Committee Action approving 2009 Brownfield Grants Requests for Extensions

- In 2009 the County awarded Brownfield Remediation Grants to Highland Park (\$100,000); North Chicago (two grants, \$100,000 and 50,000); and Lake Zurich (\$100,000). The applicants will not be able to complete their projects within the one year specified in the Intergovernmental Agreements and are requesting extensions.
- Written status reports have been submitted for all four projects and are attached.
- Representatives from the municipalities will present brief updates to the Committee and answer questions.
- If an extension is not granted for a particular project, the project will expire based on the date in the Intergovernmental Agreement. Unspent funds will be unencumbered and returned to the Brownfield Fund.
