission to include coordinating the procurement of a <u>shared, scalable, integrated, enterprise family of public safety systems</u>
 - Computer aided dispatch (CAD)
 - Mobile messaging
 - Records management systems (RMS)
 - Law enforcement
 - Fire / emergency medical services
 - Jail management system (JMS)



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- Consortium committed to the process Lake County the administrative agent
- April 2020, issued a Request for Proposal (RFP) to contract for a scalable, shared, integrated, enterprise family of systems
- RFP extended to 47 vendors proposals received from nine vendors (June 2020)
- In accordance with evaluation criteria, Consortium's selection team determined that the proposal submitted by <u>Tyler Technologies</u>, <u>Public Safety Division</u>, <u>Troy</u>, <u>Michigan is the most qualified</u> and favorable proposal for the 9-1-1 Consortium
- Resolutions authorizing <u>two contracts</u> with Tyler Technologies, Public Safety Division, Troy Michigan for licensing, software and implementation services for the <u>replacement of CAD, Mobile, RMS, JMS, E-Citation, and E-Crash software</u>
- CAD & Mobile Messaging contract approved by Lake County ETSB on April 30

Contract (LC ETSB) – Item 8.22 CAD & Mobile



- Lake County ETSB is the Consortium's executive agent for this scalable, shared, integrated, enterprise CAD and Mobile Messaging software
- Joint resolution authorizing a contract with <u>Tyler Technologies, Public Safety</u> <u>Division, Troy Michigan</u>, in the amount of <u>\$1,355,568</u> for the replacement of the Lake County Emergency Telephone Service Board (ETSB) <u>CAD and Mobile</u> <u>Messaging software</u>
- Includes software, professional services, implementation services, and training
- Software maintenance and third-party hardware, software, and services are estimated in the annual amount of <u>\$181,681</u> for years two through five with an annual increase not to exceed three percent and not to exceed four percent for years six through 10
- Separate contract for hardware will be funded and awarded by the ETSB

Contract (Sheriff's Office) - Item 8.23 RMS, JMS, E-Citation, E-Crash



- Lake County Sheriff's Office is the Consortium's executive agent for this scalable, shared, integrated, enterprise RMS, JMS, E-Citation, and E-Crash software
- Joint resolution authorizing a contract with <u>Tyler Technologies</u>, <u>Public Safety</u> <u>Division</u>, <u>Troy</u>, <u>Michigan</u>, in the amount of <u>\$2,831,209</u> for the replacement of the Lake County Sheriff's Office <u>RMS</u>, <u>JMS</u>, <u>E-Citation</u>, and <u>E-Crash software</u>
- Includes the software, professional services, implementation services, and training
- Software maintenance and third-party hardware, software and services are estimated in the annual amount of <u>\$426,336</u> for years two through five with an annual increase not to exceed three percent and not to exceed four percent for years six through 10
- Funds allocated in FY2020 budget (carried over to FY2021)

Operational Improvements



- Opportunity to reduce the number of 9-1-1 call transfers
- Improved information sharing and coordination
- Lower long-term costs personnel, maintenance
- Improved business continuity and disaster recovery
- CAD, RMS, JMS, E-Citation and E-Crash will all flow together, reducing the requirement for double or triple data entry
- With a planned connection to the new Integrated Court Management System (ICMS), files can be electronically transferred to Branch Courts and Circuit Clerk's Office
- Less paper information shared electronically, no need to print
