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- Coronavirus State & Local Fiscal Recovery Funds (CSLFRF) ARPA Funds
- Lake County set to receive \$136M over two years
  - Municipalities receiving their own funds
- Guidance & application released May 10
  - Interim Final Rule
  - Fact sheet
  - FAQ document (updated multiple times)
- Compliance & Reporting Guidance (released June 17)





- Compliance & Reporting Guidance (released June 17)
- Interim Report due August 31, 2021
  - One-time report with expenditures through July 30 and summary of revenue replacement inputs
- Recovery Plan Performance Report due August 31, 2021
  - Annual report summarizing use of funds, documenting equitable outcomes, community engagement, labor practices, use of evidence, and performance
- Project & Expenditure Report due October 31, 2021
  - Quarterly report of projects, status, expenditures, demographic distribution, other data

#### **Premium Pay**

- May provide premium pay to eligible workers performing essential work during COVID-19
  - "Work involving regular in-person interactions or regular physical handling of items that were also handled by others"
  - Individual who teleworked from a residence may not receive premium pay
  - Janitors, sanitation, public health & safety, human services, etc.
- Can be retroactive

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## **Strategic Guidance**

#### **Guiding Tenets**



- Investments will align with the County's Strategic Plan
- Evaluate use of ARPA against all other funding sources and target ARPA funds on investments that are not eligible for other funding
- Focus on regional investments, especially in critical infrastructure
  - Non-recurring, targeted
  - Provides long term benefits
- Investments take into consideration future years, post-ARPA to ensure able to sustain any new programs or services
- Coordinate with and be cognizant of other partner local governments in and surrounding Lake County and plan use of funds accordingly
- County Administration will be central point of contact and coordinator for requests and discussions related to proposed options and planning

### **Public Engagement**



- State and local governments are required to report on methods used to engage communities
- Draft engagement plan has been created
  - Aims to educate residents and gather input using various methods
  - Includes strategies for broad audiences and targeted audiences
- For the Committee to Consider
  - Inviting community groups to speak at Special Committee Meetings (similar to CARES strategy)
  - Creating an additional committee/group comprised of community members (similar to CARES strategy)
  - Non-Scientific Engagement vs Scientific Engagement
    - "Non-Scientific" = Staff handles public engagement digitally-based
    - "Scientific" = County outsources portions or all public engagement cost varies depending on level of engagement



### **Federal Emergency Rental Assistance**

LakeCounty

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- \$36 million available through Treasury (ERA1 and ERA2), subcontracted to 15 community partners
- Follows 2020 rental assistance program, COVID Housing Relief Program (CHRP)
- Program features rolling applications, up to 12 months of rental and utility assistance to low-income renters impacted by COVID-19
- Streamlined access with application on website and information available through 211
- Staff at eviction court to assist with applications
- Total households served:

(Not Part of ARPA)

- 1498 (ERA, Apr Sept 2021)
- 769 (CHRP Jul 2020 Mar 2021)

- Fund initiatives in Comprehensive Economic Development Strategy (2022)
- Regional Economic Action Plan
- Expand current Workforce Development employment and training programs
- Support hospitality and tourism industry
- Small Business Assistance
- Aid to Nonprofit Organizations
- Clean up properties (blight / environmental) for development



### **Household Assistance**

#### **Possible Projects**



- Develop / build affordable housing
- Food assistance (on-going program)
- Eviction Protection
  - Rental assistance (FERA / on-going program)
  - Enable / enhance 19th Circuit Court
- Homeless assistance



# Infrastructure & Capital Investment Possible Projects



- Water / Sewer projects
- Lead pipe replacement
  - Migrate communities from wells to Lake Michigan water sources
  - Replace sanitary systems approaching end of life
  - Build water and sewer infrastructure for areas that can be developed
- Build / expand public facilities that respond to COVID-19 and general disasters
  - Build the Consolidated 9-1-1, EOC, and ETSB Facility
- Technology Infrastructure
- Purchase facilities for partners to support mental health, address homelessness, etc.
- Develop clean / green energy sources



# **Invest in County (Local) Operations Possible Projects**



- Premium Pay for authorized employees
- Technology to further integrate and expand remote workforce
- Enterprise-wide cyber-security resources and capabilities
- County-wide call center capability (research possibility of a 3-1-1 system)
- Revenue Replacement / Provision of Government Services
  - Funds for smaller, one-time departmental expenses ("NPR" list)
  - Funds for local entities / districts that did not receive ARPA funding (match?)



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### **Guidance & Direction**



- Received to date:
  - Align planning with Guiding Tenets
  - Focus on projects that can be directly funded with ARPA funds
  - Maximize revenue replacement (provision of gov. services)
