Radu Roman, Lake County Resident, requested the committee consider amending the County's nuisance ordinance to include a ban on burning leaves.

REGULAR AGENDA

6.1 <u>19-0054</u>

Committee discussion on issues and ideas for coming year. (20 minutes - facilitated by Grace Rink, County's sustainability consultant)

Grace Rink of Quercus Consulting and the County's sustainability consultant provided a brief background and indicated that she's been the county's sustainability consultant for the last year. Ms. Rink opened the discussion for feedback on issues or ideas for sustainability.

Member Rummel inquired about potential opportunities to convert the County facilities to solar energy. Ms. Rink responded that a county-wide collaborative Solar Energy Request for Proposals (RFP) is being drafted, however, due to the Future Energy Jobs Act, the funding dynamics have changed. Rather than purchasing solar panels, the County will contract with a solar developer which will own and maintain the solar energy system. More than seven County facilities have been identified for solar energy use. Ms. Rink noted that there are 11 units of local government that have expressed interest with 37 facilities identified for solar energy.

Discussion occurred on committing a staff resource to sustainability. County Board Chair Hart indicated her support for a discussion in the near future.

Vice Chair Wasik asked if there is any indication of setting a goal for the County to be at 100 percent renewable energy by 2040. He feels it would be in the County's best interest to have such a goal in place. Ms. Rink reported that this matter is in the horizon and on the table for this year.

Member Clark asked about options to reduce light pollution. Ms. Rink noted that she recently assisted in identifying potential solutions for the City of Highland Park and provided details. The community found it would be best to first address commercial areas. Member Rummel expressed his interest in reducing the light pollution for the constituents that live near commercially zoned areas.

Chair Wilke requested an update on Paratransit at the next meeting. Division of Transportation Director Shane Schneider confirmed that reports and a presentation could be ready for the next meeting.

Member Clark requested an amendment to the nuisance ordinance be considered to ban leaf burning due to safety concerns and health effects.

Member Vealitzek, raised the issue of waste and if there is a zero waste plan in place Discussion ensued.

Chair Wilke added that he would like to see the wind power ordinance reviewed as technology continuously advances.

County Board Chair Hart would like to include a discussion to reduce the usage of single use plastic and grocery bags.

This item was discussed.

Lake County Carbon Footprint Summary

Grace Rink, County's sustainability consultant, highlighted programs and effors made over the last year. She reported on the food scrap composting program implemented in the County's Detention Center. A waste audit was conducted at the County's Detention Center and the results concluded that 80 percent of the waste could either be recycled or composted. The program takes on food, office waste, and clothing, diverting it from landfill. Additionally, Ms. Rink indicated data will be provided to accurately estimate the County's carbon footprint. Discussion ensued on other policies and programs including energy audits were conducted on seven County facilities.

This item was discussed.

6.3 <u>19-0057</u>

Departmental overview of sustainability efforts: policies, practices, and projects. (20-30 *minutes presentation and discussion per department*)

Assistant County Administrator Paul Fetherston noted that departments were asked to present an overview of policies and projects that may be of interest to this committee. Division of Transportation Director Shane Schneider reported on guidelines the division follows such the Clean Water Act, the endangered species requirements, and filter project through the National Environmental Policy Act. He further indicated that the goal is to avoid impact to the environment and minimize the carbon foot print impacts. Mr. Schneider also reported on other programs such as the cost sharing programs and adopt the highway programs.

Mr. Fetherston indicated that the Planning, Building and Development Department's presentation will be provided during the next meeting along with a presentation on Facilities, and potentially Solid Waste Agency of Lake County and the Stormwater Management Commission.
