West Nile virus in Lake County

The Health Department has reported the first human case of West Nile virus in Lake County for 2018. A Waukegan resident in her 60s became ill in mid-August. This is the peak time of year for West Nile virus activity. Mosquitoes will remain active until the first hard frost. As of August 31, 61 pools or batches of mosquitoes and two birds have tested positive for West Nile virus in 2018. Since 2002, there have been 66 human cases of West Nile virus in Lake County, as well as two confirmed deaths. Most people infected with West Nile virus have no symptoms of illness. However, some may become ill usually three to 15 days after the bite of an infected mosquito. If you start to feel achy, nauseated, have a fever, swollen lymph glands or a rash after being bitten by a mosquito, see your primary care provider. Youth Mental Health First Aid Training

Lake County residents working with youth in a variety of settings such as schools, medical facilities, social services, and youth groups are encouraged to attend a Youth Mental Health First Aid training. The Health Department will host full-day workshops on October 4 and November 15 at its Waukegan location (3010 Grand Ave., Waukegan). Each training begins at 8:00 a.m. and ends at 5:00 p.m. The cost is \$20 per attendee. Youth Mental Health First Aid provides individuals with the knowledge and skills to identify and support adolescents (12-18 yrs. old) that are at risk, displaying warning signs of mental health or substance use problems, or experiencing a mental health crisis. Final Low-Cost Pet Vaccination and Microchip Clinic October 6

The Lake County Health Department's Animal Care and Control will hold its final low-cost pet vaccination and microchip clinic of 2018 on Saturday, October 6 at the Milton C. Jensen Public Works Facility, located at 40185 Glendale Avenue, Beach Park. The clinic is open to all Lake County residents. Pets are taken on a first-come, first-served basis. Only cash is accepted at the time of service. All animals must be at least 4 months old. Dogs must be leashed and cats placed in carriers. Medication Assisted Treatment (MAT) for addiction treatment offered at Midlakes Health Center Medication-Assisted Treatment (MAT) is the use of FDA-approved medications, in combination with counseling and behavioral therapies, to provide a "whole-patient" approach to the treatment of substance use disorders. The Health Department has expanded its MAT services to the Midlakes Health Center in Round Lake. Services include medication monitoring and outpatient counseling, and the medicines offered include Vivitrol, Suboxone, and Naloxone. Offering MAT services at additional sites increases Lake County's capacity to provide integrated care to people with substance use disorders. It also reduces transportation barriers for those who live in the western half of Lake County. Rx for Health: Walking in Nature

The 2018 Rx for Health: Walking in Nature season continues. The simple act of walking, especially in nature, can improve one's overall health, both physically and mentally. Visitor Spending Continues to Increase in Lake County

The Daily Herald Business Ledger recently picked up on an Economic Update put together by Lake County Partners in partnership with Visit Lake County which showed that visitor spending topped \$1.34 billion in 2017, which is a 2.8% increase and a new record

for the county. Tourism-related employment has increased 1.7% and local tax receipts rose to \$30.8 million—a 3% increase from 2016. Visitors generated nearly \$82 million in state tax receipts in the county—an 8.5% increase, which solidified Lake County's position as one of the top counties in the state for visitor expenditures. With this growth has come an even greater interest in development and investment, which is one of the reasons that we are seeing so many enhancements at destinations like Great Wolf Lodge and Six Flags Great America, where they will host their first ever "Holiday in the Park" event this winter to provide outdoor entertainment year-round at their facility.

North Chicago High School Faculty Taps into the Lake County Workforce Ecosystem In the lead up to the new school year, North Chicago High School faculty participated in a tour, spearheaded by the Lake County Workforce Ecosystem partners, to explore careers in advanced manufacturing and to meet with corporate executives at top Lake County skilled manufacturers, Flex, Laser Precision and LMT Onsrud. One of the main motivations of the day-long event was to challenge the perceptions of manufacturing. Not all high school students are interested in college at age 18, and skilled manufacturing provides a solid onramp to a career with excellent wages and many opportunities for growth. Skilled manufacturing plays a vital role in Lake County's economy, and the industry employs nearly 30,000 people. The tour represents one of the many important ways in which young talent and local companies are strategically connecting in Lake County.

Sysmex Launches State-of-the-Art Training Center

Diagnostic hardware and software provider Sysmex recently opened a new 98,000 sq. ft. "Center for Learning" in Vernon Hills to meet the training needs of Sysmex's growing customer and employee base in the U.S. and Canada. The multimillion-dollar facility triples the company's training capacity and provides the ability to train up to 4,400 people per year, both virtually and on-site. Sysmex is currently celebrating its 50th anniversary and has a large presence in Lake County—the company is headquartered in Lincolnshire and, in addition to the new training center, has a manufacturing facility in Mundelein and a distribution center in Buffalo Grove.
