The board approved the certificate of need, which paves the way for TCLC to continue to move forward with land acquisition, design and construction at their preferred site in Mundelein.

Transit Team Meeting

Our Lake County "Transit Team" consisting of transit board members Ike Magalis (RTA), Norm Carlson (Metra) and Linda Soto (Pace) met yesterday with Paula Trigg, Barry Burton, PWT Chair Bonnie Thomson Carter and me. One of the main topics of discussion was the positive impact of the approval of state's recent stopgap budget. The temporary spending plan allows revenues for the RTA's 30% sale tax match, reduced fare subsidies, ADA grants and capital spending to be released to the transit agencies. Outbreak of Invasive Meningococcal (meh-nin-ge-kak-al) Disease

LCHD/CHC Sexually Transmitted Infections program is working with Chicago to control an outbreak of invasive meningococcal disease.

Meningitis and meningococcemia (meh-nin-joh-kak-see-mia) are common forms of this disease and have a high mortality rate, if untreated, but they can be prevented with vaccine. Although meningococcal disease is not as contagious as the common cold, it can be transmitted through saliva and occasionally through close, prolonged general contact with an infected person.

Last year, there were seven cases of this disease in Chicago among men who have sex with men, including one death. This spring two additional cases were diagnosed in Chicago connected to the same outbreak.

Since many Lake County residents commute to Chicago, LCHD/CHC is making it a priority to vaccinate as many at-risk individuals as possible if they have not been vaccinated in the last five years.

While anyone can be affected by meningitis, gay, bisexual and other men who have sex with men are disproportionately impacted by this outbreak. HIV positive people are also at risk and require a second dose of vaccine due to a weakened immune system.

LCHD/CHC has obtained free vaccine to vaccinate all gay, bisexual and other men who have sex with men as well as all individuals who are living with HIV. To date, 35 individuals received vaccinations and health department staff will continue outreach and clinical efforts.

Rx for Health-Walking In Nature is July 16 at Middlefork Savanna

The next Rx for Health walk is scheduled for July 16th at Middlefork Savanna in Lake Forest. The walk is open to all ages. Those 16 and younger must be accompanied by an adult. All walks start at 4 p.m. and range in length from 1 to 2 miles. These are rain or shine events and no pets are allowed (with the exception of service animals). Animal Care & Control Low-Cost Pet Vaccination Clinics

Lake County Health Department's Animal Care and Control Program, in conjunction with the Zion Police Department, will be hosting their next off-site low-cost vaccination clinic on Saturday, July 16 from 9 a.m. - Noon.

Clinic location is at the Zion Park District, Bethel Boulevard and 27th Street.

Lake County residents can bring their dogs and cats on a first-come first-serve basis. This is a cash only event. Cost for rabies, distemper, and tag is \$25 for altered pets and \$65 for intact pets.

The clinic provides a convenient and affordable way for Lake County residents to keep their pets up to date with shots and rabies tags. In 2015, 11 low-cost pet vaccination clinics were held and 2,696 animals were seen.

West Nile Virus Update

A mosquito pool (or batch of mosquitoes) sampled June 23 in Highland Park has tested positive for West Nile virus. The mosquito pool is the first confirmed indicator of the disease's presence in Lake County in 2016.

In 2015, five human cases of West Nile virus were reported in Lake County. In

addition, 68 pools or batches of mosquitoes and one bird tested positive for the virus. This is the time of year when we begin to see mosquito pools testing positive for West Nile virus. Now that hot summer weather is finally here, it is especially important to

protect yourself against mosquito bites by following the four D's:

- Drain: regularly empty water from outdoor containers;
- Dress: cover skin by wearing long sleeved shirts and pants;
- Dawn and Dusk: stay indoors during early evening and morning hours;
- Defend: use insect repellent that contains DEET

Municipal Economic Development Advisory Group Meeting Recap
