Resolution setting forth the Procurement Card (P-Card) Policy.

- Lake County has had a procurement card program for several years, but there is a desire to formalize the program and establish the guidelines through this Procurement Card (P-Card) Policy.
- Procurement cards are a flexible purchasing method that reduces the length of time required
 to make a small dollar purchase, pay a vendor, and arrange for training and travel without
 having to rely on a personal credit card, travel advance, or reimbursement.
- There is a significantly more detailed Directive document that provides more specific requirements and guidelines for cardholders.

WHEREAS, it is reasonable and prudent to review and update policies and procedures on a routine basis and update them as necessary; and

WHEREAS, a procurement card program has been in place for several years and it is prudent and necessary to establish a Procurement Card (P-Card) Policy to formalize the program and provide the guidelines and framework for the program; and
