Coronavirus (COVID-19) Updates:

According to the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC), the United States continues to lead the world in the number of vaccine doses provided. As of October 7, 2021, over 215 million people, or 65 percent of the U.S. population, have received at least one dose of the COVID-19 vaccine. However, recent increases in cases and hospitalizations have occurred nationwide, especially among the unvaccinated. As of October 7, Lake County has had over 71,036 confirmed COVID-19 cases and over 1,000 deaths throughout the pandemic. Lake County's recovery rate is 98.3%. In Region 9, Lake and McHenry counties, the testing positivity rate is at 2.4%. For more information on Lake County's response to COVID-19, please visit the Lake County Coronavirus website, www.lakecountyil.gov/coronavirus, and sign up for email updates from the Health Department.

#### COVID-19 Vaccination Updates:

On September 22, the FDA authorized certain individuals to receive a Pfizer COVID-19 vaccine booster dose at least 6 months after completion of the initial 2 dose series. The CDC has recommended that the following groups should consider receiving a booster dose of the Pfizer-BioNTech vaccine:

Individuals age 65 and older;

Residents in long-term care settings;

Individuals ages 50-64 with underlying medical conditions.

The CDC recommends that the following groups may consider receiving a booster dose of the Pfizer-BioNTech vaccine based on their individual benefits and risk:

Individuals ages 18-49 with underlying medical conditions;

Individuals ages 16-64 who are at an increased risk for COVID-19 exposure and transmission because of occupational or institutional settings such as:

Health-care workers, teachers, grocery store employees, and other essential workers. Only those that received and completed the Pfizer-BloNTech COVID-19 vaccine series have been authorized to receive a booster dose if they fall into one of the eligible categories. Those that received the Moderna or Johnson & Johnson COVID-19 vaccine have not been authorized to receive a booster at this time.

Those who received both doses of an mRNA COVID-19 vaccine series or the single dose of the Johnson & Johnson COVID-19 vaccine continue to be highly protected from severe illness, hospitalization, and death.

On Tuesday, September 28, Pfizer and BioNTech submitted the initial data from their COVID-19 vaccine trial in children ages 5-11 to the FDA for Emergency Use Authorization.

They found that the vaccine was safe, well-tolerated, and effective. The dose for children ages 5-11 is smaller than the dose for those ages 12 and older.

Safe and effective COVID-19 vaccines are an important tool that will help us put an end to the pandemic. Lake County's goal is to fully vaccinate 80% of our population to achieve herd immunity from COVID-19. This amounts to 560,000 people receiving the vaccine. So far, over 838,210 doses of the COVID-19 vaccine have been administered to Lake County residents. Over 58% of Lake County residents are fully vaccinated, including over 83% of seniors.

All Lake County residents age 12 and older are urged to get vaccinated as soon as possible. To schedule a vaccination appointment at a Lake County FQHC vaccination site, visit AllVax.lakecohealth.org or call (847) 377-8130. For appointments at a mobile vaccination site, visit https://www.vaccines.gov/ or walk up to the site during operating hours.

The last day for vaccinations at the Water Street vaccination site in Waukegan will be October 10. The site will continue to offer COVID-19 testing through IDPH.

North Chicago Health Center Temporary Closure

As of September 20, 2021, North Chicago Health Center is temporarily closed for renovations and will return in Spring 2022.

Major building changes are coming to better serve patients. Improvements coming include more welcoming patient exam rooms, lobby, waiting areas, and more.

All North Chicago health Center providers and patients will be temporarily relocated to Belvidere Medical Building (BMB) in Waukegan during construction.

October is Breast Cancer Awareness Month

Breast cancer is the second-leading cause of cancer death in women, second only to lung cancer.

Breast cancer can occur in both men and women. Women ages 55 and older and those with a family history of breast cancer are at a higher risk for developing breast cancer. Maintaining a healthy weight, staying physically active, and limiting or avoiding alcohol may reduce your risk of developing breast cancer.

The Health Department offers free breast cancer screenings to eligible Lake County residents, ages 50 and older, through the Illinois Breast and Cervical Cancer Program (IBCCP), located at the Health Department's 3010 Grand Avenue, Waukegan location. Women who are eligible for the program can receive medical exams, clinical breast exams, and referrals for a free mammogram at a local hospital. National Drug Enforcement Agency, Drug Take Back Day

Unused or expired prescription medications are a public safety issue, leading to accidental poisoning, misuse, and overdose. Proper disposal of unused drugs saves lives and protects the environment.
